

End of the Year Giving to St. Veronica

As we approach the last weeks of the calendar year-that means we are also coming to the end of the fiscal tax period. When it comes to your charitable deductions for the Internal Revenue Service this coming April. The cutoff date is December 31, 2021. Now is the time to review your tax strategy. If you wish to make an end of the year donation to St. Veronica, vou'll have to before January 1, 2022, and get it to the rectory office in an envelope marked "Christmas Collections" Gifts made in this manner are free from the usual Archdiocese taxation. A significant part our revenue comes from the end of the year contributions which can be in the form of cash, securities, real estate and other negotiables. Call your tax preparer who can guide you as the best way of making a donation to St. Veronica Church before the year ends.

"Divine One, forever new and ageless, we who live in space and time begin a new year of 2022 desiring that it and we be truly new. "O God who makes all things new "O God, help us to be new creations.

New Year's Broom sweep clean our home of the old year's grudges, mistakes, angry words and any unkindness. Symbolically sweep the broom several times across the threshold. "Sweep clean our home of old 2021's dull routines, ruts and patterns which kept us from a greater love of each other." The door is now closed as the group gathers in a circle. Bequests are free of estate tax, and can substantially reduce the amount of your assets claimed by the government. You can give the needed support for St. Veronica by simply including these words in your will: I devise and bequeath to St. Veronica Roman Catholic Church, Eastpointe, MI (insert amount, item or property given here) to be used to support the ministry of St Veronica Parish. A bequest can be a specific piece of property or a percentage of an estate. Think about naming St Veronica as a contingency beneficiary in the event of someone's name in your will is no longer living.

It is always recommended that a lawyer help with any changes or if you are amending your Last Will and Testament.

Mass Dispensation During COVID-19

Catholics in the Archdiocese of Detroit continue to be dispensed from the obligation to celebrate Masses on weekends and Holy Days of obligation if one or more of the following circumstances applies to you.

- You are ill or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness. That is if you have underlying conditions or are a high risk category.
- You exhibit flu-like systems, your are pregnant or you have a signifant fear or anxiety of becoming ill at Mass.

Those who find themselves in circumstances must still observe the Lord's Day and we encouraged you to spend time in prayer on Sundays, meditating on the Lord's passion death and resurrection, an excellent way to do this is broadcast/ through in a livestreaming of the Sunday Mass. For a schedule of livestreamed Masses, please the website of the visit Archdiocese of Detroit at aod.org. Considering grave obligation we have of being physically present with our brothers and sisters at Mass on weekends and Holy Days of Obligation for the reception of the Eucharist, each of us asked to make a good and sincere judgement as to whether the abovementioned circumstances apply or not. Where there is doubt, consult any clergy.



A Gift to St. Veronica Parish Would you like to do your parish a favor? If "YES" then here is a suggestion; Make a Substantial Offering to St. Veronica Around Christmas Time!

How Around is Around Christmas Time?

I mean during Christmas, or before New Year's Day. How to do that? Simply write a check or otherwise to St. Veronica Church and specify: Christmas Offering 2021 and drop it in the basket or bring it to the Rectory Office. Be sure to mark your envelope number and address to credit your contribution record, or use the special Christmas envelope in your offertory packet or the one we will sent you. Why so... Because there are two types of income we are not "assessed" (taxed) in our Archdiocese of Detroit for the Christmas Collection, and the refunds from the St. Veronica C.S.A.

What Does This Mean?

It means that we are "assessed" 7% to the Archdiocese of Detroit for every dollar of income showing in our yearly financial statement. This is called "cathedraticum." The Church of the Archdiocese of Detroit provides many services for parishes on a national, state and local level. In addition, the Central Diocesan Offices have developed various programs in their effort to respond to parish needs. The cost for these services as well as general administrative expenses for the diocese becomes the Archdiocesan Operating Bid for a fiscal year. Each parish is asked to share the cost equitably opportunity to make up for the shortages in our commitments of through the formula for the Diocesan Assessment. This is a healthy Stewardship, i.e., financial support to our parish. We may have missed coming for Mass on given weekends; we may have neglected our regular contributions; we may have reneged on our pledges, etc.

Last Christmas, our parish of St. Veronica did very well in the Christmas collection. Here is a challenge for all of us: Can we exceed the amount this year? This Holy Season is the Season of love, forgiveness, and sharing. If God gives to us so generously, by sending his Son to us, could we not be generous in response to such a gift from God by being generous in giving back a little of the much we have received.
