### NO SUCH THING AS "ORDINARY TIME"

According to the Liturgical Calendar we are in the 11<sup>th</sup> week of ordinary time. However, brothers and sisters, **every day is unique and unrepeatable, and since God is active in everyday there is only extraordinary time.** It is my custom to begin our Eucharistic celebration by proclaiming that ***"This is the Day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."*** God's creative presence is not limited to Sunday celebrations; **He creates every day to be a holy day.** The Church recognizes this reality by celebrating the especially holy individuals we declare as saints and there are thousands of saints in the life of the Church, more than one for each day of the year.

I will admit to a difficulty and that is God's not a show off; He is often hidden beneath the veneer of the everyday. Often it's hard to see the holiness in each day; we have been seduced into seeing only the usual. Never-the-less, **God is actively creating the joy of experiencing His dynamic presence in ordinary things.** However, finding God is a lot like mining for gold, you have to expend the energy to find the mother lode. **But when you find God hidden in the ordinary, you too will proclaim that this is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.**

### GOSPEL MEDITATION

A favorite motto of St. Teresa of Calcutta was, ***"do small things with great love."*** This is how it works in the kingdom of God. God can do tremendous things with the smallest gesture, especially when it is done in love. We can clearly see that our world is suffering greatly. People are struggling to find peace, navigate through conflicts, earn a sustainable living, find security and enough food to eat, and work through political tensions and conflicts. In the light of the magnitude of the difficulties that exist around us and even within us, we can find ourselves floundering to discover practical, effective solutions. **How can something so large be helped by someone as small and seemingly insignificant as me? While whole systems and structures may be out of the league of our personal influence, are we really that helpless in the midst of all of the turmoil, sadness, and suffering?**



If we believe that God is with us and that God is still working to bring about the glory of God's kingdom, then the answer is no. We are never helpless or without hope. Armed with a strong life of prayer, we can always flee to God and ask for inspiration, wisdom, and especially love. **We are all blessed with unique gifts and talents and it often seems that considering all that the world lacks, love and charity remain at the top of the list.** Life can easily become a battleground of hostility. Because life is challenging and difficult, anger is not far away. We see it on people's faces and hear it in their voices. There is a measure of frustration that permeates all avenues of life. It is even felt in the air.

As people of faith, we know that what we see here is not the end but only a part of something far greater to come. We know that God's kingdom is where we are ultimately meant to be, and the Gospel is the way to get there. If love and charity can prevail in us, then God will be able to do what God does best. God will use us to scatter the seeds of his kingdom. Through our small gestures, those seeds can receive the nurturing attention that is necessary for them to bear great fruit. We cannot fall victim to the strife that is around us. ***We have to keep ourselves refreshed and focused so that even in small ways, we can become part of the solution, not the problem.*** **Love and charity**, which come from God, can help to heal the ills of the world. **May we bring these simple gifts to the everyday simple tasks of our lives!**

### REGISTRATION FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION




Registration for the 2021 - 2022 school year will begin June 14th.

### SILENCE BEFORE MASS: A GENTLE REMINDER

A few years ago, Pope Francis called out the common habit of chatting with people before Mass, stressing that this is a time for silent prayer, when we prepare our hearts for an encounter with the Lord.

“When we go to Mass, maybe we arrive five minutes before, and we start to chitchat with those in front of us,” the Pope said. However, “it is not a moment for chitchat.”

“It is a moment of silence for preparing ourselves for dialogue, a time for the heart to collect itself in order to prepare for the encounter with Jesus,” he said, adding that “silence is so important.”

## OUR PARISH & CATHOLIC LIFE

The general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation expired on March 13.

While the general dispensation is removed, there are specific instances where the dispensation will continue, as well as those circumstances where there is no obligation in the first place. One does not have an obligation to attend Mass on Sunday in the following circumstances:

1. You are ill or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness (i.e., you have underlying conditions or are in a high-risk category). *Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.*
2. You exhibit flu-like symptoms. *Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.*
3. You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g., you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID or influenza). *Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.*
4. You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed.
5. You are pregnant.
6. Those 65 years of age or older (per the CDC's recommendation of high-risk individuals).
7. You cannot attend Mass *through no fault of your own* (e.g., no Mass is offered, you are infirmed, or, while wanting to go, you are prevented for some reason you cannot control (e.g., your ride did not show up, the church was at capacity).
8. If you have *significant* fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.


Now that the general dispensation from attending Mass has been lifted we will no longer be offering the Communion Service on Sundays.

- Daily Mass on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays in the main church. On Monday evenings, the Rosary will be prayed at 5:30 pm and Mass will be celebrated at 6:00 pm. On Tuesday and Wednesday mornings, the Rosary will be prayed at 8:00 am and Mass will be celebrated at 8:30 am. Weekend Masses are on Saturday at 5 pm and Sunday at 9 am (livestream) and 11 am.

St. Joseph: spouse of the Virgin Mary, foster father of Jesus, and patron saint of the universal Church. In celebration of the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX's declaration of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church, Pope Francis has

proclaimed a special "Year of St. Joseph." It is a wonderful opportunity to increase our love for St. Joseph and knowledge, "to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal" (Patris Corde).



**"Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good."**

### NEW COVID-19 LITURGICAL PROTOCOLS:

1. Those who are fully vaccinated may wear a face-covering and social distance but are no longer required to do so in churches.
2. Those who have not been fully vaccinated are to continue wearing face-coverings and to practice social distancing to protect themselves and others in churches. Because a parish community – and our society – requires mutual trust and a commitment to the common good, each individual is asked to make the best decisions for himself as well as for others. Parishes do not have the responsibility to verify who is and who is not vaccinated.
3. Each parish is to provide a portion of the church – with a size to be determined by the pastor – where social distancing and face-coverings are consistently maintained. This section is for anyone, vaccinated or unvaccinated.
4. All unvaccinated Catholics are encouraged to consult with their doctor about the vaccines. Resources to assist Catholics in understanding the moral use of COVID vaccines can be found at [aod.org/vaccines](http://aod.org/vaccines).
5. The Sign of Peace may resume with the normal wording, "Offerte vobis pacem / Let us offer each other the sign of peace," allowing parishioners and families to make their own determinations about how widely to share some sign of peace.

### COVID LITURGICAL PROTOCOLS WHICH REMAIN IN PLACE:

1. Parishes should continue to provide signage about current COVID protocols.
2. Parishes should keep doors open to ventilate churches as they are able.
3. Parishes are encouraged to continue the COVID arrangement of vessels for bread/wine on the altar.
4. Clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should continue to wear masks while distributing Holy Communion.
5. Parishes are encouraged to maintain sanitization stations at the locations of the distribution of Holy Communion.
6. Parishes are to continue to refrain from the distribution of the Chalice to the faithful (except for a Bride and Groom on their wedding day).
