



The picture on the left was at the beginning of the pandemic, when we first learned how to livestream a Mass from an iPad. We began with a virtual Holy Hour. I was praying in the midst of darkness feeling separated and living in an environment of mystery.

Fr. Jake and I drove around the boundaries of the parish with the Blessed Sacrament and prayed for all around us.

The first time we had an outdoor Holy Hour, more than 250 cars filled the parking lot to be together as a parish family and pray. We had the Divine Mercy Sunday and May Crowning celebrations from outside. We offered virtual and outdoor Masses. Confessions in the parking lot. We continued Eucharistic Adoration from a tent in the parking lot and even when the wind would take the tent down, we found a way to stand it back up and hope again! We prevailed to continue to give God the glory! Nothing would stop us!

Eventually, we were able to gather in the church for the sacraments. Baptism, First Communions, Confirmations, weddings and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass were, again, made available to the faithful!

Fr. Jake offered his "Fr. Jake Unplugged". I read stories on YouTube for the children (and adults). Deacon Tom led the rosary on Facebook. The staff continued to minister to the people and the people continued to minister to the community!

Looking back at that picture of me, alone, praying in the church with a camera that allowed all of you to pray with me, I see how the prayers of that moment have been answered. We embrace the gift of Jesus, we did not let anything stop us, and we continued to "Hope Again!"

Jesus is our hope, everyday! Where we have let the world be our focus, may we come to focus on the only gift that can bring us peace and hope, again and again—Jesus! The gift the world cannot give!






SONS and DAUGHTERS of GOD, working on Religious Education lessons in their Domestic Churches (homes)!

Our God SAVES

Our Savior is born! Savior - that is a word I have been thinking a lot about leading up to this Christmas. It is obvious that the world needs a savior and the difficulties being faced by families everywhere are at the most extreme. Many empty tables this year will make it challenging to find and keep our joy; but then again it's not our joy we are supposed to keep, but His joy.

Recently I was told to stop asking Jesus for help. He is not the 'helper' of the world, but the Savior. Instead, ask to be saved and watch how your perspective changes when asking Jesus to save you from: doing your homework, paying a bill, dealing with a problem co-worker, feeling the painful loss of a loved one, etc. Jesus came to save us from everything, and His way of doing that is far more significant than we could even ask.

A few years ago I was struck by the Greek word for save, which is SOZO. The meaning of this word has changed my experience of every Christmas since and strikes right at the heart of our very need. The word means to save, but it can also mean: whole, healed, preserved, made well, and this emphasizes a continuation and not just a one-time thing.

As Catholics we believe we have been saved, but that our salvation is also something that is being worked out, even while reading the bulletin. We have been saved, but we are also being saved and though the mercy and grace of God, we hope to one day be saved. And that hope is a very strange thing indeed because we hope in something that we have in fact already received – Jesus.

The Savior we have waited for (and are waiting for) is not just someone born 2,000+ years ago, but the one who rushes to us each and every moment of every day. Every time we speak the name of Jesus, He comes. He does not delay, but maybe we have been calling out for a long time. One look at the world and things can look bleak. A global pandemic, COVID and our personal sin; it seems there is a lot to be saved from, but the thing not to miss is that - ours is not a fix-it God.

God is not some simple problem solver. The incarnation, the Birth of Jesus was always going to happen – it wasn't plan B, but always the way; the way of communion to our Father in heaven and to our own divination. No God is not just a fixer but a lover, a best friend, a confidant; someone who does not so much as lift us out of our struggle, but join us in that struggle that we might be able to endure.

We cry out God...save me! And He responds, "I'm on my way." But first He is born. We cry...Lord, come to my aid. And He says, "Yes, I am here." But He is learning to walk. We mourn for loved ones - crying to the Father. But Jesus, He buries His own earthly father, Joseph, leaving an empty seat at the table. He does understand. He isn't just helping from a safe distance, but He is in it with us. He has felt our pain and walks with us daily. The God of the universe, born to us in a filthy manger, died on a cross, has proven Himself. What will be our response this Christmas?



Tax-Free IRA Charitable Gifting

Did you know that federal law allows tax-free charitable contributions of up to \$100,000 directly from your IRA? To make a tax-free charitable contribution the following requirements must be met:

- The IRA owner may be 70 1/2 or older.
- Qualified charitable contributions must be made by December 31st each year.
- The charitable contribution must be transferred directly from the IRA to the eligible charity.
- A charity must be a 501(c)(3) organization.

Distribution can be made to multiple charities in the same year following the requirements.

Making a qualified charitable contribution as opposed to a normal charitable gift has two main advantages: A qualified charitable contribution counts toward satisfying the donor's required minimum distribution for the tax year. The distribution is excluded from the taxpayer's income; you do not need to itemize your taxes in order to make an IRA charitable distribution.
