

After much prayer on how I could be fully present to both the elementary and middle school students, I realized that I either needed to go back two times slots or ask for help. I want things to be easier for the families I minister so I asked for help. Fr. Stan and Fr. Eric have agreed to allow me to salary share to acquire help. This means I have relinquished some of my salary to hire help.

The new position, Assistant to the Religious Education Director, will be a great blessing to the parishes. I am happy to announce that we have hired **Amanda Ross** to fill this new position. Amanda was the Catechist for First Communion last year and was well loved by the children. Amada's primary focus will be the Catechists of the Good Shepherd Ministry. Amanda was just recently certified to be a catechist for Level 1 of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. You can meet Amanda in September when we have our Atrium Open House.

Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.”

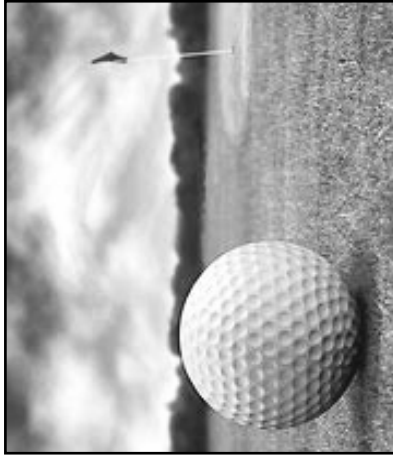

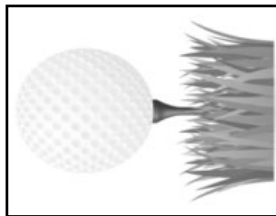

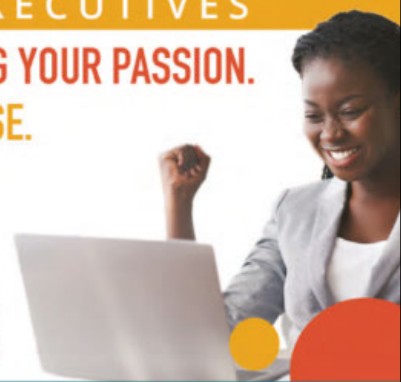
