

OF PARISHES**

Beginning July 1, 2021, our Parish will be joining with Guardian Angels, Christ Our Light, St. Anastasia and St. Lucy in what is called a “Family of Parishes”. Families of Parishes are groups of parishes—generally three to six working together. The goal of the Family of Parishes is to allow the parishes to share resources and unite in cooperation with one another. This new model will allow the priests, deacons, religious and lay staff associated with each parish to better share their gifts and talents with the whole Family of Parishes.

Our faith is rooted in the sacraments. It is no secret that there are fewer priests, so developing creative plans will better prepare our parishes to serve all the faithful. It is critical for us to renew the way parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Detroit are organized and structured. Families of Parishes allow priests to work together in groups and coordinates lay staff to work together to better support all the parishes within a family. The mission of “Unleashing the Gospel” and caring for the people of God continues to be the focus while bringing all people to know Christ’s love and mercy.

I will remain the family pastor of SEAS, however, other priests (and deacons) within our Family of Parishes may visit our parish on weekends to become familiar with SEAS while I do the same at other parishes within the family. The future reality is that priests will be less available and that familiarity will aid us in working together.

Everyone will still be part of their own parish community and parishioners will have the opportunity to connect with others by working, praying, and gathering together in a family network. Parishioners can become part of a larger faith family, working together and sharing resources in pursuit of the mission.

Our parish will maintain our own name, location, and identity. We will have intentional events and opportunities to share and collaborate with other parishes within our family.


- Men's Underwear—size large and up

GOSPEL MEDITATION

There's an ordinary pine grove located on a tree farm not too far from town where life's stresses and demands seem to melt away. It is here that all that seemed so important out there no longer is and one can get lost in the rows of trees and majestic beauty. **God is here and all is good. We need to connect with the Divine Source of all that is in order to understand what it is we are doing and why we are doing it.** Otherwise, things stop making sense and bitterness can overcome one's spirit. **It's okay to play once in a while and to discover that place of profound life and peace.** People always have needs and there is constantly something to do. And while all of that is necessary and we are needed, **there is also that inner solitude within that needs to be celebrated and released.**

We all need a pine grove. It's that little place we can go and leave all that consumes us behind. It's a place where technology can be set aside and wonder, and awe given some time. We don't have to text, calculate, or orchestrate anything in the pine grove. It is a somewhat deserted place where all of that can be set aside and we can just be. The anger, frustration, exhaustion, discouragement, helplessness, and occasional apathy, all can fall to the ground like all of those pine needles that once held their place on the branch of a Frasier Fir. The needles can let go. **We can let go. We are beings connected with Being and we all need to remember what really matters, who really matters and what life is truly all about. We need to find that place where we can rest and let go of all of the barnacles we accumulate. Rest, breathe, seek, and love.**

The world will need us again when we leave the pine grove. It will all be waiting for us, beckoning for our attention. But we will have prayed and will have marveled at the silence and the beauty of goodness. We can go back, ready, and eager to listen, to help, to heal, to cry, to embrace, and attend to all that is asked of us. **But, having let go of the distractions in that deserted place we will have a renewed sense of purpose. We will know better Who it is we serve and what we are meant to do. It will all be clearer now that we have been Divinely touched and refreshed.** ©LPi

SILENCE BEFORE MASS: A GENTLE REMINDER

A few years ago, Pope Francis called out the common habit of chatting with people before Mass, stressing that this is a time for silent prayer, when we prepare our hearts for an encounter with the Lord.

“When we go to Mass, maybe we arrive five minutes before, and we start to chitchat with those in front of us,” the Pope said. However, “it is not a moment for chitchat.”

“It is a moment of silence for preparing ourselves for dialogue, a time for the heart to collect itself in order to prepare for the encounter with Jesus,” he said, adding that “silence is so important.”

“Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good.” *United States Conference of Catholic Bishops*

The general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation expired on March 13.

While the general dispensation is removed, there are specific instances where the dispensation will continue, as well as those circumstances where there is no obligation in the first place. One does not have an obligation to attend Mass on Sunday in the following circumstances:

1. You are ill or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness (i.e., you have underlying conditions or are in a high-risk category). Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
2. You exhibit flu-like symptoms. Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
3. You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g., you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID or influenza). Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
4. You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed.
5. You are pregnant.
6. Those 65 years of age or older (per the CDC's recommendation of high-risk individuals).
7. You cannot attend Mass *through no fault of your own* (e.g., no Mass is offered, you are infirmed, or, while wanting to go, you are prevented for some reason you cannot control (e.g., your ride did not show up, the church was at capacity).
8. If you have *significant* fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

Now that the general dispensation from attending Mass has been lifted we will no longer be offering the Communion Service on Sundays.

- Daily Mass on Mondays, Tuesdays, & Wednesdays in the Daily Mass Chapel. On Monday evenings, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 5:15 pm, the Rosary will be prayed at 5:30 pm and Mass will be celebrated at 6:00 pm. On Tuesday & Wednesday mornings, the Rosary will be prayed at 8:00 am, and Mass will be celebrated at 8:30 am. Weekend Masses are on Saturday at 5 pm and Sunday at 9 am (livestream) and 11 am.


VOLUNTEER TO HELP AND/OR DONATE BLOOD
