From the Pastor's Desk:

On Thursday, July 22, the Church celebrates the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene, the most prominent woman, other than Mary, the Mother of Jesus, in the New Testament. Her 'last' name comes from the town of Magdala in Galilee, her hometown. Scripture introduces her as a woman "who had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities: Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out" (Lk. 8:2).

The New Testament indicates that Mary Magdalene was a follower of Christ, who accompanied him (Lk. 8:2-3) and participated in his ministry. Mary Magdalene was one of the many "who were assisting them [Jesus and the Twelve] out of their means." This probably was an indication that she was a prominent woman of wealth, since it seems she helped to support Jesus' ministry financially.

After all had deserted Jesus at the crucifixion, she was one of those who stood by the cross of Jesus with his mother. And, of all the "official" witnesses who might have been chosen to announce the Resurrection, she was the one to whom that privilege was given. She is known as the "Apostle to the Apostles."

Mary Magdalene has been the subject of many studies among scholars in recent times. She had been mistakenly identified as the unnamed prostitute in chapter 7 of Luke's Gospel at the time of the sixth century. But many scholars now recognize her as a leader in the earliest days of the church. On June 10, 2016, the liturgical celebration honoring St. Mary Magdalene was raised from a memorial to a full feast, putting her on par with the apostles' liturgical celebrations.

Mary's life of faith, commitment and leadership is an example for all of us in the twenty-first century. If you are available this Thursday morning, July 22nd, please join us for the 9 AM Mass, as we celebrate and remember her faith-filled life of devotion to the Lord and seek to follow her example.


