Father Bogdan's Corner

Recently I bought an audiobook by Pope Francis entitled "Our Father". In this book the Holy Father explains the meaning of the prayer that people of different denominations are saying. The book contains twenty-seven chapters and each chapter helps us to understand to whom we pray and for what we pray. Saying "Our Father" we get the sense that we are not an orphan but we have the Father, who pays attention to our needs. Holy Father stresses that we are living in a "fatherless society". The authority of the father is diminishing. The figure of the father is symbolically absent, vanished and removed from our culture. For the sake of liberation from the "Master", the authority of the father is disappearing. In many families, children are experiencing "orphanhood". Fathers do not play a significate role in their lives, and are not present at their homes. And also, the fathers in todays culture are not certain of their role. In today's Gospel, Jesus is advising us about giving support to our fathers, respect them and love them. Fathers should be able to address the needs of their children when they "seek, knock and ask". Our Father, who art in heaven, from the beginning of creation is addressing all our needs and for that we should sing "Glory to God in the highest". One of the very important needs that our church has is Vocation to the Priesthood and Religious Life. During the summertime let us seek, knock and ask earnestly for Vocations.

He replied, "I will forbear doing it for the sake of the fortv." Then Abraham said, "Let not my Lord grow impatient if I go on. What if only thirty are found there?" He replied, "I will forbear doing it if I can find but thirty there.' Still Abraham went on, "Since I have thus dared to speak to my Lord, what if there are no more than twenty?' The LORD answered, "I will not destroy it, for the sake of the twenty." But he still persisted: "Please, let not my Lord grow angry if I speak up this last time.
