

## Reflect

AND RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

### FIRST READING:

In the immediate aftermath of Jesus' ascension, and as a means for healing within the group, Peter and the apostles discerned Matthias as the replacement for Judas. **What are some areas in your faith life that need healing in order to feel whole?**

### SECOND READING:

John testifies that his community has “come to know and to believe in the love God has for us.” **Do you think your faith community shares a similar conviction of faith in the love of God?**

### GOSPEL:

We hear Jesus' prayer to his Father for the protection of the disciples, especially against “the evil one” in the world. **Where do you personally experience evil in the world today?** ©LPi



## LEARNING MORE ABOUT FAMILY OF PARISHES

### How will this affect the lives of parishioners?

Parishioners will become part of a larger faith family, working together and leveraging resources in pursuit of our mission to unleash the Gospel. They will still be part of their own parish communities unless their own discernment suggests otherwise. They will worship alongside and work with other members of their new Family. They will be ministered to by multiple priests from all parishes in the Family and in many cases access to the Sacraments will be increased. They will share best practices and benefit from competent and improved lay leadership of the various ministries managed through the Family structure.

### How will this affect the lives of priests?

A number of priests will share the work of caring for each Family of Parishes. These priests will be able to leverage their charisms and strengths in the work that they do and will find themselves supported by a talented and trained lay staff and, in many cases, one or more deacons. Those priests serving as pastors of Families of Parishes will be responsible for administration. All priests, regardless of their role within the Family of Parishes, will have more time to engage in the work of ministering to the people of God.

While all the priests assigned to a Family of Parishes are welcome to live a communal life, this is not a requirement.

As members of Families of Parishes, at-risk and aging priests will be able to continue in ministry in ways that protect their health while still making valuable contributions to the parishes. They will no longer shoulder the burden of choosing between retirement or handling all aspects of running their parish communities.



# HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known, Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

On November 22, 2020, Archbishop Vigneron wrote a Pastoral Note on Families of Parishes: Led by the Spirit on Mission.

**LISTEN to the Archbishop:** Each Family of Parishes will have a Mission Support Director who will oversee those ministering “behind the scenes” in support of the mission. This position will report to the lead Pastor or Moderator of the Family. Priests and other staff [Mission Direct] will be more able to commit themselves whole-heartedly to the work of mission direct ministries and evangelization efforts. As we begin this transition in our Families in the months ahead, we will need to pray especially for the spirit of collaboration. Change, especially change in one’s work, can present stress, doubt, and uncertainty about the future. I ask each of you to pray for a new openness to this renewal and collaboration, knowing that God is particularly generous when we pray for graces to better evangelize.

**PRAY: Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you’ll remember to pray it throughout the week**

# Saint OF THE WEEK

MAY 17 | SAINT PASCHAL BAYLON

May 17 is the feast day of St. Paschal Baylon. Paschal Baylon (named after the day of his birth and death: Pentecost Sunday—Pascha Pentekostes) was a simple, pious shepherd boy who later became an ardent spiritual son of St. Francis and the heavenly patron of adorers of the Most Blessed Sacrament. He belongs to that illustrious circle of saints who, by heroic holiness of life, refurbished the Church's crown that had been desecrated by the heretics of the sixteenth century. He hailed from the Spanish section of Valencia and died at the age of 52. As he lay dead upon the bier, he opened and closed his eyes twice when the sacred species were elevated at the consecration. Leo XIII declared him the heavenly patron of all Eucharistic leagues and societies.

One day Paschal heard the bells of a convent announce the approaching consecration at Mass. Such an ardent longing for God overcame him that, prompted by yearning and love, he involuntarily cried out: "O God, most worthy of all adoration, please let me see You!" Hardly had he uttered the prayer when a glowing star appeared in the sky. As he watched, the heavens opened; the star disappeared and was replaced by a chalice with the Host, flanked by two adoring angels. Christian art has selected this vision to show his chief virtue, love for the most holy Eucharist. He is the patron saint of cooks, Eucharistic congresses, and organizations, and Obado, Bulacan, Philippines.



**The fruitfulness of evangelization depends upon the graces called down through intercession.**

**As we celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord, let us pray:**

- ~ For Archbishop Vigneron, the Auxiliary bishops, and the Curia staff, that the Risen and Ascended Jesus would inspire, heal, and protect them as they lead the Archdiocese of Detroit and serve the people of God.
- ~ For those who received their First Holy Communion—in our parish several weeks ago and all those receiving it this spring—will encounter Jesus in a powerful way through their continued reception of the Eucharist, and be witnesses of His love and joy to their friends and families.
- ~ For those suffering from physical, spiritual, or emotional illnesses, that God would heal their hearts and bring them comfort.
- ~ May the Ascension of our Lord give us the confident expectation that, as at the first Pentecost, He will send us a new Pentecost as we Unleash the Gospel in the Archdiocese of Detroit.

**We ask all this in the Name of the Father, the Son & the Holy Spirit (Sign of the Cross). Amen.**

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

God remains where love remains. When a believer realizes without doubt that God is love, it is a powerful moment. Being able to place our resurrection trust in this fundamental truth allows us to experience God's presence in all of our experiences: the good and the bad, positive and negative, life enriching and destructive events we encounter. It is no wonder that St. Paul so accurately tells us that it is love that endures all things and lasts. How can

God not endure or ever fade away? Because he is God, Jesus also guarded and protected his disciples as the endearing shepherd who always had their best interest at heart.

If we become too immersed in the world, we lose touch with these deeper realities. We can become so preoccupied with preserving what we have created or think that we need, forgetting that it is not building our city that

really matters, but God's. Jesus clearly did not belong to the world and, by virtue of his resurrection, he tries to get us to understand that we do not either. The truth brings us to other worldly, more divine places and takes our eyes off of the concerns that often captivate our fears and storm our senses.

Life can easily erode our faith. Think of your life over the last couple of weeks. What challenged your faith and distracted your divine glance? Even being overly stimulated with technology and social media can erode our sense of confidence and cause us to forget who we really are. We need to distance ourselves from the world in order to experience the joy that Christ offers. The world will never like the word of God. It is too challenging and too perplexing. The world mistakenly believes that it can survive on its own. It is a mistaken judgment that may cost people a lot in the end. It is all so very simple: God remains when we love one another. If in all the business of our lives and all that each day brings, the good and the bad, we follow the call and path of love, we will walk with God. There is nothing to fear and anxiety finds no home.

### ABOUT LECTIO DIVINA:

*Lectio Divina is a form of meditation rooted in liturgical celebration that dates back to early monastic communities. It was a method practiced by monks in their daily encounter with Scripture, both as they prepared for the Eucharist and as they prayed the Liturgy of the Hours. The Latin phrase "lectio divina" may be translated as "divine reading." Lectio divina is a method for praying with the Scriptures. As one reads and invites the Word to become a transforming lens that brings the events of daily living into focus, one can come to live more deeply and find the presence of God more readily in the events of each day. The method of lectio divina follows four steps: lectio (reading), meditatio (meditation), contemplatio (contemplation), and oratio (prayer).*


**TO KEEPING YOURSELF & OTHERS HEALTHY!**
