



Parents and family members are the primary educators in the faith. Together with them, especially in certain cultures, all members of the family play an active part in the education of the younger members."

Integrating spiritual practices into the home and extended family helps the children, parents, and other family members to become stronger in their faith.

It is a blessing for every family and extended family to enjoy time together, make family memories, and embrace spiritual practices. Here are some ways that your family can help build the spiritual life of your child(ren).

Meal Prayers: This allows a family to pause and give thanks for what is before them. The teachers have given the students copies of the Meal Prayer, or have your family write their own.

Nighttime Prayer: A blessing ritual is an endearing and powerful tradition to establish. For the younger child (ren) a parent can trace a cross on a child's forehead accompanied by a prayer and then the child can in turn bless the parent by tracing a cross. The students are learning the Guardian Angel Prayer, and this would be a good one to do at night, followed by praying for those we feel need our prayers, example father mother, grandparent, neighbor, friend etc.

Quality Time: Spending time together helps families get to know one another better, share about their week, the day at school or work. Learn what interests your family has. I know we live in a very busy and demanding world today. When I was a child we sat at the dinner table as a family, although in some cases work or school schedules interfere with this practice. But for some this is possible. At first your children might be resistant, better things to do you know. But be persistent you will see them enjoying this time together. Maybe attend Mass as a family and plan a special meal after mass whether you support a local restaurant or make a meal with love and have the family help.

A book written by Matthew Kelly stated in *The Thing About Fathers*, "There is a mantra that dominates the cultural landscape today: 'I don't feel heard. I don't feel seen! I don't feel known." Let's save our children from this fate by spending time with them in ways that allow them to know, now and forever, that they are seen, heard, loved, and valued beyond anything."

All these practices make it possible to influence children in a positive, faith-filled way.

We all find ourselves telling our children when we are busy: hold on, I'll be there in a minute, start eating dinner and I will be there shortly. We all need to start the new year with setting time aside for family time.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

December 26, 2021—The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

Families can be very difficult things to negotiate. This is true not only of our families of origin, the current family of which we are a part, the family of our Church, our society, and our global family as well. Everything human can be found in family stories. Those stories speak of wonderful life-giving successes as well as painful spirit-robbing abuses. Our greatest joys and our greatest wounds are usually connected with the experience of family. Our needs, experiences, and unresolved baggage often color what we bring to our familiar relationships. They contribute to our level of defensiveness, how guarded and protected we become, and what prejudices we believe.

In order to break the cycle of dysfunction we have to remember that it is not only by human effort that we negotiate the difficult and challenging events of our lives. There is a Divine Effort at work as well. For sure, the human effort can create quite a mess and easily destroy lives. This is true of any family with which we are associated. Today's Feast of the Holy Family serves to help us understand that there is a Divine Story being told as well. It is a story of perseverance in the face of hardship, determination in the face of despair, healing when we see nothing but wounds, and light where there is darkness.

Do we believe that God is always working, guiding, restoring, and leading? Unless we do, we will never be free from the imperfections and wounds that bind us and never be able to understand what it really means to forgive. Pope Francis tells us that the "light which comes from the Holy Family encourages us to offer human warmth to other families." While this is most certainly true, we can only really begin to do this when we realize that we are still works in progress, not anchored to the wounds and sins of our past, and still a leading star in God's continually unfolding story of love. The Holy Family persevered and radiated warmth because they knew they were not alone. We can too.
