- The Archbishop has extended the present Mass dispensation for all through Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021. While the dispensation from the grave obligation to attend Sunday Mass is in effect, all baptized Catholics are reminded of the grave necessity they have to keep holy the Lord's Day. A general dispensation to all the faithful has been given so as not to unduly bind the consciences of those who are greatly troubled by the destructive potency of the coronavirus as well as to care for the most vulnerable among us. Catholics who engage in other activities that would present a similar or greater risk of contamination (eating out at restaurants, traveling, non-essential shopping, widening one's circle of contacts, etc.) should begin to return to Sunday Mass as they are able.
- A brief Communion Service for those unable to attend Mass, every Sunday at 5:00 pm in the church. A mask and social distancing are required.
- Daily Mass on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays in the main church. On Monday evenings, the Rosary will be prayed at 5:30 pm and Mass will be celebrated at 6:00 pm. On Tuesday and Wednesday mornings, the Rosary will be prayed at 8:00 am and Mass will be celebrated at 8:30 am.
- Weekend Masses are on Saturday at 5 pm and Sunday at 9 am (livestreamed) and 11 am.



### DID YOU KNOW?

**Jesus makes house calls!** In today's Gospel Jesus comes to the home of Simon Peter and cures Peter's mother-in-law of a fever. Now a fever in those days was a serious illness. Mom jumps up and rushes into the kitchen to cook a bit of food. Then Jesus, following the nourishment, starts healing folks right-and-left healing them of every kind of illness. What we find in the Book of Job, is Job the tormented, Job the afflicted, Job the despairing, Job who wants and needs a God who makes house calls. What Job found was the absent, God the uninvolved, God who is not engaged with his creatures. In the New Testament we see a God who is personal.

How has God treated you? Have you encountered the God that Jesus shows us? Have you made room for Him who wants to make a call at your house?

**Jesus wants you to know that He loves you. He wants you to bring your cares to Him. The more you ask, the more He will give. Bring to him everything great or small, it shows our trust in Him.**

**He is waiting to hear from you, so just sit down, invite Jesus to do the same and pour your heart out to Him. Let him embrace you with love. He is here for you and for all of us.**



### OVERCOMING THE DRUDGERY OF LIFE

Many people compare their everyday lives to running on a treadmill. They are always busy, always on the go, but never getting anywhere. Such people find themselves getting up in the morning, working, taking care of their children, putting supper together, and then going to bed only to start the cycle over again the next morning. Though coronavirus has slowed things down for most people, it has also increased the monotony of life for so many. There are times when we're not even sure what day of the week it is. All of it can cause us to question the meaning of our lives and wonder if all the activity is worth it. In today's first reading, Job expresses some of the same sentiments. As he puts it, "Life on earth is a drudgery." Remember that Job, in a series of tragedies, lost his wife, his children, and all his possessions. In his grief, he couldn't find the strength to pick himself up from the ground. In a near state of shock, he compares his life to that of a slave or hireling who has no share in the profits of his work. These are sentiments we can very easily share, especially during these dark and cold winter days. **While Job poses the problem, Jesus provides the solution.** In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus has had a very long day. The people of Capernaum, hearing that he had the power to heal and cast out demons, were bringing the sick to him while he stayed at the house of Peter's mother-in-law. When everyone had finally left, Jesus slipped away by himself to a deserted place to pray. He needed time away from the crowds and the demands of the people to spend time alone with his father. **For Jesus, prayer was a source of strength. All the power to preach the good news, to heal and to cast out demons came from the time he spent praising and adoring his Father in secret.** Like all of us, Jesus needed to step aside from his busy, demanding life to take stock of his Father's presence and love. **If we are going to live lives marked by peace and joy, prayer is vitally important to us. It will bring clarity to our minds when we are confused and calm to our spirits when we are anxious. Prayer is like an incubator cultivating faith, hope, and love within our spirit.** Our lives are about much more than what we do day in and day out. Our lives are rather about who we are — children of God made in his image and likeness. **Through prayer, we will see ourselves being renewed and transformed daily by God's presence and power. Our lives will be marked, not with monotony or drudgery, but with the joy and peace which come from the Holy Spirit.** *By Douglas Sousa*

#### *Family Conversation Starters*

- Why do you think it was important for Jesus to go and preach in the other villages?

#### *Family Fun Bingo*

Have each family member create a 5x5 bingo board (either print one out or just draw it on a regular piece of paper). In a random pattern, fill the squares with numbers, letters, words, or pictures. If using words or pictures, you may want to choose a theme such as football. Whatever answers are on the board, write them on a slip of paper and put them in a bowl. Have one person pick a slip of paper and call out the answer. Participants cover the square that was called if it is on their board. The first person to get 5 squares covered across, down, or on the diagonal wins! Consider having small prizes for the winner or let them be the one to call the answers next.

Take care of them in all the circumstances of their lives. Amen.

### SILENCE BEFORE MASS: A GENTLE REMINDER

A few years ago, Pope Francis called out the common habit of chatting with people before Mass, stressing that this is a time for silent prayer, when we prepare our hearts for an encounter with the Lord.

“When we go to Mass, maybe we arrive five minutes before, and we start to chitchat with those in front of us,” the Pope said. However, “it is not a moment for chitchat.”

“It is a moment of silence for preparing ourselves for dialogue, a time for the heart to collect itself in order to prepare for the encounter with Jesus,” he said, adding that “silence is so important.”


### MASS INTENTIONS AND CANDLES

## BE WISE


