

Get to Know Father Joe

Born in Manhattan on September 1, 1940, Father Joseph (Father Joe) A. Grimaldi grew up in the Bronx. After finishing grade school at Holy Rosary and high school at All Hallows High, he became interested in joining the Christian Brothers of Ireland who taught at that school. His formation included Novitiate on the Hudson (Santa Maria), Scholasticate in New Jersey (Lakewood) and graduation from Iona College in New Rochelle, New York.



He received his first teaching assignment in 1962 going to Brother Rice High School in Birmingham, Michigan where he taught Religion, English, French and Latin. After 11 years at Brother Rice as teacher and administrator, he was sent to Saint Lawrence High School in Chicago for a short (six months) preparation to take on the principal's job at Damien High School in Honolulu, Hawaii. Meanwhile, in his spare time and during the summers he received a Masters in French at Assumption in Worcester, MA and MSA in administration at Notre Dame du Lac in South Bend.

After finishing his term as principal of Brother Rice High School in 1986, he began his priestly studies at Catholic University of America where he earned a MA in Theology. He was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Honolulu on August 4, 1990 and after five years as pastor at Saint John Vianney Parish in Kailua he was sent to the Angelicum in Rome to study Canon Law with the Dominicans. Upon receiving his JCL in Rome, he returned to Honolulu in 1998 and was appointed both Judicial Vicar and Vicar General for the Diocese of Honolulu.

In the year 2007, he started "exploring" the central coast of California and served as a Chaplain at Dominican Hospital in Santa Cruz for about six months. In 2007, the Bishop of Monterey appointed him pastor of Holy Eucharist Parish in Corralitos, California and postulator for the cause of Cora Evans for canonization.

In 2011, he was already 71 and so began his part-time retirement, helping at different churches and working as the Defender of the Bond for annulment cases in the Military Archdiocese.

He returned to Michigan in 2014 and has most recently served as senior priest at St. Hugo of the Hills, and as Chaplain at Brother Rice. He also serves as a trustee for the Brother Rice Endowment Fund.

Now, at 81, he continues his ministry here at Sacred Heart Church as our pastor. Along with all of his duties as our parish priest, he even does a podcast. Make sure to check it out at thefatherjoepodcast.com.

PRAY: Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week

*Come, Holy Spirit, Lord of the Gifts, to Sacred Heart Church and to our Family's Parishes; Open our minds and hearts to hear your voice and feel your direction. Reveal to each of us the special and particular gifts (Charisms) You have given to us to use for others. Provide opportunities to test and discern whether one might have the **Charism of GIVING**. Reveal to them how You want them to use any of the Charisms you've given, and give them the desire and will to do it. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in each of us the fire of Your love as we discern and use the Charism Group you have given. Amen!*

ASK & ACT: What is this note saying to **me**? Do I find it a source of joy and spiritual fulfillment to give to those in need? Do I make sacrifices in order to be able to give more to others in need? Have people told me they are surprised by how much I give away? Do I feel called to personally provide material resources for Kingdom purposes, knowing that God will take care of me? Are people close to me sometimes uncomfortable with how much I give away? I will **pray** over these questions, asking God to lead me in discernment of whether (or not) He has given me the **Charism of GIVING**, and ask for the desire and will to know how I might use any of my charism group in our parish or my community. "No Bystanders!"



Saint OF THE WEEK

OCTOBER 21 | SAINTS URSULA AND COMPANIONS

On October 21, it is the feast day of Sts. Ursula and Companions. According to a legend that appeared in the tenth century, Ursula was the daughter of a Christian King in Britain and was granted a three-year postponement of a marriage she did not wish to a pagan prince. With ten ladies in waiting, each attended by a thousand maidens, she embarked on a voyage across the North Sea, sailed up the Rhine to Basle, Switzerland, and then went to Rome. On their way back they were all massacred by pagan Huns at Cologne in about 451 when Ursula refused to marry their chieftain.

According to another legend, America was settled by British colonizers and soldiers after Emperor Magnus Clemens Maximus conquered Britain and Gaul in 383. The ruler of the settlers, Cynan Meiriadog, called on King Dionotus of Cornwall for wives for the settlers, whereupon Dionotus sent his daughter Ursula, who was to marry Cynan, with eleven thousand noble maidens and sixty thousand common women. Their fleet was shipwrecked, and all the women were enslaved or murdered.

The legends are pious fictions, but what is true is that one Clematus, a senator, rebuilt a basilica in Cologne that had originally been built, probably at the beginning of the fourth century, to honor a group of virgins who had been martyred at Cologne. They were evidently venerated enough to have had a church built in their honor, but who they were and how many of them there are unknown. From these meager facts, the legend of Ursula grew and developed. St. Ursula is the namesake for the Ursuline Order, founded for the education of young Catholic girls and women. She is the patron saint of Catholic education (especially of girls), Cologne, Germany, educators, students, and teachers.

LIVING THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week

It's the positions of power and great authority that people often admire. We equate success with six figure incomes, high positions, management, and influence. We even go above and beyond to find favor with our bosses so that we can get a little extra recognition and maybe the next promotion when it comes up. This is the way of the world. Those who have their values set on earthly things are going to work by earthly rules. We forget that it doesn't work that way in the Kingdom of God. Success is measured not from the place of status, influence, or prestige but from the place of humility, service, and sacrifice. The authority that one hopes to achieve is not an authority over others but an authority that comes from wisdom and developing one's relationship with God. Jesus flips the tables on our priorities. Even the first disciples had a tough time understanding this. They really thought that they would somehow receive a privilege or bonus from being faithful. 


