Holy Week at St. Veronica

This is the week we've been building up to these last forty days of Lent. Within this week, we are not only going to celebrate when Jesus shared his farewell meal with his friends, but journey with him to his death and await the glories of the Resurrection. During this week, our liturgical celebrations come to a high point and will focus on some of our basic beliefs and reasons why we gather to celebrate.

Palm Sunday

We began Holy Week by recalling the Glory of Christ's entry into the Holy City of Jerusalem and the cheers of "Hosanna to the King of Kings."

Holy Thursday

We then gather to celebrate the "The Last Supper". A simple meal is the focus of our weekly worship and the nourishment of our lives.

Good Friday

Good Friday calls us to focus on the living Christ who died for our sins. We gather again in church to walk the stations with Jesus. We hear him speak to the women of Jerusalem. Simon helps to carry the cross, Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.

Holy Saturday

In the morning, we gather to bless the food we will eat on Easter. We gather to "light the new fire" that will bring forth the Resurrection. It is one of the most moving days of the church. So many of the mysteries we celebrate during the year come from the ceremonies this day. The Blessing of the Water, the lighting of the Easter Candle and the renewal of Baptismal vows. We also will baptize and welcome into our faith our Elect.

The Date of Easter

Prior to A.D. 325 the holiday of Easter was celebrated on different days of the week. In that year Emperor Constantine convened the Council of Nicaea. It issued the rule which states that Easter shall be celebrated on the first Sunday that occurs after the first full moon or after the ecclesiastical vernal equinox. The ecclesiastical vernal equinox is always on March 21st, therefore, Easter must always be celebrated on a Sunday between March 22nd and April 25th.

Easter Sunday Collection

One of our largest collections is on Easter Sunday. The reason for this is that, almost all of our registered parishioners attend Mass on Easter. As I have said many times I am thankful for your generous giving to our Church. When you donate you help us provide the programs we provide to our families. I Would encourage you to donate what you can to the Easter collection. If you can give more, please do so. Let your gift be in thanksgiving to God for the blessings you have received. A good number of parishioners double their donation on Easter Sunday. I remember my Grandparents always doing that as a sign of their joy at Easter and their great love for the church. That may be something you can do this Easter. As we begin Holy Week let us continue to journey with Jesus to Jerusalem and the glory of Easter.

Lenten Banks

Lenten Banks may be returned starting on Palm Sunday. You may drop your Lenten Bank in one of the large offering baskets at one of the entrances in the church or give it to one of the ushers. Lenten Banks may also be brought to any Holy Week Service or the rectory during normal business hours.

Our children have been saving their pennies and money saved from not buying candy, pop or chips in their banks. If you would like to write a check or use paper money instead of coins it would be appreciated.

Our local bank tellers always know when it's Holy Week when we bring in rolls of pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters. They are especially thankful for all the pennies that are in short supply at the bank! God reward you!

We begin with Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem amidst cries of praise from the people. Waving palm branches the people cry, "Hosanna" to the Messiah. We will soon hear the cries of people calling for His Execution, and we recall His violent passion, crucifixion and death. Holy Week ends on Holy Saturday, a day of emptiness and mourning. There are no Masses. The tabernacle is empty. It is knowledge of what happens the next day that keeps us from losing all hope. During these intense days, be intentional about attending as many services you are able. Make time for prayer. Read one of the Gospel accounts of the Passion. Spend time in silence, especially on Good Friday. Consider a more intense fasting this week. This is a time of many graces. Drink deeply of the opportunities to grow in holiness.

Palm Sunday is the first day of Holy Week. Its name is from the ancient custom of carrying palm branches. The palms were considered to be an emblem of victory and peace. The early Christians didn't celebrate until the 4th Century. Olive twigs were used in the church. Today Palm Sunday is observed at almost all churches. Anglican, Roman Catholic and Protestant.

Holy Week

This truly is a powerful week, full of signs and symbols of our faith. Make plans to be a part of this "Holy Week" and awaken to the new life in the Lord!

There is so much to do this week that this is why we call it "Holy Week." I encourage everyone to look over the various opportunities for prayer and reflection and worship listed in our church paper. Plan to be here to celebrate these great events.

Also, be prepared to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Wednesday of Holy Week, so as to fully celebrate the Easter Triduum, (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday).

Our parish offers so much for spiritual and personal growth. Be a part of these experiences and let the Lord be a deep part of your life.

After the Liturgy of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday we invite everyone to spend some time in prayer in the Church in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Remember

the words of Jesus after he found his disciples asleep. "Asleep, Simon? You could not stay awake with me even one hour?" Come and spend some time with Jesus. It has been a custom for me and for many others to visit various churches. Most churches are open until 9:00p.m., and I encourage parishioners to spend some time with the Lord. I'm always impressed by the quietness and prayerful atmosphere of the people. They come out of their cars, go into the chapels and spend some quiet time with their Lord.

Blessing of Easter Food

At 11:00a.m., 12:00 Noon and 1:00p.m. on Holy Saturday. It is an old tradition to bring food to church to be blessed as a gift of thanksgiving to God the Father for the Resurrection of Christ. Just as we have been renewed through the Resurrection, so is blessed food is to give our body new physical energy and strength renewed. By our lives we can preach and extend the Kingdom of God. The food traditionally blessed for Easter, the Feast of the Passover from death to life are the foods described in the ancient Passover

meal: bread, wine, and bitter herbs. The lamb, either meat or a symbolic lamb in the form of a cake or butter is the Passover food by whose blood the Israelites were saved. Jesus is our physical lamb. Sausage is an ethnic addition to, enhance the celebration. Its links remind us the chains of death which were broken when Jesus arose. Bread reminds us of Jesus the Eucharist is the food for our early journey and the bread of everlasting life. Eggs are a sign of hope and resurrection Jesus comes forth from the tomb like that little chick which breaks the shell at birth The eggs to be blessed are decorated with the symbols of Easter. Horseradish reminds us of the bitterness of Jesus' passion by which he entered into glory.

The custom, however is to reserve the eating of the blessed food until after Easter Mass since it is strongly encouraged to continue that Easter fast on Holy Saturday.

An important part of this special meal is the sharing of the blessed Easter eggs with members of your family and friends. The best wishes of the holy day are expressed to each member.
