This feast ends the Christmas liturgical season. The birth of Jesus is so often depicted as idyllic and sweet but, in reality, Jesus was born in an animal stall with his people denigrated by the greatest and most oppressive empire, Rome. We don't learn anything more about Jesus after his appearance in the temple at 12 until these scriptures today – except that he grew in wisdom and grace. Eighteen years later, he appears at the Jordan River where John is baptizing. All the promises of previous generations are about to be fulfilled (Isaiah and Ps. 104). "Here is your God who will give you food and good things when you open your hands." The people (we too) wait with blessed hope for "The grace of God to appear and to be saved by the bath of rebirth and renewal of the Holy Spirit" (Titus).

Like the birth of Jesus, we know the life of Jesus will not be idyllic and sweet. He is about to shoulder his mission (his Father's business) which would bring him exclusion, threats from religious and political powers and eventually a cruel death on the cross. Perhaps He spent those previous 18 years growing and deepening his relationship with the Father, which he continued by constantly going off to pray so that he was ready to fulfill his destiny and thus fulfill God's promises to us.

So that day at the Jordan, after others were baptized, Jesus stepped into the water, prayed and asked John to baptize him, too. God then anointed His Son with the Holy Spirit and fire and told him (which he also tells us constantly), "You are my beloved Son/daughter in whom I am well pleased." Do we hear that message and remind ourselves of that every day? Have we grown in that strong relationship with God since our baptism? Are we ready to follow Jesus in even the less sweet and idyllic times? Can our baptism be lived every day, a baptism of Spirit and fire, to bring about God's promises in our world?

Melt bitter chocolate and butter; let mixture cool. Add sugar, eggs and vanilla flavoring and stir. Add flour and teaspoon of baking powder; and mix well. Cool. Roll into golf-size balls. Roll into powdered sugar. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes.
