HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known, Lived, & Shared

I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)

On November 22, 2020, the fourth anniversary of Synod 16, Archbishop Vigneron wrote a Pastoral Note on Families of Parishes: *Led by the Spirit on Mission*. In the following weeks we will view and pray with excerpts from that Note.

LISTEN to the Archbishop: At the end of the Gospel of Matthew, we see the final earthly exchange between Jesus and his Apostles: (Mt. 28:16-20). . . Like them, we too have been asked to unite and go on mission together in Families of Parishes, enhancing each other’s strengths and working collaboratively to unleash the Gospel around us. . . *“When they saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted”* (Mt. 28:17). . . Even though they worship Him, there is something they still lack. . . We do not know why they doubted, but we know they have not yet received the Holy Spirit who will fill them with all knowledge from on high (Lk 24:49). . . Doubt is the gateway to **bad habits**. We must reject these bad habits and commit to rooting them out. (These bad habits will be discussed in the following weeks.)

NOTE ON FAMILIES OF PARISHES: *LED BY THE SPIRIT ON MISSION*, PG 1-2

PRAY: *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you’ll remember to pray it throughout the week*

Come, Holy Spirit, to Sacred Heart Church and to our new Family of Parishes. Unite us with our sister parishes, St. Damien, St. Hugo, and St. Thomas More, as we work collaboratively to unleash the Gospel. Pour out your Spirit on us as a new Pentecost so that we may worship but not doubt. Fill us with “all knowledge from on high” in order to faithfully do Your work without doubt. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love as we always “worship, but do not doubt.” Amen!

ACT: What is this Note saying to **me**? As we journey forward to implement the Families of Parishes initiative with our (now literally) sister parishes, we each must ask the Holy Spirit to show **me** how to cooperate with the graces given **me**. Do I “worship without doubt”? Are my heart and mind open to receive the “knowledge from on high” that God wants to give us? Pray every day this week for that.

Saint OF THE WEEK

JANUARY 5 | SAINT PAUL THE HERMIT

On January 15, it is the feast day of St. Paul the Hermit. He is regarded as the first Christian hermit,

who was claimed to have lived alone in the desert of Egypt from the age of sixteen to the age of one hundred and thirteen years old. Born in Lower The baid, Egypt, he was left an orphan at about the age of fifteen and hid during the persecution of the Church under Emperor Trajanus Decius. At the age of twenty-two he went to the desert to circumvent a planned effort by his brother in law to report him to authorities as a Christian and thereby gain control of his property. Paul soon found that the eremitical life was much to his personal taste, and so remained in a desert cave. He lived in the mountains of this desert in a cave near a clear spring and a palm tree, the leaves of which provided him with clothing and the fruit of which provided him with his only source of food until he was 43 years old, when a raven started bringing him half a loaf of bread daily.


Paul of Thebes is known to posterity because around the year 342, Anthony the Great was told in a dream about the older hermit’s existence and went to find him. Jerome related that Anthony the Great and Paul met when the latter was aged 113. They conversed with each other for one day and one night. The Synaxarium shows each saint inviting the other to bless and break the bread, as a token of honor. Paul held one side, putting the other side into the hands of Father Anthony, and soon the bread broke through the middle and each took his part. When Anthony next visited him, Paul was dead. Anthony clothed him in a tunic which was a present from Athanasius of Alexandria and buried him, with two lions helping to dig the grave.

Father Anthony returned to his monastery taking with him the robe woven with palm leaf. He honored the robe so much that he only wore it twice a year: at the Feast of Easter, and at the Pentecost. St. Paul the Hermit is the patron saint of Diocese in San Pablo, Laguna, Philippines.

6 HABITS OF HIGHLY EFFECTIVE DISCIPLES *by Patrick Howard*

Are you a better disciple today than you were a year ago? It's a great time of year to review what we need to change and improve in our lives. To be a better follower of Jesus, we should be practicing the habits of good discipleship.

Jesus should be at the center of our lives. Take the time in prayer to discuss this with Jesus: Who is he to you? Is he at the center of your life? Do you prioritize time with him? Look at this honestly with Jesus, he is not harshly judging you for imperfections, he wants to draw you closer to him. Recognize where growth is needed and pick what qualities of discipleship you will focus on this year to develop these good habits.

Sacramental Life

Christ instituted his Church and the sacraments as pure channels of his sanctifying grace. This is the lifeblood of a disciple. A disciple makes it a habit to regularly and reverently participate in the sacraments. If you are able, are you attending Mass on Sundays and more often if possible? Do you prepare yourself in prayer before Mass to receive the Eucharist? If you are not able to attend, are you keeping the Lord's day holy and making spiritual communions? Do you go to confession regularly? Jesus is waiting for us in the confessional with special sacramental graces of his mercy to purify us so we can give and receive love more and more perfectly. We might not realize how heavy a burden we are carrying in our hearts until we have been freed of the burden through the sacrament of confession.

Prayer

Prayer is essential for communicating with God and developing that personal relationship with him. We can pray vocal prayers like the Our Father, the rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, etc, but we should also be spending time in silence, becoming aware of God's presence and listening to him. We should share with him all our hopes, worries, joys and fears and then let him love us, calm our hearts and direct us. Set a routine of prayer each day and then allow God to bring you closer to him.

Scripture

As disciples, a very important habit to develop is spending time with the word of God. We should set aside a few minutes each day to read Scripture. This can be part of our prayer. The Word of God is living, the Holy Spirit breathes in and out of the words of Scripture. As a disciple of Jesus Christ, who is the Word of God, we need to be immersed in the Word so that we come to know who he is, how he wants us to live and what he wants us to do. Join the Archdiocesan Scripture Challenge with reading plans to guide you through a year of reading the Scriptures.

Community

Another essential habit of discipleship is to be connected to community. We are not saved as individuals but as members of the body of Christ, and we know where two or three are gathered, there Jesus

is in the midst of them. We are made for community. God offers us the gift of holy friendship with each other so that we might encourage each other. One of the best ways to connect with a community of disciples is to participate in a small group. These are simple gatherings of a few people to share faith, and reflect on Scripture together through regular meetings. It's easy to participate or even lead a small group. You might want to invite friends or family to come together for this purpose by joining or leading a small group.

Evangelization

As disciples we are called to bear fruit. God has a mission for each one of us to be witnesses to the love and truth of Jesus Christ. Who is God calling you to love in your life? Who is he calling you to witness to? We should desire that others experience the love, joy and freedom of the life of true discipleship. Ask God for that desire if you don't think you have it. God will present opportunities to share the love and truth of Jesus Christ, and practicing the other habits of discipleship will prepare us to be channels of God's grace to others.

Obedience to Christ through the Church

Finally, a habit essential to discipleship is to practice obedience to Christ. Jesus said, "He who has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me; and he who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him." (Jn 14:21) We will experience true freedom through living a life that is in line with the truth. God has revealed the truth about how he has created us to live. These truths are expressed clearly in the moral teachings of the Church. We must do our best to walk in obedience to the truth Jesus has revealed through his Church. We must ask him to help us remain faithful to him, resist temptation, develop virtues, be faithful to our vocations and live in accordance with love and truth.

Take this opportunity to choose habits of discipleship that you want to practice this year, so that a year from today, you can look back and see how Jesus has drawn you closer to him through your active participation in the gifts of grace he offers you.
