

FR KRAMER'S KORNER

SALAM! SHALOM! PAX! PEACE! One of the items in each of my weekly activities plan is to find what the Pope has written or said that week. If you go 'on line', you can find much of it at Vatican.va. There is also the USCCB site, where the American bishops have their say. AT this beginning of a 'new' year, one of the concerns of Pope Francis is HUMAN TRAFFICKING. We have our own Canton / Plymouth groups addressing this as well. It is real! It is ANTI-CHRISTIAN. It is something you and I can make a difference about. As you know, this is not just about so-called 'sex workers'. They are perhaps the most 'public' of those involved. The wonderful COVENANT HOUSE settlements across America, and in other countries now, target the victims who are teens. One such settlement is here in Detroit. This is a program with proven success. Support them! But many victims are WORKERS - including in restaurants and stores. Sometimes they sleep in their cars and vans in parking lots since their pay – YES, they often have jobs and work many hours a week – does not empower them to have proper housing. This is one of the underbellies of unemployment, underemployment and homelessness. I suspect that such situations become breeding grounds for disease. My limited experience with them over the years speaks loudly of their health problems. THANK YOU to the St. Vincent de Paul Society for addressing some of these broader issues. As Pope Francis asks, pray for and encourage local actions about TRAFFICkING.

There are THREE events coming that invite your involvement and in-put. First, we have the honoring of Ric Craffey on Saturday, January 15, at about 5 p.m. PLEASE JOIN US! There will be a short ceremony followed by a reception. As Ric would say, ALL ARE WELCOME! Then on Sunday January 23 at about 12:15

p.m. there will be a 'town-hall' about the FAMILY of PARISHES project of the Archbishop. A representative of the AOD – Archdiocese of Detroit – will join me in discussing the current status of this project.

read the book aloud, discuss it build our friendships, and pray for one another.






RESURRECTION TO HOST YOUTH REFUGEE ART SHOW ON JANUARY 30TH

Resurrection will host a January 30th open house that showcases works by young refugees in foster care. Parish members, along with the general public, are invited to attend the show; there is no admission charge.

"Written Dreams in Paper", open 3-5 p.m. at Resurrection, offers a chance to learn more about young people who are refugees and graduates of the foster care programs sponsored by Samaritas. The agency operates a foster care program for young people fleeing their homelands. There will be speakers while you browse the art, including some young adults who have graduated from the foster care program.







"Only about 30 programs in the United States specialize in serving unaccompanied refugee minors," said Kayla Park, Community Outreach Team Leader for Samaritas. "The U.S. is the only country with a program designed to serve these unaccompanied refugees, so we are working with youth from all around the world." This program of Samaritas began in the 1970s, serving children from Vietnam.

Foster children often come out of traumatic situations, but refugee youth "have experienced a very different kind of trauma," Park said. Because it's often difficult to find their families, the American foster placement many times becomes permanent.

In 2015, a group of agencies providing services to refugees started celebrating "Refugee Sunday" to raise awareness. The art project emerged from that effort. "It ended up being a big success," Park said. Now each child creates their own artwork in a variety of media. "We've had sculptures, we've had photos, we've had stories, but the vast majority of the youth prefer to paint."

Through the gallery events, young people share stories and a clearer picture of the refugee experience. Some paint border crossings or their life in a refugee camp. Art provides an emotional outlet, and the young artists build their portfolios, Park said.
