Christian Service Updates

Pope Francis Center: for the period of March 2020-March 2021, the center averaged 200 guests per day, served 109,720 meals, did 2,550 loads of laundry and provided for 6,094 showers, aided by 388 volunteers. The center was also recognized nationally for its COVID-19 vaccination program.

In June the center moved back to SS Peter and Paul Church (from the TCF Center). Guests receive 'take-out' style breakfast and lunch, (tents in the UD Mercy Law School parking lot provide picnic-style eating and socializing), laundry and shower services, as well as medical, dental, counseling and housing services. In the past 6 months the PFC case managers have worked with 40 guests to achieve their goal of moving into safe and stable housing.

A heartfelt thank you to the families who continue to provide the Center with sandwiches each week and, our dependable delivery drivers.

Respect Life: The Father's Day candy and pens and especially YOU the parishioners, generated nearly \$300 for Right to Life - Lifespan! What a tribute to our small and loving Resurrection community, full of compassion for those who need us.

SALAM ! SHALOM 1 PAX 1 PEACE ! It is hard to believe, but we are not just half way through the year 2021 as well as half way through this Summer, we are also about half way through even the so-called 'Ordinary Time' of the Church year – which ends November 27th. Despite this, since last year was so different, this seems like an even more beautiful if challenging time. Yes, there has been rain – even flooding. Yes, the pandemic continues (get vaccinated and be respectful of those around you.) Yes, there has been both a drought as well as severe

heat alarms. But most of us have pasted through these ... and even those afflicted can rejoice in what pleasant times we do have. THANK YOU, LORD for your many blessings ! LEAD US, LORD through whatever comes next. AMEN.

When I was growing up, I lived in the Royal Oak parish officially called 'St. Therese of the Child Jesus'. Everyone called it 'the Shrine of the Little Flower'. Our pastor was Charles E. Coughlin. Whatever else he is noted for – some good, some not – one of the things he did was to make Catholics and others aware of something called a Papal Encyclical. These are documents popes occasionally issue to make 'official' teachings. Among those he shared with people through his radio shows was the 1891 one titled RERUM NOVARUM. This document addressed Capitalism, and especially the Role of Labor in it. Every pope since then who has spoken or written about this topic has specifically endorsed these teachings. And there have been several – such as both John Paul I and II as well as Benedict XVI and John XXIII.

In Rerum Novarum Pope Leo XIII specifically supported LABOR UNIONS and the practice of COLLECTIVE BARGAINING. He did so while also supporting both the concept of PRIVATE PROPERTY as well as some 'freedom of the marketplace'. He wrote that there was a DUTY to WORK if people were able. But the Duty was not absolute ! Some are unable in and of themselves (eg. handicaps), while some are prevented (eg. poor education or limited training). Further, since there is seldom a parity between the negotiators for Business and for Labor, only agreements which provide wages sufficient to support a frugal and well-behaved wage earner would be moral.

The American Jesuits in their July magazine AMERICA include an article by the Franciscan scholar Kenneth Himes that today 'Justice in the realm of work entails ready access to employment, safe working conditions appropriate to the dignity of each worker, adequate compensation to secure for a worker and their dependents sufficient income AND benefits to maintain material well-being and a balance of work and leisure to ensure the spiritual, relational, intellectual and recreational needs of the worker. Justice ... entails making provision for those who cannot work' also. (America, July 2021, vol. 225, no. 1). As we approach Labor Day in a few weeks, as we enjoy all that God has blest us with, as we hear and participate in discussions concerning our futures, let us perhaps read such sources and pray over such concepts. Remember, YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE ! WE ARE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER. Get Vaccinated ! Respect the on-going pandemic. Be decent to all about you. BE RESURRECTION ALIVE ! Christ IS RISEN ! Alleluia ! He is RISEN indeed ! Alleluia !

Current Covid Restrictions at Resurrection

Because cases of Covid 19 have been drastically reduced and the requirements of the State of Michigan and the Archdiocese of Detroit have been amended, we have changed many of the measures put into place to prevent the spread of Covid at Resurrection.

Effective July 1, 2021, Resurrection has changing the following:

- Masks and social distancing are not be required if you are vaccinated.
- Only the overflow area of the church has socially distanced seating.
- The 9 AM Mass can be livestreamed to the social hall if there is interest. In the social hall there would be additional socially distanced seating. Masks would be required in this space. You would come into church from the social hall to receive Communion. - Mass signups are no longer being used.

The following remains unchanged:

- Offering baskets are on the Baptismal font (or by social hall door) and not passed during Mass.
- Only the priest and deacon receive the Blood of Christ.
- Hand sanitizer is available for use in the Gathering Space and before receiving Communion.
- If you are not feeling well, please do not attend Mass.
- If you receive a positive Covid 19 diagnosis after attending Mass, please contact the office.
- There is a Communion Service at 10:20 AM in the parking lot.

The Steward's Work Is Never Done

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock! When you hear these strong words from the Old Testament, you're probably thinking, thank goodness I don't have any sheep — dodged that bullet. Nobody misled here! No flock scattered on my watch! However, we are all shepherds of a kind, called to tend our own sheep: our families, our parishes, our communities.

But it's exhausting. Don't we all sometimes just want to take a break from being a steward? The excuses are so familiar: we're tired, we've done enough, we've given all we can, what more does the parish (or my spouse, or my kids, or my boss, or my friends, or my community) want? We give ourselves permission to be selfish. So, what if the flock scatters just a little?

Jesus gets that. We can just imagine him weary with exhaustion, can't we? We see him on his boat, attempting to sneak away for a quick break — maybe just a chance to eat a bite of food in peace. He is God, but he was still human, after all. Even the most dedicated shepherds need to sleep. But people couldn't leave him alone. They were hungry for him. They needed what he could offer, and they needed it now.

As tough as it is, that's the example we are tasked with imitating. Everyday Stewardship demands accountability. It demands our showing up even when we are tired. It demands that we look at our lives, our time, our energies, our talents, our hearts, our bank accounts and think: where do I still have more to give?
