### General Information and Matters for Consideration

Those older than 65 years old (the recommended CDC age), with a compromised health condition or caring for the sick in any way, are encouraged to stay home. Anyone who is ill or has a temperature, cough, etc, should definitely stay home as an act of justice to the whole community.

- Cloth face coverings (masks) are to be worn by everyone approaching church and inside (except 2 years old and younger).

- You will be instructed as how you are to receive Holy Communion. 6 foot markings will be on the floor down the main aisle in the church to show your where to stand for Holy Communion.

### Regarding Your Financial Statement

We are happy to provide you with a financial statement for your donations to St. Veronica Parish. We are thankful for your generosity to provide for the needs of our parish. Every donation large or small is appreciated.

#### How Your

#### Donations Are Posted

All donations are posted on the same day they are received. So on your statement if you turned in three different envelopes for three different Sundays, they will appear as three separate donations but on the same date. For example: If you turned in an envelope for the Feast of All Saints (November 1st) on December 10th, it will read All Saints Day donation but will have the date posted as December 10th.

#### We Try to Be Accurate

We are humans and we do make mistakes. If you find a mistake on your statement, please let us know by calling (586) 777-0331. We will be happy to correct the mistake and issue a new statement. We keep all envelopes for two years so we can double check if necessary.

#### CSA Donations

All Catholic Services Appeal donations are sent directly to the Archdiocese of Detroit Finance Office. The CSA will send out yearend statements if your donation is \$150.00 or more. If you donated less than \$150.00 you can call the CSA Office at (313) 237-5834. They will be glad to mail a statement to you.

## Dispensation Extended to March 12th

The general obligation to attend Mass and Holy Days of Obligation (including the anticipatory Mass at 4:00p.m. or later on the previous day) is to be reinstated in the Archdiocese of Detroit effective Saturday, March 13, 2021.

Considering the grace we have of being physically with our bodies with our brothers and sisters at Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation for the Eucharist, each of us is asked to make a good and sincere judgement as to whether these circumstances apply or not. Where doubt or confusion persists, consult any priest for clarity.

While the general dispensation is removed, these are specific instances where dispensation will not have an obligation to attend Mass on Sunday in the following circumstances:

- 1) You are ill of your health condition would be significantly comprised if you were to contact a communicable illness (i.e. you have underlying conditions or are a high risk category). Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
- 2) You exhibit flu-like systems. Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
- 3) You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (i.e. you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID or influenza). Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
- 4) You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed.
- 5) You are pregnant.
- 6) Those 65 years of age or older (per the CDC's recommendation of high risk individuals).
- 7) You cannot through no fault of your own (i.e. Mass is offered, you are infirmed, or while wanting to go, you are prevented for some other reason you cannot control). (i.e. Your ride did not show up or the Church was at capacity).
- 8) If you have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

For questions about the application of any of there, please contact your pastor.

These categories will be reviewed in due course and revised as needed.

Those within categories #1-8 above must still observe the Lord's Day and are encourage to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion and resurrection, an excellent way to do this is to through participating in a broadcast of the Sunday Mass.

Here are a few ideas to improve your Lenten sacrifices that might be life changing.

### Prayer

Participate in an extra community prayer activity weekly, perhaps a daily Mass, the Stations of the Cross, a day of reflection or a weekend retreat.

Dedicate yourself to an extra 10-15 minutes of daily scripture.

Find on-line prayer source where you can spend 10-15 minutes of prayer on your computer during each busy day.

### Fasting

Fast from negative thoughts of others. Be conscious of your mean, petty thoughts. Perhaps fasting from all screen time would prove impractical. But set yourself a limit. Sacrifice some aspect of Internet browsing, watching television or texting, and do something constructive with the time saved.

Refrain from food and drink is often a fasting choice. Make sure you're doing it for the right sacrificial reasons and perhaps donate the money save to a charity.

Fast from the need to always be right. Spend some time listening to or reading options and ideas of those with whom you might not think you agree with.

### Almsgiving


