

SALAM ! SHALOM ! PAX ! PEACE ! This week we have had a truly blessed time here at Resurrection ! O.K., it was really at OLGC. But it was blest. We had this year's VBS – Vacation Bible School. CONGRATULATIONS to Karen Hogan and all her many crews. THANK YOU to all who volunteered. And, COME AGAIN to all the many young people who attended. As usual, whatever blessings the young people received, those who worked – and it is both hard and intense work – also receive so many blessings also. THANK YOU, God, for all the great weather. Thank You to OLGC and to St. Kenneth's for your support and cooperation. As we move further into the so-called 'Family of Parishes', such cooperation hopefully will become the norm – rather than competition or repetition. The Lord truly does great things when we act together in His Name. Blessings to All !

This past week we also had the 320th Anniversary of the establishment of Detroit. The AOD – Archdiocese of Detroit – celebrated with gatherings at St. Anne Church in Detroit, near the bridge. When Cadillac established the city (or town at that time, although it was surprisingly vast for the limited number of people who initially were part of the founding), the first thing they created and built was St. Anne Church ! Of course, it was not the building that we currently have. Over the years, major fires have wiped out most of those buildings. But what a wonderful thing to have done. It leads me, and I hope all of us of the AOD parishes, to reflect : if we were to found a new community, what would be the first thing we would do ? In an era when there is much debate about the rationales used by the so-called 'discoverers' and developers of the Western Hemisphere – cf. the debates concerning Juniper Serra – the fact of this priority by these French explorers should at least give us pause. What would we have done ? Perhaps we would have first built a shelter or a stockade. But, NO – they built a church. As we go on to whatever is 'next', we are building the next generation, not just of buildings but of community and values. Do our discussions reflect the values and lead to the actions which will, indeed, create a life-giving and life-sustaining community ? Let us pray together that they do. And if they do not – and I suspect that all of us at times 'miss the mark', we CAN start NOW and HERE to do so. Blessings to All !

This coming week we have the Feast of St. John Vianney. Till recently , he was the Patron Saint of Parish Priests. Pope John Paul II made him the Patron Saint of all Priests. (Order priests, of course, have special affinity to their Order's founders – eg. St Francis or St. Dominic or St. Ignatius Loyola). This is, in other words, a good time to pray for priests – especially parish priests. Recently I was at a funeral lead by a priest from another diocese. Like ours, it was a large, ethnic based diocese. Like us, they are going through the same 're-structuring' reflected in our 'Families of Parishes' project. WE DO NOT HAVE THE ANSWERS ! But we must act ! Invite the Holy Spirit to lead us all, and the Bishops and parish priests especially, through this time. Blessings to ALL !

This Friday is FIRST FRIDAY. As usual, we have Mass with the ANOINTING of the SICK and the SACRED HEART devotion. Please join us. Remember, YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE ! WE ARE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER. Get Vaccinated ! Respect the on-going pandemic. Be decent to all about you. BE RESURRECTION ALIVE ! Christ IS RISEN ! Itelesia ! He is RISEN indeed ! Alleluia !

Practicing Graciousness in the Desert

Looking back over my journey of parenthood, I know there were days when I traveled the extra mile for my children. I made their toast the way they like it, let them play in the park an extra ten minutes, or let them go to the movies with their friends and I finished up the chores on my own. And then, it happened: the attitude. The request for the smallest thing from one of them is met with disdain or bewilderment.

Sometimes you can be made breathless with the ingratitude of another person who takes so much and with so little shame, only to scoff at the idea that they, too, give even the smallest amount.

But if we're being honest with ourselves, we will admit that we do the exact same thing to God. Haven't we all been the Israelites in the desert at one point or another? God has parted our Red Sea in some way. He's led us out of some great trial, given us some great blessings. But then we run into a little resistance somewhere along the way and we throw up our hands. How could you do this to us, Lord? How could you ask this of us? No, I can't go any further. No, I won't do any more.

Persisting in the blindness to the many ways God continues to protect us is nothing short of a temper tantrum. It robs our Everyday Stewardship of its graciousness, of our ability to accept with joy the trials of life because we are also constantly aware of its blessings.
