

It will be at Palazzo Grande, 54660 Van Dyke Avenue, Shelby Township, Michigan 48316, 586-731-2100. It will take place on Saturday, October 17, 2026. Vic reports he is in contact with Villa Restaurant, The Polish Century Club and the Italian Cultural Center to conduct fundraising activities to help us. A concert series with various groups were suggested.

An Alumni Day will be on Sunday, September 21, 2025. It will begin at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. It will be followed by a Pancake Breakfast in the Gym. Proceeds to benefit our Anniversary. It was suggested the Knights of Columbus help us with the Breakfast. They always do a marvelous job.

It was suggested we should start selling tickets to the Dinner-Dance early. Perhaps during the Lenten or Easter Season. There will be 10 people at a table.

We should advertise on Instagram, Facebook and such.

The Feast Day of our Patron, Saint Veronica will occur on Sunday, July 12, 2026. It was agreed an Activity should occur this day.

Father Stan mentioned he is asking us to submit a list of who we consider to be "Prominent" Parishioners in the history of our Parish.

Sign up sheets were available for all present to consent to be a Chairperson or on the Committee or work on many of our Centennial activities. These sign up sheets continue to be available.

A Day of Recollection or a Day of Retreat was suggested. Perhaps the Capuchins could assist us. Perhaps St. Veronica can be designated by the State of Michigan as an Historical Site. A Special Blue Mass with an Ice Cream Social to follow was mentioned.

Centennial Anniversary Banners, T-Shirts, Christmas Ornaments were suggested. Also an ethnic cookbook, bake sale, etc with involvement with former SOS Mom's Club Members from St. Veronica School.

A possible Super Bowl Party was discussed.

Father Stan closed the Meeting at 1:00 p.m. with a Blessing.

There were 54 persons present.

The next Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, July 27, 2025 after the 11:00 a.m. Mass in Church.
