Baptismal Bib

Question: At my grandson's Baptism, the priest put a bib on the baby. I do not remember seeing this before. Why is this done? Is it something new?

Answer: When an adult is baptized, there is a part in the ceremony when the newly baptized is vested in a white garment. It is symbolic of the changes that baptism brings in the life of the baptized as they are freed from the bonds of sin and brought into the saving grace of Christ. Realities that are so profound are symbolically presented so that we might better grasp and understand them.

Infants are often dressed in a baptismal dress, which is the baptismal garment. In some places, the bib is used as a kind of baptismal garment. At the place in the ceremony where the investiture takes place, the bib is used. Some are poncho-like and fit over the baby's head. Others are simply placed on the baby's chest. If the baby is dressed in a white garment, nothing else is needed. The prayer says it all: "See in your white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity ... bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven." In baptism, we are given our purpose and goal in life as believers and this is symbolized by the white garment.

- HIS table was held on December 14. We were happy to feed 81 people this month.
- Forgotten Harvest continues to feed roughly 160 families weekly in our parking lot.
- Christmas gifts were given to 285 different people. These gifts came from our Sharing

 Tree and from parishioners who contacted Christian Service to adopt a family for Christmas. This is a big
 accomplishment. By working with the Romeo Schools we were able to really help families in need that
 normally wouldn't accept assistance.
- Each family that was assisted was given a personal care box that was made up of shampoos, conditioners, toothbrushes, toothpaste, mouthwash, soap, laundry detergent, dish soap and health care items. Thanks again to the Bodiya family for their donation of items. We also, signed up several of these families for the Agape Food Pantry that they can utilize once a month.
- The C.S. Boutique was utilized by 38 adults and 41 children this month. This number is very high because we worked with the Romeo Middle School with the Counseling Center and their families in need.
- With gently used donated winter jackets, we were able to assist the homeless in Detroit with warmth.
- Our SOS clients were all given personal care bags along with a gift card to Kroger for their Christmas dinner.
- A HUGE Thank You to the Czapski family for their donations of hams that were given out to our families who
 were assisted with Christmas assistance. What a wonderful blessing to so many!
- Thank you to the Starkweather Art Center in Romeo for their generous donation from the Fundraiser that they organized during the summer months. And, Thank you to everyone who participated. This donation will be used for this years MCREST program.
- A special request was made for a set of bunk beds for a family in need. We were sincerely blessed with a donation that was made. Thank you to Louise Cooke for organizing this endeavor. Thanks to her effort two children now have a comfortable place to sleep. Another Thank You to the Arini Family (Macomb, MI) for their donation of beds. After hearing that the bunkbeds were being donated to this family in need the seller decided to give them to her to pass on to this family. Good Deeds are contagious! - As previously listed in our bulletin, Thank You to Barbara Marshall and her sorority for purchasing two tires for a homeless man that our parish has assisted through our friends at JEMS.

I Hope I Am Like Him

"Who is this Christ? Is he like you?"

Perhaps you've heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

"He is nothing like me," the saint is said to have answered. "But I hope I am like him."

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ—and this is exactly as he wanted it. "One worthier than I is coming," he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God's will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament—he baptizes the Son of God.

Let's examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God's plan?— Tracy Earl Welliver. MTS


The Baptism of the Lord

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ." - Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who often get us into they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.



St. Hilary of Poitiers, Bishop and **Doctor of the Church - January 13**

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hila-

ry fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.


