Last weekend we observed the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. To our 11:00 a.m. Mass we added a special devotion—a Eucharistic Procession made of people involved in the life of the parish. Many thanks to all who walked in the procession to honor the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. As we look into our liturgical year, we can easily notice how God the Father, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit are accompanying us through the year and at the same time through our whole life. First we begin with Lent, next The Resurrection of Christ, His Ascension, The Decent of the Holy Spirit, two weeks ago the Holy Trinity and last weekend Corpus Christi—the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Sometimes people ask: What is the meaning of life? You can find the answer easily when you organize your life around religious events that we already observed and took place in the history of our salvation. Besides religious celebrations—that we should make an effort to participate in, we also have civil celebrations for instance Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, etc. In general, people are social beings and like to celebrate. and the life of the world to come. Amen.



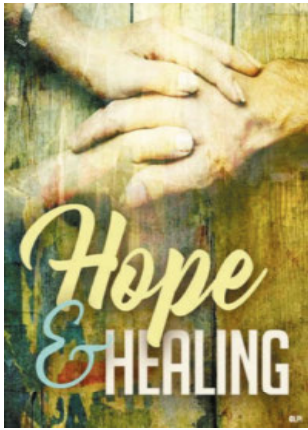
St. Vincent de Paul PANTRY UPDATE
