

A couple of years ago Pope Francis designated the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (today) as 'The Word of God' Sunday. By doing so, he helps us focus on one of the central beliefs of our Church. 

A LAMORA CLINIC REFLECTION

Dear Parishioners,

If you are like me, January is the month when closets get cleaned and all those little chores that we put off during the warm weather and then the holidays, finally get done. While challenging myself to clean out those closets, I came across the following article that I wrote after Tim and I went to El Salvador for the first time, in 2009. Many of you will remember our beloved Deacon Don Leach who started Resurrection parish's efforts to help support the La Mora medical clinic. He had requested that I share our first experience going to El Salvador with both Resurrection and Our Lady of Good Counsel parishes. I believe it is even more relevant today.

"A Faith Journey"/ March, 2009

"Several weeks ago, my husband, Tim, and I returned from a trip to El Salvador sponsored by CRISPAZ (Christians for Peace in El Salvador). We had initially learned about these annual trips in which both Resurrection and Our Lady of Good Counsel parishioners were invited to participate when we attended a one day retreat given by Deacon Don Leach. As you can all testify, Deacon Don is an inspirational voice especially as it relates to the poor. Little did Tim and I know that that day would begin a journey which resulted in our decision to make a trip this March - a trip which has truly changed our lives forever.

When we made the commitment to go with this year's delegation, we felt that the Holy Spirit was nudging us to do this but we really had very little idea what to expect. I just kept recalling Deacon Don's statement at that retreat - 'To know Christ, (con't on page 7)

you must know the poor'. That simple but profound statement kept coming back to me and it overcame any apprehension I may have had. Tim was a good sport in all of this and not only supported me but even came along for the ride. And what a ride it has been!

When we began to prepare for our delegation to go, we did readings, watched films and, in the process, started to know one another and share our fears and goals for this journey. There were seven of us and we began to coalesce as a group of Christians who were opening ourselves to an extraordinary experience of grace. When Tim and I struggled with questions from family and friends about what we would be "doing" there, we responded with what we were gradually coming to understand ourselves - we were going to spend one week walking in solidarity with the Salvadoran people. This "walking" resulted in spending time listening to stories which were heartbreaking and breathtaking in their courage and faith. We came to understand the ravages of civil war and poverty on individuals, families and society. We saw people who live lives of incredible courage and their determination to take care of their families despite obstacles that the average American cannot even imagine. We saw a community spirit which humbled me. We met a Supreme Court Justice whose husband was a human rights activist who was murdered during the twelve year civil war in El Salvador. She went on to dedicate her life to continuing his work and raising their five children who had witnessed their father's assassination. We went to schools, operated on shoestring budgets, which provide not only an education but also safe places for children who otherwise might be induced to join gangs out of a sense of hopelessness and a need to belong. We toured a coffee cooperative plantation and witnessed the backbreaking work these individuals do in order to provide for their families. We were privileged to stand where Archbishop Romero preached his last homily prior to his assassination at the altar in a simple hospital chapel. We traveled to the La Mora Clinic and saw first hand what our parish has done and continues to do in order to provide assistance and hope. It was extremely gratifying to stand in the clinic and to see the mothers with small children on their laps waiting for medical care which before was not available. I stood there and wished each one of you could see for yourselves the gratitude in the eyes of these women and men who are looking for the same thing that we are all seeking - a decent life for our children. Visiting the clinic and the villages the same thought kept coming to mind - 'We are all brothers and sisters in Christ'.

I will close by asking you to continue to support the clinic not only financially but also spiritually. Please keep the Salvadoran people in your prayers. Know that our work as a parish is doing tremendous good and that the people who benefit are enormously grateful."

UPDATE - As you know, Fr. Tom, Tim and I and several others had the privilege of going to El Salvador again two years ago. It was another impetus to continue our efforts as a parish on behalf of the Salvadoran people who continue to suffer. If you too feel the nudge of the Holy Spirit I encourage you to open your mind and heart to that gentle persuasion. Our committee welcomes newcomers with open arms.
