FR KRAMER'S KORNER

SALAM ! SHALOM ! PAX ! PEACE ! It is with true pleasure that I have the honor of welcoming all of you this week-end. This Saturday, January 15, we dedicate the Social Hall in memory of Richard 'RIC' Craffey. While we all mourn his passing, we all also are so blest with the heritage he has given us through his deep faith in God to encourage and enable us to have blest FAMILIES, well rooted FAITH, and energized HOPE in action by being WELCOMING and of SERVICE. THANK YOU for joining us at this time ! May God bless us all. May Ric be welcomed into Paradise.

You may have noticed when you go down the hallway towards the Craffey Center, i.e. the social hall, that there is a photo of Fr. Perfetto on the wall. Near it there is a bulletin-board. This particular bulletin-board is dedicated to events and groups WITHIN our Parish. Karen Hogan moderates it. If you pause there, you will see that there are many different and interesting things happening and available here. Many of these have appeared in the weekly bulletin and the Blast. They are here to attract the attention of visitors. But they also remind me of the many aspects there are to Resurrection. TAKE A MOMENT and glance at our faith world ! You will be amazed.

This is the time of year when we as 'church people' experience several 'new years'. With the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the River Jordan last week-end, we now enter into the 'rest of the year'. (Of course, there is the seasons of Lent and Easter this Spring.) What we call the 'rest of the year' is ORDINARY TIME – i.e. the period when we follow the PLAN, the ORDO, in learning about and celebrating Jesus and the Kingdom. Again, as you have heard, there are two cycles of readings in the Church. There is the Sunday cycle of three (3) years. With the start of Advent, we are now in year ' C ', in which we mostly hear the Gospel of LUKE. (However, in Lent and Easter Time we hear a lot from John.) This past Monday we started the two (2) year cycle of weekday readings. Through the year we get to hear from all four (4) of the Gospels. While the first readings change in the two years, the Gospels remain the same. We begin with the Gospel of MARK for the first couple of months. He will take us up to Lent. His is believed to be the first one written. Traditions suggests that he was a disciple of St. Paul

who later attached himself to St. Peter. (There are references to a ' John Mark ' in the New Testament associated with them.) Scholars believe the Gospel reflects what may have been heard when Peter came to town. They tell

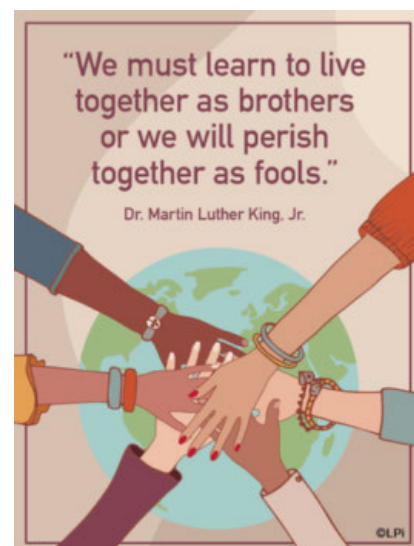

us the audience was the people, or more specifically the Christians, of the City of Rome. Consequently there are fewer references to places and people in Palestine. Jesus' birth and family are less focused upon – although we do receive stories about them absent in the other Gospels (especially Mk.3:20-35). Since Easter is a little later this year, we get a bit more of Mark before Lent, till March 1. (After the Season of Easter, in the beginning of June, the 'ordinary' Gospels will begin from MATTHEW, with LUKE starting at the end of August. Between the two cycles of readings, two weekday and three Sunday, we get familiar with most of the Bible – but not every line. ENJOY the Word of God !

Remember, YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE ! WE ARE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER. Get Vaccinated ! Respect the on-going pandemic. Be decent to all about you. BE RESURRECTION ALIVE ! Christ IS RISEN ! Alleluia ! He is RISEN indeed ! Alleluia WELCOME back to ALL !

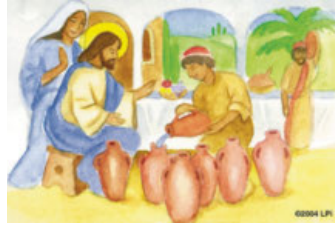
