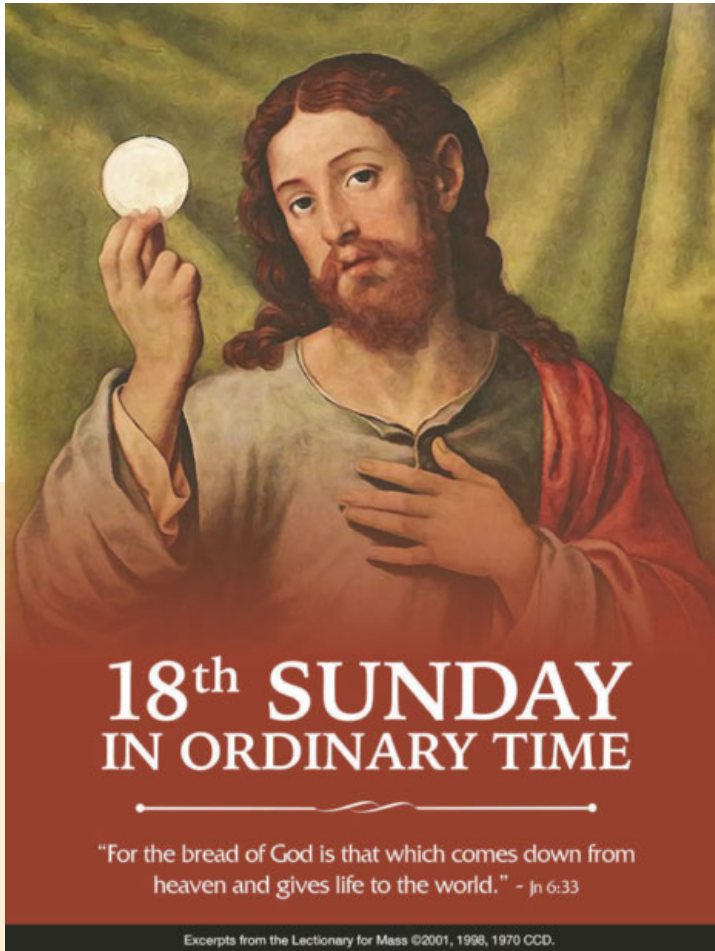

THE REV SAYS ...

This Saturday, August 10th, is the feast day of a popular saint, St. Lawrence. His feast day in fact is a high ranking feast day in the church in which we even say or sing the Gloria at Mass.

St. Lawrence was a Spaniard by birth. He lived in the third century and became the Archdeacon and treasurer of the Church in Rome as well as the keeper of the library of sacred books. Of course this was a time when the Christian Church was being heavily persecuted, and so when Pope Sixtus II was arrested and led out to die, Lawrence lamented that he could not share in his martyrdom. Pope Sixtus II responded to him by saying, "Do not weep, my son; in three days you will follow me." The Pope also instructed his trusted deacon to gather together all the Church's wealth and distribute it to the poor.

Overhearing this talk of wealth, the greedy Roman authorities commanded Lawrence to gather up the Church's treasures and surrender them to the prefect of Rome. Lawrence asked for three days to do so – and on the third day presented, assembled before the prefect's palace, thousands of lepers, orphans, the blind, the lame, as well as widows and virgins. "Here," he announced, "is all the Church's treasure." For some reason, this gesture did not enlighten the prefect, but only enraged him instead. As a result, Lawrence was subjected to a sequence of tortures, including being placed on a gridiron and

roasted alive. While on the gridiron, at one point Lawrence supposedly quipped to his executioners, "Turn me over, I'm done on this side."

According to folklore, fair weather on St. Lawrence's Day presages a fair Autumn. It is also customary in some parts of Europe to only eat cold meat on this day in recognition of the manner of his death. St. Lawrence is the patron saint of Sri Lanka, cooks, the poor and librarians.

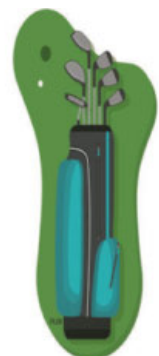

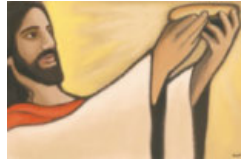

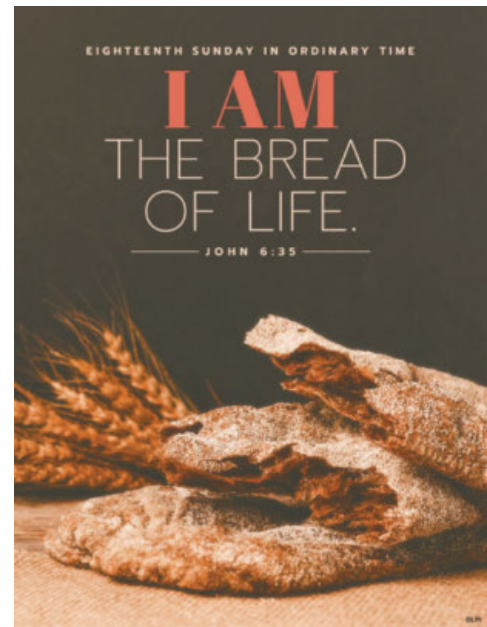

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Today, in St. John's Gospel, Jesus ties His instructions on the Eucharist to the Book of Exodus. Dear People of God at Canton, Resurrection, Parish,

I come from a traditional Catholic family. My father was an army officer, and you know how strict he was with us. My mother was a loving and caring homemaker. We were ten of us in the family, including parents. I had four brothers and three sisters, making us eight children. I am the sixth in the order of children. I lost my two sisters and parents, but with the blessing of our Heavenly Father we continue to remain a happy and blessed Family.

I joined the seminary at the age of sixteen after completing my tenth grade and was ordained when I was 27 years old. Now I am 54 years old and was ordained on April 30, 1997. Therefore, I have been a priest for 27 years. I belong to the congregation of the Missionaries of Saint Francis De Sales, also known as 'Fransalians.' The Calling of God is very mysterious at the same time very real. I had experienced through past 27 years of priest, God's abiding presence, guidance, and protection. I feel the same way now you too may feel so. I had been serving in different parts India, St. Lucia, Caribbean Island and Archdiocese of Detroit.

After seven years, I am glad to be back to the Archdiocese of Detroit. I had to conclude my ministry after 11 years of service in the Archdiocese of Detroit due to the policy of our congregation, the Missionaries of St. Francis De Sales, which requires us to return to India, the mother province, after 10 years of service. I was also glad to go because my mother was in ill health, and I wanted to be with her in her last days as she was bedridden. My mother passed away on April 14th, 2022. I thank the Lord Jesus for giving her a peaceful and painless death. Now, I am back, renewed and refreshed, to offer my services to you all under the mentorship and guidance of Rev. Paul Ballien and Fr. Jim Houbeck with the support of the staff and the parish council members. May God be glorified in all we do for the good and Spiritual life formation and renewal of our parish community. Thank you, and God bless you All

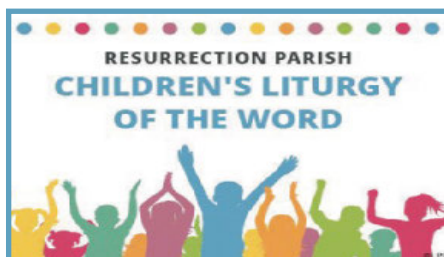

SVDP HAPPENINGS

The Society of St. Vincent DePaul (SVDP) is focused on preventing homelessness, fighting hunger and changing lives. During July, SVDP Resurrection helped two of our neighbors with rent so they could continue living in their homes, avoiding eviction. Another neighbor asked for assistance paying their DTE bill, whom we were able to help. We also helped a neighbor needing car repairs so they could make it to work without having to pay costly transportation charges or missing work. SVDP Resurrection also helped three SVDP conferences in western Wayne County with rent and car repair bills belonging to neighbors who they were trying to assist. It was a busy month for our SVDP volunteers.

Thanks to your generous food donations, SVDP Resurrection was able to donate 500 lbs. of non-perishable food to the John Bolde Food Depot during July. When we encounter neighbors who need help with food to feed their families, we provide them with a voucher that they can redeem at the John Bolde Food Depot, which is open weekdays. If we encounter a family needing food on the weekend, we will provide them with a store gift card that they can use to purchase some emergency items until the Food Depot is open.

Thank you to everyone who generously makes a donation to our SVDP Resurrection conference. No donation is too small. Green SVDP envelopes are included in your envelope packets for your convenience. The little church in the gathering space may also be used to donate loose change or bills to SVDP Resurrection.
