“IF WE BELIEVE”

Writing an article for the Reporter is not always an easy endeavor for me. Writing an article for Christmas is even more daunting. The last couple of days, prior to my writing, I prayed to the Lord asking him to “inspire” me to write something meaningful. More importantly, to have words that God desires me to write for you.

One early morning, as I was getting ready for the day I decided to listen to Christmas music. The song “Believe” from the movie the Polar Express came over the airwaves. It was the first time I heard the song this season. I really like the song because it elicits emotions of inspiration and hope. I then began my holy hour of prayer pondering what I believe, what we believe about Christmas.

I was not convinced that writing about a song from a movie was the way to go. I was powering up my laptop when Fr. Colin handed me a bag that was left by the rectory door. It was not the contents, but the bag that caught my eye. It was a shopping bag produced many years ago by Marshall Field. On the bag in bold white cursive lettering was the word “Believe.” I shook my head in disbelief and smiled. Only God in His humor could pull off such a stunt. The message was clear to me. Write about what we believe.

In the movie the Polar Express (and excuse me for all of you who actually know the plot of the movie) the main character, a boy, doesn’t believe in Christmas. Skepticism, doubt, confusion and a lack of wonder and awe had left his heart. And he is only ten years old! He embarks on a journey, a magical train ride to the North Pole to see Santa. He doesn’t believe. On his journey he encounters situations and other characters who also have struggles and heartache. He also encounters people with conviction, determination and great hope. He interacts with the conductor who desires to teach him and help him to embrace the gift of belief.

What do we believe? Who do we believe in? Is there skepticism, doubt, disappointment in our hearts? With everything being scaled down and families not gathering do we believe that the Incarnation occurred? Do we believe Jesus Christ was born to lift us out of disbelief? That Mary and Joseph are not just characters in a story teaching us a lesson but were actually real people who responded to the message of angels?

A couple of weeks ago I had the honor and privilege of baptizing my great niece. We gathered in Church, all socially distanced, to witness Charlotte Grace becoming a member of the Catholic Church and being configured to the life of Jesus Christ. When the baptism was finished, I watched from the Gathering Space as my family walked to their respective cars and went their separate ways. I felt sad. I had a tear in my eye. It was strange. No party to celebrate. It was all over.

I shook the disbelief off my shoulders. It wasn’t over. I believe that the power of the Sacrament (the sacredness of the event and how it made Charlotte holy) is real. I felt the joy in the

family that Charlotte was now safe in the bosom of Jesus, with Mary and Joseph by her side. The further celebration of a meal and being together wasn’t there, however, what truly mattered was our faith. We believe in the power of Jesus and why He came; to give us the Sacraments, to help us to become holy and the saints of tomorrow. We celebrate Christmas. The Sacrament of Christ present at Mass.

Charlotte has no idea that we are living in a pandemic. She doesn’t know that people are sick, suffering, and struggling. She doesn’t know that people are dying and have died. She doesn’t know life is different. I believe she does know that she is loved immensely by her parents and by all of us who were there. She didn’t know we had masks on and were socially distanced. It didn’t matter. And “Uncle Jim” was able to hold her for a precious moment. She was so tiny. She seemed so fragile it made me nervous. She reminded me that Jesus was little as well. Jesus, though an infant, is “God-hero”, “Wonder-Counselor”. Jesus makes me nervous with his might to conquer the world. If we believe, we can allow his love to penetrate our skeptical hearts and fill us with His wonder and love.

Do we believe that the wonder and awe of Christmas is still a reality despite the conditions in which we live? I do. I believe, if we have hope in Jesus, our faith will see us through. “If only we believe.” Do we believe Jesus can work through the mysterious virus and bring us together in wonder and awe? I do! Just look at the pages to follow. They are filled with God’s blessings on St. Paul parish during this pandemic. It is unbelievable!

Do we believe that God has us in his hand? That He came forth to us as a lowly, poor child, to help us see that life isn’t about politics, finance, power, prestige or whatever may be plaguing our hearts with unbelief and doubt? Do we believe that what really matters amidst the tears, the sadness, the joy and the heartache that Jesus loves us so much and that He will see us through – in life and in death – to a light that dispels the darkest darkness? I do believe.

In the movie, the first gift of Christmas, Santa gives to a worthy child anything of their choice. The boy chose the gift “to believe”. We need to choose the gift of believing that Jesus Christ is the gift of Christmas and what we receive from Him, is our choice. If only we ask. If only we believe!

I pray you believe in all that God promised to us through the angels about a boy born in a manger.




A Prayer for Children

Protocols in place to provide a safe place to worship resulting in a continued increase of attendance for Mass and prayer.





A virtual parish mission: COVID19 Override brought by our priests and two in-house seminarians to help people continue to move forward in confidence in Christ.





The welcoming of Fr. Colin Fricke, newly ordained into the priesthood to add to our beloved group of clergy members.









A weekly Walking Rosary prayed around our campus for the intentions of our parish, community, state and nation drew many together in faith and prayer.




Many individuals working together, under the power of Christ's love, to help provide the opportunity for all to worship together, serve together and spread the Good News about Jesus, who is the hope of the world.





St. John of the Cross is a reliable guide for the spiritual life... just listen to two saints talk about him: "How many lights have I not drawn from the works of our holy father, St. John of the Cross." –St. Therese of Lisieux ... "I myself felt especially drawn by the experience and teaching of St John of the Cross. From the first years of my priestly formation I found in him a safe guide along the paths of faith." –St. John Paul II ... an excerpt from *The Dark Night*

God generally sends these storms and trials in this sensory night and purgation to those whom He will afterward put in the other night – although not all pass on to it – so that thus chastised and buffeted, the senses and faculties may gradually be exercised, prepared, and inured for the union with wisdom that will be granted there. For if a soul is not tempted, tried, and proved through temptation and trials, its senses will not be strengthened in preparation for wisdom. It is said therefore in Ecclesiasticus: 'He who is not tempted, what does he know?'

And the most fitting kind of chastisement for entering into wisdom consists of the interior trials we mentioned, since they most efficaciously purge the senses of all the satisfaction and consolation the soul was attached to through natural weakness. By these trials it is truly humbled in preparation for its coming exultation.




