Father Bogdan's Corner

Two weeks ago I attended a two day Seminar on Family of Parishes. As you know, our Archbishop of Detroit is going through reconstruction of the entire Archdiocese. Over 200 parishes that we have now are grouping into a smaller entity called Family of Parishes (FoP). There will be 52 Family of Parishes after the process is accomplished. Our family is made of 6 parishes: St. Anne, Fr. John Kopson, St. Louise de Marillac, Fr. Andrew Czarnecki, St. Mark, Fr. Stanislaw Obloj, St. Mary, Our Lady Queen of Families, Fr. Robert Bauer, Our Lady of Grace Vietnamese Parish, Fr. Hoang Lam and St. Faustina Parish, Fr. Bogdan Milosz. In addition to becoming a FoP, our title—Pastor is changed to Priest in Solidum. Although our title is changed, we will shepherd each of our parishes and have the same responsibilities as previously. Parishioners have full right to use our pastoral ministry and my brother priest and myself are very happy to serve you even as our title has changed. We will visit the sick, say Masses, funerals, weddings, prayers for parishioners, confessions, appointments, hospital visits, etc. Each one of us will be in charge of administration, staff, liturgies—for everything that we did in the past. But at the same time, we priests of our family, will meet together in solidum to continue the process of forming our Family. Each parish may have a Parish Council, and definitely Finance Council and other commissions and groups, like rosary society, prayer groups, altar society, hospitality, ushers, KofC, etc. This could take several months or even a few years to form our Parish Family.

I am still looking for volunteers who would like to serve as Lectors, Servers and Ushers. It is still the middle of summer but we are already planning for our Religious Education Program for next year. Tell your friends, neighbors, and grandchildren about our Religious Education Program. Also, if you know of someone interested in becoming Catholic we will have an RCIA Program.

As we continue our mission, at St. Faustina Parish, we plan to have a fall dinner and raffle. Stay tuned for more details to come.

Thank you very much for all the Birthday and Anniversary wishes that you have extended to me this past month. I truly appreciate your kindness.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

July 10, 2022 - 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

We can learn a great deal from Mister Rogers. Remember him? He was the gentle soul who found his way into living rooms worldwide starting as far back as 1968. Mister Rogers' Neighborhood was a beloved program that celebrated and exalted people, especially children. He taught us that we are neighbors and that everyone has a place. Everyone matters. He had a vision, born of his relationship with God that highlighted every human life's innocence, beauty, and uniqueness. To that end, he called us to be responsible for each other, saying nothing different than what Jesus said. Viewers quickly learned that life is not just about me.

"We live in a world in which we need to share responsibility. It's easy to say, 'It's not my child, not my community, not my world, not my problem.' Then there are those who see the need and respond. I consider those people my heroes (Fred Rogers)." It is so easy to look the other way. After all, I'm not the one who needs to leave home out of fear and try to find somewhere safe. I am not the one who is hungry and without shelter or food. I am not the one who has a child being bullied or ridiculed because of the way they dress or act. I am not the one being threatened with violence or unable to find meaningful work. The distress and agony of our neighbors are our distress and agony. We cannot walk by it with an attitude of indifference, especially if we call ourselves believers. When we no longer care, we have suffocated our souls. This is a great sin.

God's law "is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out." We all have a need for love and acceptance. That's why Mister Rogers' television show was so popular. It spoke to something deeper, something sacred about humanity. God didn't give us his law in a book. He wrote it on our hearts. We know what we need to do. It's a matter of choice. Love is sacred. When we love another human being, especially without regard for ourselves, it is a holy moment. These moments are often missed due to our self-serving agendas and rules.
