MALLIA'S MOMENTS

No one comes to faith in a vacuum. That may be a strange way to begin this week's article, but I think it is an important reminder that we get from today's readings. Both the first reading and the Gospel remind us that for the encounter with Christ to happen or to know who it is that is leading or calling us, we need the help of others. It is through the help of other people that we get to the point of being able to say yes to the Lord; faith simply does not happen in a vacuum. Faith happens when we are fortunate enough to have a companion on the journey.

Even in the world of mass media and social media, the still most important form of advertisement is one on one, word of mouth communication. We are more willing to try something when someone whom we know or meet tell us of their personal experiences. That interaction leads us to try products, go to restaurants, stay at various hotels or to try or avoid any host of other things. We still rely on what people say, good or bad, before we are willing to try something new. The same thing is true about faith.

Most people refuse to talk about faith in general, let alone their church, expect of course those who belong to non-denominational churches. They talk to anyone and everyone they can about their church and they always end by inviting people to come and experience their church. When people ask me what those denominations do that we don't and why so many Catholics leave the church to attend it, the point to they style of worship or the music. they point to the style of worship or the music. The truth is very simple actually. They use word of mouth advertising; they talk about their faith and they talk about their church. This is a process that is not new, it is as old as the Scriptures themselves. *Continued on page 2*



Mallia's Moments

A Gospel reflection from Father Joe and an update on upcoming events happening around the parish

Look at today's Gospel. These soon to be Apostles are at the baptism, they are followers of John. After the baptism, John tells them who Jesus is. They in turn go to follow Jesus and then they go and tell others to come along. The next thing you know, Jesus without saying anything had a group of men willing to follow him. All this happened because John told a couple of his disciples, who told some of their relatives and friends and the next thing you know, they had a crowd.

Why do we not have a crowd? Because we don't talk about faith. We don't invite people to come to our church. We stay silent and expect things to grow all on their own. That does not happen, by the way. The way groups here at the parish will grow is if those involved or interested will invite others to join. We can advertise for more liturgical ministers, but unless those who are doing it actually personally ask others, we will never have enough ministers. The number of people attending SKY will only grow when the young people actually ask other teens to come along to a gathering. The only way Young Adult ministry will grow, is when that age group starts talking to each other and invites others to join. No program grows and no church grows without people talking to people. Even Jesus needed the Apostles to ask others to join and he was God. If he did it that way, why do you think simple advertisement is going to make a difference.

Faith is at its heart, relational. The only way that relationships are developed and fostered is through individual interpersonal contact. You talking to someone else about your experiences at church is the only way that the church is going to grow. Now, we have to do our best to make sure that what happens when people get here is worth their time and effort, but your primary job is to get them here and ours is to keep them once we get them through the door.

I know, you are about to tell me that you have talked to your family and they are not interested. Great, move on to another person you are not related to. Talk to your neighbors who are non-practicing Catholics or a co-worker who tells you that they stopped going to Mass. Tell anyone who will listen and keep inviting. You may only get one person to come back to church, but if we all do that, well by next week twice as many people will be coming to Mass and we will need more Masses. It is as simple as that! If those people do the same, we then triple our Mass attendance.

Word of mouth advertisement, interpersonal communication is about getting the word out and nothing more. You are not responsible for answering their questions or solving their problems. A simple answer to give is, "I don't know, but someone at the church will be happy to answer your question". What could be easier?

We need each other to help ourselves grow and we all need to do our part in spreading the good news of Jesus and our church to others. Staying quiet is simply not an option anymore and it never was in the past either. Samuel needed Saul, Peter needed Andrew; who needs you? God bless you all.

Search for a new music minister:

Now that the formal announcement has been made about Catherine making the decision to assume a new position at St. Joan of Arc, I can let you know that since I became aware of her decision right before the Fourth Sunday of Advent, we have been looking for a replacement. I am not inclined to just hire anyone simply to fill a position. We will have a temporary musician until the person we hire is able to assume the role full time. We are searching out the best candidate to help our music program grow, but also will help enhance our worship experience. Music is an important part of our ability to praise God well and to expand our prayer opportunities.

I have spoken to several candidates already but no final decisions have been made. Once those decisions are made, I will let you know about the details and start date. I have also spoken to those who share their musical gifts with us each week and we have set a plan as to how to address the coming weeks and possibly all of Lent and Easter if need be. Catherine was kind enough to leave a music plan for every Mass until Ash Wednesday before she left and I am very grateful. I have every confidence that God will bring us the right person. Thank you.

Sharing of God's blessings with others:

A couple of months ago, the Finance Council brought up the possibility of sharing some of our resources with others during these difficult times. The staff and the parish council were asked to surface groups that could use our help. Right before Christmas, the Finance Council reviewed those recommendations and moved to have the parish issue checks to the following organizations: Abigayle Ministries, Gianna House, Trinity Lutheran Church, Pope Francis Center in Detroit, Agape Center, Samaritan House, Angels of Hope, Turning Point, Capuchin Soup Kitchen and the Yamin Family. A total of \$60,000 was awarded to these worthy causes. Thank you for your continued support to our parish that allows us to do such wonderful work at our parish and in our local community



In last week's article, I shared some information on the current process and steps involved in a person being officially recognized as a saint. This week, we will look at how this happened historically, before the more formal process was in place.

In the first five centuries of the Church, the process for recognizing a saint was based on public acclaim or the *vox populi*, *vox Dei* (voice of the people, voice of God). There was no formal canonical process as understood by today's standards. Beginning in the sixth century and continuing into the twelfth century, the intervention of the local bishop was required before someone could be canonized. This usually began with a request from the local community, for the bishop to recognize someone a saint. Upon studying the request and a written biography, if he found it favorable, the bishop would typically issue a decree and thereby canonize the person.

Starting in the tenth century, a cause proceeded with the usual steps, that is, the person's reputation would spread, a request to the local bishop from the people to declare the person a saint occurred, and a biography would be written for the bishop's review. Now however, the bishop would collect eyewitness testimony of those who knew the person and who had witnessed miracles, and he would provide a summary of the case to the Pope for his approval. The Pope then reviewed the cause, and if he approved it, he issued a decree declaring the person a canonized saint. When Pope Sixtus V reorganized the Roman Curia in 1588, he established the Congregation for Sacred Rites (the precursor to the current Congregation for the Causes of Saints). One of its functions was to assist the Pope with reviewing causes. Except for a few developments, this process of canonization remained the same until 1917 when a universal Code of Canon Law was promulgated.

The 1917 code contained 145 canons on causes of canonization, and mandated that (1.) an episcopal process and (2.) an apostolic process be conducted. The episcopal process consisted of the local bishop verifying the reputation of the person, ensuring that a biography existed, collecting eyewitness testimony and the person's written works. All of this was then forwarded to the Congregation for Sacred Rites. The apostolic process consisted of reviewing the evidence submitted, collecting more evidence, studying the cause, investigating any alleged miracles and ultimately forwarding the cause to the Pope for his approval. This process remained in effect until 1983, when the current process was defined in the revised Code of Canon Law. These twentieth century norms for causes of canonization, remain in force today.
