

A EUCHARISTIC ENCOUNTER (continued)

Everyone is invited to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. This invitation entails much more than just knowing **about Jesus** in the Eucharist. It even entails more than just believing in his Real Presence in the Eucharist. This invitation entails genuinely **knowing** Jesus in the Eucharist. We need to ask ourselves if our faith rests solely in our heads, or if it has sunk down into our hearts and out into our hands and feet. Our faith is not one of mere beliefs and values. *Apostolic Exhortation on the "Sacrament of Charity", the Holy Eucharist,
by Pope Benedict XVI*

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The work of "Christus Totus": . . . We can recall an evocative phrase of St. Augustine . . . the great Bishop of Hippo, speaking specifically of the eucharistic mystery, stresses the fact that Christ assimilates us to himself: "The bread you see on the altar, sanctified by the word of God, is the body of Christ. The chalice, or rather what the chalice contains, sanctified by the word of God, is the blood of Christ. In these signs, Christ the Lord willed to entrust to us his body and the blood which he shed for the forgiveness of our sins. If you have received them properly, you yourselves become Christ himself."

Sacramentum Caritatis 36

PRAY: Throughout the week... LORD Jesus, enlarge my little human mind to grasp the generosity, humility and love of Christ that He willed to include this fallen humanity in His glorious work! Give us a sense of wonder and obedience to recognize that He has "entrusted his body, and the very same blood which he shed for the forgiveness of our sins," to us! Enable me to be worthy of so great a sacrifice and honor. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to me? How long have I repeated the Creed and spoken theological truths without REALLY understanding what is happening at Mass in the "eucharistic mystery"? St. Augustine's words are like a gut-punch: "The bread you SEE on the altar . . . the chalice, or rather what the chalice contains, . . . IS the blood of Christ." In His wisdom, we worship an incarnational God—He does things that we can see and feel, so to better understand the spiritual meaning behind the physical signs. He "willed to entrust to US" the very body and blood that HE willed to sacrifice for the forgiveness of OUR sins! And then the clincher—"If you have received them properly, YOU yourselves become Christ himself!!! O Lord, I pray, with thanksgiving, that by Your Grace, I may be made worthy to receive You!

Who Sits at Christ's Left Hand?

A recent daily Gospel was the episode when the mother of James and John petitioned Jesus to sit her sons at his right and at his left in his kingdom, positions of honor, symbolic of authority and power (Matt 20:20-28). Jesus said those seats are "for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father." We know from our Creed that Jesus "is seated at the right hand of the Father," but no teaching says who sits at the Father's left. In part, this "seating arrangement" is embroiled in the mystery of the Trinity, because Jesus said "the Father and I are one" (John 10:30). But the question provoked by the mother's bold request is: "Who, known only to the Father, sits beside Jesus?" There is no clear answer to that mystery.

The buildingcatholicculture.com website offers a relevant reflection by examining the long tradition of great Christian art, East and West, depicting Jesus, King of the Universe, enthroned in heaven. The earliest images, frescos in catacombs and mosaics in the oldest churches in Rome, show Peter and Paul flanking Jesus. Sometimes John the Evangelist and St. Michael the Archangel are there. Mary has several titles positioning her as Queen of Heaven and, as Queen Mother, her rightful place would be sitting at the King's right hand. A prime example showing this arrangement is a fresco in the Hagia Sophia in Constantinople. That image, and many others like it, such as the Van Eyck Ghent Altarpiece, show St. John the Baptist at Christ's left.

In the late Medieval and Renaissance periods, showing a favored saint or two, or even a reigning pope, or the artist's patron near Jesus was popular. It may be more common to see Christ the King surrounded by hosts of angels or rank upon rank of saints. The humbling question for us is how might we come to be counted in that number, at neither the right hand nor left but present. Not as some sought-after honor, but as the received gift of divine mercy. The answer Jesus provided his disciples was to imitate him in a life of service. He said, "... whoever wishes to be great among you shall be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you shall be your slave. Just so, the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."



hard I find it to get to confession —

remember. I whine about it so frequently
that it's hard to tell if I've made it the
subject of a written piece or if it is simply
an oft-recited refrain from the Litany of Colleen's Perpetual Complaints.

During the week, it's tough to get to confession because I have little kids who are
attached to me like Velcro, and I don't need them listening in on (and eventually
repeating to everyone) my sins. On the weekend it's a little easier, but our parish
doesn't offer it before or after Sunday Mass, just on Saturdays. Saturday is when I




The Violinist: Stories of Solanus Casey



Holy Hour

A holy hour is the practice of spending one hour's time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, praying and meditating on the agony of Jesus Christ. More broadly, a holy hour can also refer to any 60 minutes set aside in prayer and reflection, whether in church or elsewhere.

The holy hour devotion dates to the late 17th century, when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque received visions of Jesus Christ. In these visions, the Lord requested that St. Margaret Mary spend one hour every Thursday evening lying prostrate and meditating upon his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. This practice calls back to the Gospel of Matthew, which tells of Jesus' desire for the disciples to "remain here and keep watch with me" (Matthew 26:38) as he awaited his passion.

Holy hours can be made privately or in community, and the USCCB has created a variety of different holy hour formats that can be found at usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/prayers-and-devotions/eucharistic-devotion.


