IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER

Tax Advantaged Ways to Give to Our Parish

Parishioners may consider these two tax-advantaged ways to make charitable gifts to our parish at the year end.

Gifts of Appreciated Securities

Gifts of appreciated securities continue to be beneficial for donors since they offer significant tax advantages including income tax deductions and avoidance of tax on capital gains if the donor were to sell highly appreciated the securities. Through a gift of appreciated securities to benefit our parish, including to the Catholic Services Appeal, parishioners who itemize may receive an income tax deduction up to the full market value of the securities and can also avoid capital gains tax on the appreciation. In essence, you may save twice - on income tax and capital gains tax.

IRA Rollover --

Qualified Charitable Distribution

The IRA qualified charitable distribution (QCD) provides a way for donors 70 1/2 and older to receive a tax benefit for their generosity. It is beneficial because the QCD will not be included in adjusted gross income and is therefore not subject to tax. This is now more beneficial in view of the increased standard deduction in the new tax law. A donor can make a QCD of up to \$100,000 annually directly from the IRA to a charity, and as an added benefit, if the donor is age 72, the QCD required satisfies the donor's minimum distribution. Parishioners 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ or older should consult with their IRA administrator for the procedure to make a QCD to our parish.

God loves a cheerful giver. Thank you to all those who gave food, gifts and gift cards. We were able to help 40 local families through our SVDP ministry! We also want to thank those who gave so generously last week in our top hats. (We have top hats on the second and fourth Sunday of every month.) Thank you to those who give online and through the collection box. We continue to make home visits.

We recently helped a Canton woman who was embarrassed to ask for help. She has always worked and has one middle school child left to raise. Age is taking a toll on her body and she hurt her back lifting heavy boxes. She reluctantly went on medical leave. She came to realize she could no longer do this type of work. She is transitioning to find a desk job. The new job should be starting soon, but she has that gap with no pay check. This woman. along with many of the working poor we serve, live paycheck-to-paycheck. We were able to help her with part of this months rent and some food and Christmas help for her daughter. She was so embarrassed to ask for help, yet so GRATEFUL we were there for her and her daughter. We were able to visit her in her home and pray with her which made her feel people do care.

We are the visible hands and feet of Jesus to the people around us. And they'll know we are Christians by our love.
