We continue the work of Jesus Christ, to Unleash the Gospel and help everyone seek and experience the love and mercy of God.

Father Bogdan's Corner

In today's readings, particularly in the Gospel, we heard about God's mercy and forgiveness. Jesus, as a Son of God, says to the women caught in adultery: "Neither do I condemn you. Go and sin no more." Jesus does not ignore her sin. He fully agrees with His Father that sin must be punished, but Jesus loved the women and He loves us so much that He freely decides to take our punishment on Himself. On the cross, every penalty for all the sins ever committed was placed on Jesus. He chose to suffer for us and never blamed us. The cross in front of us in our church reminds us about God's living mercy. After the observance of the Holy Week that we will begin on Palm Sunday, and after celebration of the Resurrection, we will have Sunday of Divine Mercy on April 27. On that Sunday, many pilgrims will visit our church and relic of St. Faustina. I am appealing to all parishioners to consider this day as very important after Christmas and Easter because we will experience God's mercy and forgiveness, and gratefully take hold of grace as strength for our resolve for the future. Next weekend we will observe Palm Sunday. It reminds us about Jesus's entry to Jerusalem, the place where Jesus was condemned and crucified. Before each Mass Palms will be blessed and the ushers will deliver them to each person. Also on that day, our parish will offer a heartfully prepared breakfast for parishioners and pilgrims, a bake sale and pierogi and golumpki will be for sale. I hope that you will not forget to get your ticket for the breakfast.

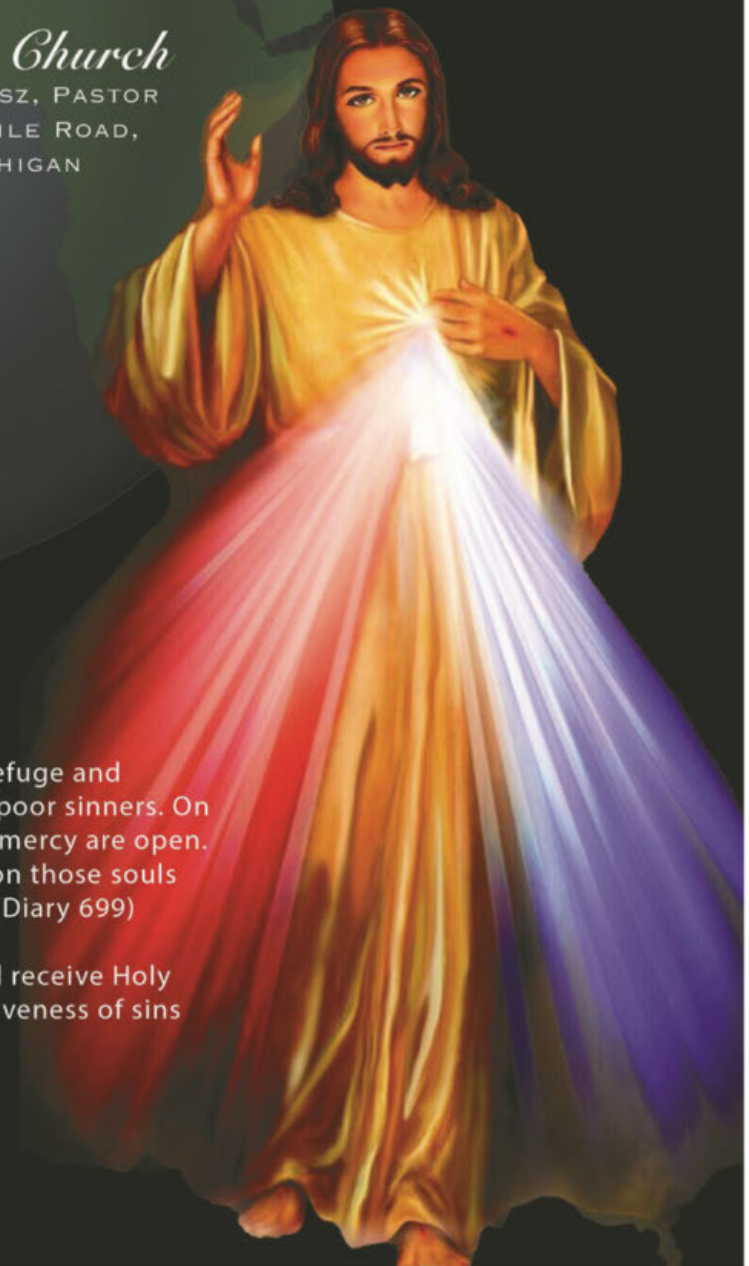

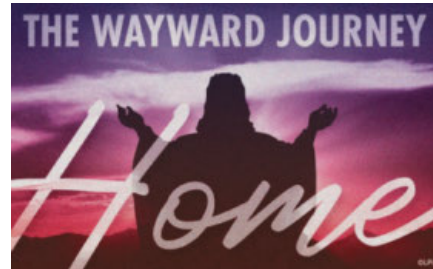

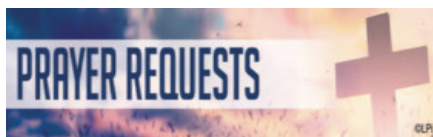
