We continue the work of Jesus Christ, to Unleash the Gospel and help everyone seek and experience the love and mercy of God.

Father Bogdan's Corner

With Ash Wednesday February 17th the Ordinary Time will be over and the Season of Lent will begin with sprinkling the top of the head with ashes. (Not on the foreheads this year). It will be done at 12 noon with a short service and at 6 p.m. with Mass. On Fridays during Lent there will be Stations of the Cross at 6:30 p.m. This year, because of COVID19, there will not be any Lenten activities: Lenten soup, Pierogis, fish or retreats. I hope that COVID restrictions will be over soon.

On Ash Wednesday, we will receive the ashes that has been a practice going on for about a thousand years. In the earliest Christian Centuries from 200 to 500 Year those guilty of serious sins such as murder, adultery or apostasy were excluded from the Eucharist. After Lent—40 days of fasting, praying and almsgiving, they were welcomed back once again to participate at the Holy Mass. We all are sinners, each in his or her own way and we all need the time for purification of our hearts and minds. On page 3 you can find our annual compilation of ways to observe the Season of Lent.

During Lent, we will have two daily Masses during the week. Beginning on Friday February 19th we will have morning Mass at 9 a.m. and continue on Wednesdays and Fridays during Lent. Those who attend must wear masks, maintain social distance and not socialize before or after the Mass.

As I wrote in previous bulletins Pope Francis proclaimed 2021—Year of St. Joseph. For several future bulletins until the Feast of St. Joseph March 19th we are going to share with you what the Holy Father wrote about St. Joseph. The first article is entitled: A Beloved Father. You can find the article on Page 3.

We also received updated guidance from AoD Human Resource Department last week that workplace gatherings (i.e., meetings) must continue remotely via Zoom, RingCentral Meetings, etc. at least through April 14, 2021. The office will continue to be only open by appointment.

Here, for your consideration, is our annual compilation of ways to observe the season of Lent. Lent is a time of enormous grace and spiritual renewal. It is a period of solemnity, reflection and repentance in the weeks leading up to Holy Week and the commemoration of Christ's Passion and Death. Our prayerful sacrifice is a reminder of the self-sacrifice Jesus made to save us from our sins. During Lent, we are called to pray, fast give alms and study the ways of God.

- 1.) Read Sacred Scripture.
- 2.) Read spiritual/religious literature for fifteen minutes.
- 3.) Spend ten minutes in silence.
- 4.) Pray the rosary.
- 5.) Pray the Stations of the Cross.
- 6.) Say the Divine Mercy Chaplet every Friday during Lent.
- 7.) Attend Mass daily or go once or twice during the week besides Sunday.
- 8.) Pray a novena celebrating a Lent related saint or event.
- 9.) Give up dessert.
- 10.) Go to Confession.
- 11.) Give up alcohol.
- 12.) Give up or cut down on coffee, tea or soda.
- 13.) Give up bread.
- 14.) Wake up earlier.
- 15.) Go to bed earlier.
- 16.) Give up or spend less time online, especially social networking sites.
- 17.) Give up or cut down on television, texting, computer time.
- 18.) At the close of each day, do an examination of conscience.
- 19.) Cut down on the number of times a day you check email.
- 20.) Fast on Fridays [one meal or just bread and water].
- 21.) In addition to sacrificing, add something to your Lenten routine.
- 22.) Volunteer to serve the poor, addicted or abused.
- 23.) Remain calm when driving.
- 24.) Begin and end your day in prayer.



St. Joseph - A Beloved Father

The greatness of St. Joseph is that he was the spouse of Mary and the father of Jesus. In this way he placed himself, in the words of St. John Chrysostom, “at the service of the entire plan of salvation.”

St. Paul VI pointed out that Joseph concretely expressed his fatherhood “by making his life a sacrificial service to the mystery of the Incarnation and its redemptive purpose. He employed his legal authority over the Holy Family to devote himself, his heart and all his abilities, a love placed at the service of the Messiah, who was growing to maturity in his home.”

Thanks to his role in salvation history, St. Joseph has always been venerated as a father by the Christian people. This is shown by the countless churches dedicated to him world-wide, the numerous religious institutes, confraternities and ecclesial groups inspired by his spirituality and bearing his name, and the many traditional expressions of piety in his honor.

Innumerable holy men and women were passionately devoted to him. Among them was Teresa of Avila, who chose him as her advocate and intercessor, had frequent recourse to him and received whatever graces she asked of him. Encouraged by her own experience, Teresa persuaded others to cultivate devotion to Joseph.

Every prayer book contains prayers to St. Joseph. Special prayers are offered to him each Wednesday and especially during the month of March, which is traditionally dedicated to him.

Popular trust in St. Joseph is seen in the expression “go to Joseph,” which evokes the famine in Egypt, when the Egyptians begged Pharaoh for bread. He in turn replied, “Go to Joseph; what he says to you, do” (Gn 41:55). Pharaoh was referring to Joseph, the son of Jacob, who was sold into slavery because of the jealousy of his brothers (cf. Gn 37:11-28) and who—according to the biblical account—subsequently became viceroy of Egypt (cf. Gn 41:41-44).

As a descendant of David (cf. Mt 1:16-20), from whose stock Jesus was to spring according to the promise made to David by the prophet Nathan (cf. 2 Sm 7), and as the spouse of Mary of Nazareth. St. Joseph stands at the crossroads between the Old and New Testaments.



An Intro to the Overflow Homeless Program

Last March due to the COVID-19 pandemic the MCREST (Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter Team) was successful in moving their program for 60 adults into an area hotel. At that same time, MCWC (Macomb County Warming Center) had to make the difficult decision to cancel their program for the rest of the season.

Over the summer MCREST worked with MCWC and Macomb County government to ensure the homeless would be cared for. With money through the federal CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act) the (OHP) *Overflow Homeless Program* was developed. This program is being managed with MCREST resources.

Churches who were a part of the MCWC program have been asked to provide a bagged lunch for the OHP guests. This can be up to 120 guests, including men, women and children. Lunches will be delivered daily to the MCREST office. Guests are required to check-in daily and in doing so are given their lunch for the following day.

We will be providing a bagged lunch the week of March 14 – 21. We will be using the \$2,400 collected last year for part of this effort. Additional items will be requested using tags, similar to what was used for our Christmas boards.

In the weeks to come more information will be provided for volunteering March 14 – 21. Space will be limited due to COVID restrictions to a max of three individuals in the kitchen. With two resources outside the kitchen packing the lunches. Another two resources will deliver the lunches each day by 1:00 p.m.

Our Christian Service commission looks forward to the continued generosity of our parish. And the many blessings donators and volunteers will receive for being a part of this mission.

Arrange at least six months in advance.

Communion Calls

Pastoral Staff members visit the sick in the hospital when possible and take Communion to the sick and homebound regularly. Names of the sick should be reported to the Parish Office.
