

THE REV SAYS ...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I am sure you are aware of the strife of the recent hurricanes and storms that took its toll on Florida and parts of the Southeastern US. We join in prayer for the recovery and will do our best to support our neighbors as we are able to. May God guide the people in restorative work and to grant comfort to those who have suffered great loss.

I want to offer a thought about a way to endure these situations from a Catholic spiritual standpoint. I came across a prayer in an app called iPieta and then found it on the website for the Diocese of St. Petersburg (Florida). Inasmuch as they have to endure great storms each year, it is no surprise it is listed there. Here is the "Prayer against Storms":

(Make the sign of the cross on the + symbol)

Jesus Christ a King of Glory has come in Peace. + God became man, + and the Word was made flesh. + Christ was born of a virgin. + Christ suffered. + Christ was crucified. + Christ died. + Christ rose from the dead. + Christ ascended into Heaven. + Christ conquers. + Christ reigns. + Christ orders. + May Christ protect us from all storms and lightning. + Christ went through their midst in Peace, + and the Word was made Flesh. + Christ is with us with Mary. + Flee you enemy spirits because the Lion of the Generation of Juda, the Root of David, was won. + Holy God! + Holy Powerful God! + Holy Immortal God! + Have mercy on us. Amen! ¹

To be clear: this is not magic or superstition. One only needs to consider how much damage is caused each year by hurricanes/tropical storms even though this prayer is offered. The key, though, is focusing on the Lord Jesus and asking for His guidance and protection through storms.

We know that the Lord Jesus slept in peace while His boat was being tossed about (Mk 4:35-41) and His Word calmed nature immediately. Yes, there can be disaster and loss (we do not deny that). But when we offer this prayer we ask Jesus to bless us before the storm, during the storm, and whatever happens afterward. We cling to Jesus and trust in Him throughout everything.

Finally, we here in Michigan are not exempt from bad weather or our own difficulties. Perhaps the next time a

weather warning comes our way we can pray this and ask the Lord to see us through any storm. He will...but it does not mean that things will always be smooth.

Though rain falls, floods come, and winds blow and buffet us, Jesus is our Lord and our Rock...He will not let us collapse. (Mt. 7:25)

2023 VBS Mission Update

Last summer the Vacation Bible School Mission project was to raise funds to build a water filtration system in Haiti for Mango Community Family Farm which provides the local community with a safe and sustainable space to grow food and raise animals. Mango Farms recently sent this update:

Dear VBS and Resurrection Parish family, The water building is now 70% complete. Final tasks include wiring and painting. We are also working on a finished canal in front of the building, offering our neighbors convenient access to water. Gymps, our founder, is in Haiti this week, overseeing the installation of the commercial water filtration system, and connecting the solar pump to the well. Last week new solar panels were successfully installed to support the water system. Additionally, we've creatively repurposed materials from our shipping container guest house to construct doors for the water building. Nothing goes to waste at Mango Farm! Soon our doors will be open to the community. Thank you for your support, which has made it possible for us to continue making a difference in the lives of our Haitian neighbors!

Dear People of God at Canton, Resurrection, Parish,

I come from a traditional Catholic family. My father was an army officer, and you know how strict he was with us. My mother was a loving and caring homemaker. We were ten of us in the family, including parents. I had four brothers and three sisters, making us eight children. I am the sixth in the order of children. I lost my two sisters and parents, but with the blessing of our Heavenly Father we continue to remain a happy and blessed Family.

I joined the seminary at the age of sixteen after completing my tenth grade and was ordained when I was 27 years old. Now I am 54 years old and was ordained on April 30, 1997. Therefore, I have been a priest for 27 years. I belong to the congregation of the Missionaries of Saint Francis De Sales, also known as 'Fransalians.' The Calling of God is very mysterious at the same time very real. I had experienced through past 27 years of priest, God's abiding presence, guidance, and protection. I feel the same way now you too may feel so. I had been serving in different parts India, St. Lucia, Caribbean Island and Archdiocese of Detroit.

After seven years, I am glad to be back to the Archdiocese of Detroit. I had to conclude my ministry after 11 years of service in the Archdiocese of Detroit due to the policy of our congregation, the Missionaries of St. Francis De Sales, which requires us to return to India, the mother province, after 10 years of service. I was also glad to go because my mother was in ill health, and I wanted to be with her in her last days as she was bedridden. My mother passed away on April 14th, 2022. I thank the Lord Jesus for giving her a peaceful and painless death. Now, I am back, renewed and refreshed, to offer my services to you all under the mentorship and guidance of Rev. Paul Ballien and Fr. Jim Houbeck with the support of the staff and the parish council members. May God be glorified in all we do for the good and Spiritual life formation and renewal of our parish community. Thank you, and God bless you All

Pope Francis Center Update

First of all, THANK YOU! to all of our dedicated sandwich makers and drivers. Every weekend the refrigerators are literally stuffed with bags of sandwiches. Words cannot adequately express the sincere gratitude of the staff and guests for this outpouring of generosity.

The Center is seeing a steady increase in the number of guests served. The Center is now serving 200 to 250 guests daily. The record set in July was 255. Needless to say, these increased numbers have placed a strain on the Center both physically and monetarily. Guests are young and old, men and women, and couples that are either homeless or part of the working poor. In spite of this increase, the sandwich ministry continues to provide enough sandwiches that each Monday the guests receive two and sometimes three sandwiches with their soup or whatever lunch the chef prepares. Talk about loaves and fishes!

Besides breakfast and lunch, the Center provides many services and supplies for the guests: showers, laundry, personal care items, socks, underwear etc. If you can help with supplying some of these needs, please go to the Pope Francis website and check out their Amazon wish list under Give Now: <https://popefranciscenter.org>

SVDP HAPPENINGS

The Society of St. Vincent DePaul (SVDP) is focused on preventing homelessness, fighting hunger and changing lives. During July, SVDP Resurrection helped two of our neighbors with rent so they could continue living in their homes, avoiding eviction. Another neighbor asked for assistance paying their DTE bill, whom we were able to help. We also helped a neighbor needing car repairs so they could make it to work without having to pay costly transportation charges or missing work. SVDP Resurrection also helped three SVDP conferences in western Wayne County with rent and car repair bills belonging to neighbors who they were trying to assist. It was a busy month for our SVDP volunteers.

Thanks to your generous food donations, SVDP Resurrection was able to donate 500 lbs. of non-perishable food to the John Bolde Food Depot during July. When we encounter neighbors who need help with food to feed their families, we provide them with a voucher that they can redeem at the John Bolde Food Depot, which is open weekdays. If we encounter a family needing food on the weekend, we will provide them with a store gift card that they can use to purchase some emergency items until the Food Depot is open.

Thank you to everyone who generously makes a donation to our SVDP Resurrection conference. No donation is too small. Green SVDP envelopes are included in your envelope packets for your convenience. The little church in the gathering space may also be used to donate loose change or bills to SVDP Resurrection.
