

Our Family of Parishes launched on July 1, consisting of the parishes of Christ Our Light, Guardian Angels, St. Anastasia, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and St. Lucy Croatian. On Tuesday, July 13, the staffs from our parishes came together in a spirit of fellowship to talk about some important steps in moving forward as a newly established Family. It is an exciting time for all of us to rebuild and renew our shared commitment to the mission and ministries of our parishes.

We are collaborating together to assist you to be able to live out your baptismal call and serve God and one another. Listed below are some important initial steps for the parishes and our new Family.

Step One: The priests in our family are currently working on our Priest Covenant/Agreement. This agreement between the clergy in our Family is to be completed by August 15th.

Step Two: To continue to welcome back parishioners in our parishes, as well as revive and build up our ministries as we rebuild after COVID.

Step Three: To continue to renew mission-based ministries and to develop new opportunities for the baptized to participate.

Step Four: Coordinating collaboration with the family ministries. In this step we will examine areas of possible collaboration between parishes.

Step Five: Assigning Family chairpersons for the ministries of: *Discipleship Formation, Engagement, Evangelical Charity, Family Ministries, and Worship*. These assignments will be completed by October 1st.

Step Six: Develop a Missionary Strategic Plan for our new Family. The target date for the completion of this plan will be January/February of 2022.

We've all heard the phrase "Rome wasn't built in a day." This is also going to be true of our new Family. The meeting had a sense of excitement with opportunities. All the parishes have gifted and talented staffs. When I looked around the room at our meeting last Tuesday, my heart was filled with hope because of the loving servant leaders we have on each parish staff. The future is very bright!



Family Conversation Starters

- Today's reading concludes the Bread of Life Discourse which we heard on August 1st and August 8th. The disciples claim that Jesus' teaching is hard. What are some teachings that are hard for you?
- Why do you think some of the disciples left Jesus and went back to their former way of life? Why do you think the Twelve stayed with Jesus? Which group of disciples do you most identify with . . . those who left Jesus or those who stayed with him?
- What is Jesus saying to you through the Bread of Life Discourse?

Family Fun Charades

St. Moses lived in a community where silence was important. Today, play a game that requires silence! On slips of paper, write down some places, people, animals, foods, etc. You may want to include the events in Jesus' life. Place the slips of paper in a bowl. Divide into teams or have each player play on their own. One person picks a slip from the bowl. With a timer set for 1 minute (or an appropriate time for the player), the person acts out the event on their slip of paper without talking. The first person/team to guess the correct answer gets a point. Rotate so everyone gets a turn to act and a turn to guess.

Family Prayer Praying with Music

As a family, listen to the song "I Will Choose Christ" by Tom Booth. You should be able to find the song on YouTube (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=L793clHztwo>) or wherever you stream music. Reflect on the lyrics and share how they connect to the Gospel.

Who doesn't want to be happy? Father Kirby offers hope to the tired, overburdened, and unhappy by showing us the path to achieving happiness. It's not a new path. Jesus showed us the way in the Beatitudes, but Kingdom of Happiness reveals how these aren't merely nice sayings; they are powerful ways of living. First, Fr. Kirby identifies the sources of unhappiness: the false promises—the anti-beatitudes—of a fallen, busy world and explains how these tear down and rob us of happiness. Then Fr. Kirby leads the reader to Jesus, the source of authentic peace, true joy, and radical happiness. The Beatitudes teach about the love, power, and self-control within them by showing their practical, life-application in today's world. Each week's lesson includes scripture and other readings on one of the beatitudes, study questions, a small group discussion, two short video lectures and a video outline.

SOUTH OAKLAND FOOD DEPOT





SILENCE BEFORE MASS: A GENTLE REMINDER

A few years ago, Pope Francis called out the common habit of chatting with people before Mass, stressing that this is a time for silent prayer, when we prepare our hearts for an encounter with the Lord.

“When we go to Mass, maybe we arrive five minutes before, and we start to chitchat with those in front of us,” the Pope said. However, “it is not a moment for chitchat.”

“It is a moment of silence for preparing ourselves for dialogue, a time for the heart to collect itself in order to prepare for the encounter with Jesus,” he said, adding that “silence is so important.”


The general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation expired on March 13.

While the general dispensation is removed, there are specific instances where the dispensation will continue, as well as those circumstances where there is no obligation in the first place. One does **not** have an obligation to attend Mass on Sunday **in the following circumstances:**

1. You are ill or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness (i.e., you have underlying conditions or are in a high-risk category). Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
2. You exhibit flu-like symptoms. Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
3. You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g., you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID or influenza). Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
4. You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed.
5. You are pregnant.
6. Those 65 years of age or older (per the CDC's recommendation of high-risk individuals).
7. You cannot attend Mass *through no fault of your own* (e.g., no Mass is offered, you are infirmed, or, while wanting to go, you are prevented for some reason you cannot control (e.g., your ride did not show up, the church was at capacity).
8. If you have *significant* fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

Now that the general dispensation from attending Mass has been lifted we will no longer be offering the Communion Service on Sundays.

- Daily Mass on Mondays, Tuesdays, & Wednesdays in the Daily Mass Chapel. On Monday evenings, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 5:15 pm, the Rosary will be prayed at 5:30 pm and Mass will be celebrated at 6:00 pm. On Tuesday & Wednesday mornings, the Rosary will be prayed at 8:00 am, and Mass will be celebrated at 8:30 am. Weekend Masses are on Saturday at 5 pm and Sunday at 9 am (livestream) and 11 am.




