Father Bogdan's Corner

Last week is over but I owe you a reminder about the Memorial of St. Anne, the Mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary. St. Anne is the patroness of our Archdiocese of Detroit. Each year on July 26th there is a big celebration at St. Anne Basilica in Detroit to honor her. Yesterday we observed the Memorial of Blessed Solanus Casey, who was beatified on November 18, 2017. Some of our parishioners had the privilege to meet him when he was a porter and sacristan at St. Bonaventure Monastery for 20 years. Although he was not a homilist and confessor many people visited him daily, talked to him and through him received many blessings. St. Bonaventure Monastery is a good place to visit during the summer. May Blessed Fr. Solanus keep us in love with people. Tomorrow, Monday is the first day of August and during the first week we will observe First Friday of the month with Confession, Holy Mass, Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. This day is also called the Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus for the sins of humanity. Saturday, August 6, is the First Saturday of the month so we will have a special devotion to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary as a reparation for the sins committed by us against God, Jesus and Mary. Traditionally each catholic person should observe five First Saturdays consecutively.

On this day, we also observe the Transfiguration of the Lord. Jesus took Peter, James and John on the mountain and was transfigured before them. For them it was a powerful experience of Jesus that they said "Rabbi, it is good that we are here." I wish to all my parishioners the same discovery. It is good to have and be with Jesus.
