MALLIA'S MOMENTS

Are the prayers we say, wishes or hopes or statements of faith? That may seem like a weird question, but I think it is an important question. Each day we pray, but are we “hoping” that God hears us or are we praying with a level of confidence that God is hearing us? Are we praying for desires of our hearts only or are we also praying for the grace to accept whatever happens in trust of the Lord’s mercy?

Today, the Church is praying for the Holy Spirit to renew the face of the earth. Is that really what we want and are we praying that we are part of that process or are we hoping that God hears us and gives the work to someone else?

Praying is what we are told to do, but I really don’t think most people understand how to pray. First, we must believe that we are praying to the Father, through the Son and by the guidance of the Holy Spirit. In other words, our prayers are not a “shot in the dark”, where we throw out words into space and hope that some of them stick to the hem of God’s heavenly robe. I don’t know about you, but when I speak to someone one on one, I would expect they would be listening to me. Why would we think that God is not listening to us?

Our failure to grasp that we are directly talking to God is part of the reason people fail to take their prayer time seriously. We see it as a random act and so we approach it randomly. Maybe it would help us if we held a crucifix in our hands when we pray so that we realize whom we are talking to and also recall that someone who did this for us would not let our conversations be haphazard.

Secondly, praying is not simply about uttering words. Formal prayers are wonderful guides and help us to develop and maintain a prayer life, but even the formal written prayers are about reflection on the mystery and wonder of God. But prayer is also about a personal conversation with God that requires the opening up of our hearts and minds to God, and providing God with the opportunity to respond to us, to speak to us.

God desires to speak to each of us; we can hear his voice. Do you believe that? Do you want to hear God speaking to you, not for the novelty or for "proof" but from a desire to do the will of God, to do what he will ask you to do? God is not going to talk to you just to shoot the breeze or ask how your day is going, but God will talk to you if your heart and mind are open to listening. I caution you though, be careful for what you ask for. Saying, "O Lord, speak your servant is listening", better also come with the understanding of, "I am ready to do your will".

Thirdly, we must understand that prayer is essential to holiness. How can I be close to the Lord or find the strength to do what is asked of me if my life is not rooted in prayer? True prayer is the establishment of a level of spiritual intimacy with God, it is how we fall in love with God. Prayer feeds our souls and enriches our lives because it is based in knowing God, loving God and seeking to be deeper in love with God.

If our prayer is nothing more than a routine, I invite you to speak less and listen more to God. Start with praying written prayers for a few minutes, maybe five per day, every day at the same time of day and then spend five minutes in silence with God. Prayer is not a routine, but it is a discipline. It must be done daily and we must find a rhythm to our day so that we incorporate the prayer and the activities of the day together. Personally, I like The Rule of St. Benedict. He firmly believed that the monks needed a balance of prayer, work, silence and social time together. That we find our footing in the stability of the rhythm of our lives and he is right.

For too many of us, we try to "fit" prayer in when we can and where we can. Our lives have no balance and we are like a tightrope walker who is also trying to juggle balls, always on the verge of falling off the wire. Prayer requires our full attention to whom we are praying, for what we are praying and for listening to the one we are praying to.

Distractions during prayer will happen, but they happen less as the person becomes more in tune with how they structure their prayer time as well as the prayers themselves. Grow in your prayer life by creating the proper approach physically and spiritually to prayer.

As we call on the Holy Spirit to renew the face of the earth on this feast of Pentecost, let us ask the Holy Spirit to begin that renewal in our hearts and to use us in the work of renewing the world for God through Christ our Lord. God bless you all.

Family of Parishes Gathering:

Our first Family Gathering is set for this Wednesday, May 26th at 7 pm. It will be a virtual meeting. To register go to FOPGATHERINGS.ORG.

Registration is very simple and you will be given a link to connect to the prayer and information event.

The event will last around an hour. The second Family Gathering will be June 23rd at 7 pm and it is hoped that it will be a hybrid event, both virtual and live. The third gathering is set for July 28th and the plan is to have a live event that night focused primarily on prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. I hope that you are able to join us for these three gatherings to begin our work together as a Family of Parishes working together to build the Kingdom of God in our area.

What is a Family of Parishes:

The framework of the Family of Parishes is actually found in Canon Law, this is not a creation of our diocese or our archbishop. The purpose of the Family structure is to ensure the proper leadership and pastoral presence for the mission of bringing the Gospel to the world as Jesus directed us to do.

The Family of Parishes is not a merger. Each parish remains a separate entity, but share a common administrator (the Moderator) who is aided by the other priests of the Family and by the Family pastoral staff. Each parish will maintain their own identity, their own finances and their own character. The approach is intended to be collaborative focusing on our common mission rather than our own individual parish.

By working in this way, not every priest will be burdened with administrative roles. This will free priests up to use their individual gifts and to give them time to do the work they were ordained to do. Further, as priests retire, they are still able to find a way to serve in a Family according to their ability without being faced with the hardship of having to leave a parish, or struggle to deal with the administrative tasks and meetings.

I believe that once we work through all the details of setting up the Family, it will result in a more effective way of doing ministry and provide a more vibrant presence of the Catholic Church in our area. That is my sole vision as I assume the role of Moderator on July 1st this year. Please pray for me and our three parishes as we move forward on mission. God bless and have a great week.



Deacon Russ Reflects

There are times in our life that we face what seems to be an impossible situation. The saint we will learn about today, is one that we can reach out too during these times. May 22 is the feast day of St. Rita, an Augustinian nun from 14th-century Cascia, Italy. She lived a difficult and disappointing life but, through her trials, God used her in remarkable ways. Now she assists from heaven, those who plead for her intercession for their own seemingly impossible and hopeless circumstances.

From an early age St. Rita wanted to become a nun, but her parents insisted that she marry. Out of obedience to them, she entered an arranged marriage at the age of twelve. Adding to her disappointment, her husband was cruel and harsh; she spent eighteen years in a very difficult relationship. Her husband eventually became physically abusive, but Rita met his cruelty with kindness and patience. After many years of prayer, patience, and trust in God, she eventually won her husband over to greater civility and kindness. She also bore two sons whom she loved deeply.

In the 14th century, Italy was rampant with warring families caught in a vicious circle of assassinations and bloody vendettas (think Romeo and Juliet). St. Rita's family was caught up in this mindset. Her husband was murdered as a result of the infamous rivalry between the aristocratic families of the Guelphs and the Ghibellines. Mourning her husband's death, she earnestly interceded for his soul. Rita's two young sons, talked of avenging their father's death. She did all she could to guide them into forgiveness, but was unable to dissuade them from their evil intentions. She pleaded with God that He would prevent the evil welling up in the hearts of her sons, or allow them to die before they committed a mortal sin. God granted her prayers. Both of her sons fell sick and died within a year, and in a state of grace.

After their deaths, and all alone in the world, St. Rita sought to enter the convent. However, she was turned away because of her family's association with the civil strife. Some of the sisters living in the convent were relatives of the men who were responsible for killing her husband. So to maintain peace in the convent, she was denied entry. St. Rita, again facing crushing disappointment and yet another impossible situation, had recourse to prayer and the intercession of the saints. Her sincerity and spirit of charity and forgiveness prevailed, and she was eventually granted entry into the convent. She became known as a holy and prayerful nun, often meditating on the sufferings of the crucified Christ.

One day, while praying before a crucifix, St. Rita received a visible wound on her forehead. This mystical yet visible mark of Jesus' wound from the crown of thorns, symbolized St. Rita's unity with Christ in his sufferings. She enjoyed many more mystical experiences with Christ during the forty years she lived in the convent. Rita died on May 22 when she was in her seventies. Her body remains incorrupt to this day. St. Rita, patron of the impossible, abuse victims, marriage difficulties, and those with bodily wounds, pray for us!




