Mass Dispensation During COVID-19

Catholics in the Archdiocese of Detroit continue to be dispensed from the obligation to celebrate Masses on weekends and Holy Days of obligation if one or more of the following circumstances applies to you.

- You are ill or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness. (that is if you have underlying conditions or are a high-risk category.)
- You exhibit flu-like symptoms, you are pregnant or you have a significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill at Mass.

Those who find themselves in circumstances must still observe the Lord’s Day and we encouraged you to spend time in prayer on Sundays, meditating on the Lord’s passion, death and resurrection, an excellent way to do this is through in a broadcast/livestreaming of the Sunday Mass. Considering the grave obligation we have of being physically present with our brothers and sisters at Mass on weekends and Holy Days of Obligation for the reception of the Eucharist, each of us asked to make a good and sincere judgement as to whether the above-mentioned circumstances apply or not. Dear Parents,

Welcome to Faith Formation for St. Veronica and St. Basil parishes. I am writing to share information about our Faith Formation offerings this fall. To those who have participated in our programs, welcome back! To those who are new, welcome! We hope you will take advantage of the rich opportunities for your children to encounter Jesus, grow in faith and live a life in the power of the Holy Spirit that our Faith Formation offers.

When and Where:

All classes are held at St. Basil the Great in the school building. Classes will be held on Tuesdays, 5:30-6:45p.m. for all levels. Sessions begin September 21st for children in Pre-K through grade 4, and September 28th for children in grade 5 through grade 8. September 21st will be an orientation day for grade Pre-K-4, and at least one parent should attend. Please enter through the breezeway door between the church and the school.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd:

We are happy to offer this wonderful program for our young children. Level I is for our 4 year-olds (we will accept mature 3 year-olds who are potty trained), through 1st graders. Level II is geared toward children in grades 3 and 4. Children love the hands-on approach and the lessons come alive for them as they lead the child to fall in love with Jesus.

Sacrament Prep:

Between Level I and Level II, children prepare for the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion using the Sign of Grace materials from the Augustine Institute.

We begin preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation in the 5th grade and complete the preparation in the 6th grade with the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation.

Discipleship:

After being confirmed, our young people enter our Discipleship classes which offer the newly confirmed opportunities to use their gifts. Class sessions are a combination of learning, praying and acts of service to the parish and the community. Grade 5-8 Middle School.

Catechesis Updates:

As the year begins there will be three minor changes to the Middle School catechetical meetings. One change is that there will be four times throughout the year in which there will be a large group catechetical session for the 5th-8th grades. This session will be held in the Social Hall so there is plenty of space for each class to spread out. Another, is that beginning on October 5th, the 5th-8th grade will begin their sessions in the Church. The final change regards the parent and student orientation. For the Middle School program, there will only be a parent and student orientation for the 6th grade. This orientation will be held on October 5th. Please note that orientation will begin after the opening prayer in the Church. If you have any questions please call or text Carolyn at (586) 209-4975.

Group for Girls:

This is something new we are offering for girls who have made their First Communion-the 8th graders. We will meet the second Saturday of the Month at St. Basil from 10:00 a.m.-noon. The first meeting will be Saturday, October 9th. We will meet in St. Basil Church. The purpose of this group is to involve our young ladies in ministry to the parish, to pray together and to discuss topics of interest to them.

Registration:

Please return all forms by Friday, September 3, 2021. Payment in full is requested with registration. A \$20 fee per child must accompany registration form if not paying in full. Tuition and fees must be paid in full by September 30, 2021 (unless payment arrangements have been made with the Faith Formation office). If your child is new to our Faith Formation program, a baptismal certificate must be included as well if the child was baptized at a church other than St. Veronica or St. Basil. Additional forms are available in the vestibules of St. Veronica and St. Basil Churches and are also available on the parish websites: stveronica.weconnect.com or wwwstbasileastpointe.com All checks are to be made payable to St. Veronica or St. Basil, whichever is your home parish. If you are from another parish, please make checks payable to St. Basil. Thanks.

Mary Theresa Conway was born in Kilkenny County, Ireland on November 28, 1932, the daughter of William and Mary (O'Shea) Conway. She was a member of St. Joseph's Parish in Lake Orion, Michigan at the time of her entrance into the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Nazareth on July 1, 1952. She received the name Sister William Marie at her reception on January 3, 1953 but later returned to her baptismal name. She pronounced first vows on January 3, 1955, and final vows January 3, 1958.

Sister Mary attended St. Rita High School and then graduated from Nazareth College in 1967 with a degree in History. She began her ministry in teaching at St. David's in Detroit, Michigan. For the next several years Sister Mary taught in several Michigan schools: St. Joan of Arc in St. Clair Shores, St. Joseph in Lake Orion, and then at Holy Maternity in Dowagiac. She was an educator as well as Principal at St. John Justin's in Hazel Park, and St. Elizabeth in Wyandotte. Her love of teaching and working with children led her to several other schools in the Dioceses of Detroit, Kalamazoo and Lansing including St. John Bosco, St. Elizabeth, St. Mary and St. Therese. Sister Mary also taught Religious Education at St. Mary House of Prayer in Pinckney, Michigan. From 1980-2002 Sister Mary taught grades 5-6 at St. Veronica's in Eastpointe, Michigan before becoming a tutor/volunteer at the Dominican Literacy Center and as a Spiritual Care Assistant at St. John Senior Community both in Detroit, Michigan. In June, 2011, Sister Mary retired and moved to Nazareth Center, in Kalamazoo, Michigan.

Sister Mary's smiling countenance welcomed all. She was very proud of her Irish heritage. Despite leaving her country of origin as a young teenager, she faithfully kept up with the news from Ireland via the internet. She cherished family members and kept in close contact with relatives around the world by letter-writing and phone calls. In community, she stayed involved and supportive. Many lives were touched by her kind service. One never heard a judgmental word from her. She worked hard and was a very selfless person. A most positive and prayerful woman, Sister Mary had great devotion to the Eucharist and to Mary, the Mother of Jesus. She spent countless hours before the Blessed Sacrament in adoration, intercession and praying the rosary. Surely now she enjoys intimate companionship with her Beloved Lord and his blessed Mother.


