Where Do We Find Joy? *Peter Wolf* 



The Nativity of the Lord

"The people who walked in darkness/ have seen a great light..." The writers of Isaiah wrote this 700 years before Jesus was born. They reflected on the state of the community at that time and much of what they were witnessing appears to remain present in our world today.

In many ways we live in times of darkness. Darkness in the violence in the streets, schools, and homes. Darkness when substances control our lives. Darkness when facing the diagnosis of dementia or memory loss. Darkness when the future of our planet appears to be in question.

Yet darkness did not consume them and neither should it consume us. They saw a great light and received abundant joy. The gospel of Luke reflects a similar outcome of joy when the angel spoke to the frightened shepherds "...I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all people." Here lies the thread of reflection between the readings. The connection is joy. But where do we find joy?

Tucker Redding S.J writes "God's plan defies human expectations..." Applying Redding's insight, we least expect joy coming into this world among the poor shepherds, in a barn with animals, and, like all of us, through the painful birthing ritual. In spite of his meager and very human entrance, Jesus brings us joy.

Joy surrounds us. We find joy in holding an infant. Joy is making a Gratitude Journal noting all that we appreciate. Joy is a pet that loves unconditionally. Joy is spending time with family either near in person or far via virtual platforms. Joy is making homemade gifts instead of searching for the perfect toys online.

We celebrate this week the image of Jesus as an infant, a source of joy and light in the darkness. Merry Christmas – may you find joy in your life. Peter Wolf
