Paul sees the Holy Spirit as integral to our identity as "children of God" and "joint heirs with Christ." **How do you sense our Triune God at work in your life?**


### GOSPEL:

On November 22, 2020, Archbishop Vigneron wrote a Pastoral Note on *Families of Parishes: Led by the Spirit on Mission*.

**LISTEN to the Archbishop:** Each Family's Missionary Strategic Plan will look to Unleash the Gospel for inspiration—taking up the heart of Foundational Conviction ["AOD resolved to obey the Holy Spirit and be made by Him a band of joyful missionary disciples"], addressing the Roots of the Crisis ["God disappearing from the human horizon... false religions or belief systems based on profoundly misguided assumptions"], and seeking to fulfill the parish and family-level Action Steps outlined in the pastoral letter [read the full letter at [unleashthegospel.org](http://unleashthegospel.org)]. While some details are still in development, we can be confident that God will use them to mold us into a more missionary diocese. We may be intimidated by this work, but we should fear not; Jesus is with us! There is nothing good that you or I could dream of accomplishing which Jesus does not already want more ardently for us.


**PRAY: Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week**

**Saint** OF THE WEEK  
**MAY 31 | SAINT PETRONILLA**



On May 31, it is the feast day of St. Petronilla. It is probable that Aurelia Petronilla was of the imperial family of the Flavii. The early traditions of the Church speak of her as being the spiritual daughter of the Prince of the Apostles; and though she did not, like Domitilla, lay

down her life for the faith, she did offer to Jesus that next richest gift, her virginity. The same venerable authorities tell us also that a Roman Patrician, by name Flaccus, having asked her in marriage, she requested three days for consideration, during which she confidently besought the aid of her divine Spouse. Flaccus presented himself on the third day, but found the palace in mourning, and her family busy in preparing the funeral obsequies of the young virgin, who had taken her flight to heaven, as a dove that is startled by an intruder's approach.

In the eighth century, the holy Pope Paul I had the body of Petronilla taken from the cemetery of Domitilla, on the Ardeatine Way. Her relics were found in a marble sarcophagus, the lid of which was adorned, at each corner, with a dolphin. The Pope had them enshrined in a little church, which he built near the south side of the Vatican Basilica. This church was destroyed in the sixteenth century, in consequence of the alterations needed for the building of the new Basilica of St Peter; and the relics of St Petronilla were translated to one of its altars on the west side. It was but just that she should await her glorious resurrection under the shadow of the great Apostle who had initiated her in the faith and prepared her for her eternal nuptials with the Lamb.

Thy triumph, O Petronilla, is one of our Easter joys. We lovingly venerate thy blessed memory. Thou didst disdain the pleasures and honors of the world, and thy virginal name is one of the first on the list of the Church of Rome, which was thy mother. Aid her now by thy prayers. Protect those who seek thine intercession, and teach us how to celebrate, with holy enthusiasm, the solemnities that are soon to gladden us. She is the patron saint against fever and of dauphins of France, mountain travelers, and treaties between Popes and Frankish emperors.



## WHAT ARE CHARISMS AND WHY SHOULD I KNOW MINE

'Charis' is the root of the word "charism" and so it means grace, or a free gift, and we recognize that charisms are free gifts of the Holy Spirit to help us live out our mission in the Church.

Each of us individually has a special gift or talent that we're given to build up the body of Christ, and so as the disciples are sent forth in the Acts of the Apostles to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ risen from the dead, they go forth under the power and inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

Some of us might have a charism of evangelization, some of us charisms of teaching. Whatever it might be, the Holy Spirit desires to use us.

## LEARNING MORE ABOUT FAMILY OF PARISHES

### How will this affect parish staffs?

As parishes come together to form Families of Parishes, they will begin to discuss the practical ways in which the clergy and staff will interact within the Family, as well as finalize the new leadership structure, including items such as leadership teams, key staff mission, and operations staff positions. During this process, some parishes may lose some staff members (e.g., if a Family of Parishes opts to share one bookkeeper instead of having each parish maintain its own). At the same time, some Families will be able to add positions that better serve the mission going forward. In addition, we expect that natural attrition (e.g. through retirements and normal staff turnover) over the next few years may assist the parishes' efforts to further consolidate their staffs.

These and other staffing decisions will be left to the discernment of each Family of Parishes, led by parish leadership and with assistance, as needed, from the Archdiocese of Detroit Curia. All decisions will be guided by a complete focus on mission and the best interest of the entire Family of Parishes. This process will be rooted in prayer, will be respectful of building and maintaining relationships, and will be marked by quick and honest responses to questions and concerns that are raised.

## LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

The immensity, scope, intimacy, and pervasiveness of God's presence is too intense for the human mind. We often limit God by our expectations of Him and have a hard time just letting God be God. Some people all too easily lose faith because God does not meet their expectations. Worse still, the idea of faith is rejected altogether by others because of polarities and experiences they have that don't square with who they need God to be. The Holy Trinity is one of those teachings that is best encountered rather than dissected. It is only through being present with the Trinity that we can experience both the immensity and otherness of God's presence as well as the intimacy of the God who wants us to call Him "dad." We feel the loving guidance of a God who wants to take us from fear and give us confidence. Our God of yesterday, today, and tomorrow is a God of all ages whose three-fold Presence invades all senses, seasons, and times. God, who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is much more than any of our expectations if we simply let God be who God is. ©LPI





We are cautioned to be especially careful during the Coronavirus outbreak. Here are some simple ways to keep sickness away.




**WASH YOUR HANDS**
