# Mallia's Moments

A Gospel reflection from Father Joe and an update on upcoming events happening around the parish

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I wanted to write this letter to you to help us in our transition into a Family of Parishes. Though many of you have seen this term, you may not be fully aware of what it means. Part of the lack of clear communication is due to the fact that we are working through a lot of details as we go along in this process. It is important to understand that it is a process and that there is nothing magically going to happen on July 1st 2021.

For most of you, you will not even notice a difference. Our goal is to keep things moving as they have been all along. When you go to mass you will see the same priests and have mass at the same time as normal. There is no intention on my part to have priests moving around from parish to parish on any given weekend, except if there is an emergency need and as long as we have enough priests to cover the masses, the times will remain the same. Though clearly, if there are less priests, some things are going to have to change.

Further, even though we are forming a "Family", the parishes remain separate entities and we are also beginning the process to formally incorporate each parish separately as well. This means that the finances of each parish remain separate and each parish will maintain its own traditions and character. This is the formation of a Family, it is not a merger or even a cluster.

So, then what is it? The simple answer is that it is an administrative change to better address the needs of parishes in the future as we address the shortage of priests and lay professional staff. By having one priest in charge of the administration of a group of parishes, we free up other priests to do the work that we were ordained to do. The role of the "Moderator" is to be the priest primarily responsible for the financial and administrative concerns of the parishes in the Family. The other "pastors in the Family" and the "parochial vicar in the Family" will work with the Moderator to assure the pastoral care of all the people within the Family.

To allow for this to happen, there has been a shift in the roles of priests at the parishes. Though you will see the same priests at your parish, their primary role will be to provide for the spiritual and pastoral care of the parish. They will no longer be responsible for budgets or for the physical care of the parish, for example. They will no longer be "pastors" in the traditional understanding of that term as in the past, but will be part of the team of priests who pastor together. The role of supervision of the staff, the support of the school or the direction of the various ministries falls under the role of the Moderator.

To help the Moderator, some of our present staffs will be given the added responsibility of directing the various areas of parish life. These "Directors" will help to form a leadership team with the Moderator and the other priests for the total care of the parishes. Under the direct supervision of the Directors will be a series of "coordinators" who could be paid or volunteer roles.

Presently, each parish has a Parish Council. These will end and be replaced by lay representatives to a new Family Council, that will assure equal lay representation of each parish and serve as advisors to the Moderator. Each parish will maintain its own Finance Council and there will also be a Family Finance Council. The costs that will be incurred by the Family, such as the salary for the Directors, will be equitably but not equally paid by the parishes of the Family. Parish staffs, such as secretaries, office staff, maintenance staff and so forth will still be paid by the parish they are presently working at. The priests at this point will also be paid by the parish where they are presently residing.

As you can see, the process is going to take time and the way we administrate parishes is going to change but the reality of parishes surviving into the future is more secure now than when each parish had one pastor. If that pastor was assigned to another parish, retired or returned to the Lord, often the parish's future was uncertain. Now, the Moderator provides a new level of parish stability.

On my part as Moderator, I will do my best to support the parish staffs, to consult openly and honestly with the parish leadership and to rely on my brother priests to advise and cooperate in the spiritual and pastoral care of the faithful in our area and to support them in their ministry.

Change is difficult and often unwelcomed by many, but as Dr. Deming often said, "change is inevitable; survival is optional". If we want to secure healthy and vibrant parishes into the future, then we must make changes now rather than in the midst of a crisis when mistakes are frequent and adaptations are difficult. Our goal is to remain focused on the mission given to us by Christ before he left the earth and to help people encounter the Risen Lord. To do that, our way of running parishes must change so that our focus as priests and laity alike may shift to the missionary work of proclaiming the Good News. I ask that you please pray diligently for all our parishes in this Family.

If you have ever lost something, it is likely that you were told to pray to today's saint. But why do people think that praying to St. Anthony will help find the lost or stolen item? The reason is traced back to an incident in his own life. As the story goes, he had a favorite book of psalms that was very valuable to him. As this was before the invention of the printing press, the book was hand-printed – but of even more value were his personal notes and the comments he had made in it to assist with teaching students. It was suspected that a novice leaving the community had stolen the Psalter. Anthony prayed for the return of his beloved possession. Shortly after, the novice returned the book and sought Anthony's forgiveness.

Legends about Anthony abound, but here are some known facts. Born in 1195 (13 years after St. Francis) in Lisbon Portugal, he was given the name Fernando. His parents, Martin and Mary Bulhom, apparently belonged to one of the prominent families of the city. At the age of 15, he entered the religious order of St. Augustine. Monastery life was hardly peaceful as his old friends came to visit frequently and engaged in vehement political discussions. After two years he was sent to Coimbra, where he began nine years of intense study, learning the Augustinian theology, and was ordained a priest during this time.

The life of the young priest took a crucial turn when the bodies of the first five Franciscan martyrs were returned from Morocco where they had been preaching the Gospel at a mosque in Seville. In the presence of a huge crowd, including the queen, their remains were carried in solemn procession to the very monastery where Fernando lived. This event, while viewed by many as tragic and sad, was deemed glorious, and in fact was an inspiration to young Fernando. So much so, that it inspired him to make a momentous decision, one that would change his life and the lives of many to come. He decided that he too would become a Franciscan!

Anthony was first recognized for his great gift of preaching at a gathering for the ordination of Dominicans and Franciscans in 1222. The provincial suggested that one of the friars give a short sermon. There were no volunteers among the group, so Anthony was asked to give "just something simple," since he presumably had no education and was just 27 years old. While resisting the offer at first, Anthony decided to speak. Preaching in a simple, artless way, the "fire" within him became evident. His knowledge was unmistakable, but it was the passionate manner in which he spoke that truly impressed everyone in attendance. At once, his quiet life of prayer and penance at the hermitage was exchanged for that of a public preacher.

Anthony continued to preach as he taught the friars and assumed more responsibility within the order. In 1226 he was appointed provincial superior of northern Italy.

Around Easter in 1228, at the age of 33, he met Pope Gregory IX in Rome. The Pope had been a faithful friend and adviser of St. Francis. Naturally, the "famous preacher Anthony" was invited to speak. He did it humbly, as always and the response was so great, that people later said that it seemed the miracle of Pentecost was repeated.

Back in Padua in 1231, Anthony preached his last and most famous Lenten sermons. The crowds were so great - sometimes 30,000 people - that the churches could not hold them, so he went into the piazzas or the open fields. People waited all night to hear him. After his morning mass and sermon, Anthony would hear confessions. This sometimes lasted all day - as did his fasting and constant prayer. The great energy he had expended during the Lenten season left him exhausted. He went to a little town near Padua to rest and recover, but, coming close to death, he wanted to return to Padua. The journey weakened him so much, however, that he had to stop at Arcella. On June 13, 1231, he died.

The story and tradition of devotion to St. Anthony of Padua began almost immediately upon his death. Thousands came to view his body and attend his burial. His grave became a place of extraordinary devotion and numerous miracles. The following year, his friend, Pope Gregory IX, moved by the many miracles, declared him a saint. In 1946, Pope Pius XII officially declared him a doctor of the church. St. Anthony, may we, like you, have a passion for sharing the Good News of the Gospel!

## The Gospel For All Ages...Family Catechesis

Take the Challenge!

*Ezekiel 17: 22-24; Second Corinthians 5: 6-10; Mark 4:26-34*



**Gospel Summary**  
The this Gospel, Mark focuses on the parable of the Seed that grows itself. Jesus is pointing out that the growth of the Kingdom of God is a hidden reality that operates under God's power rather than through human work and effort. In the second part of the Gospel, the parable of the Mustard Seed, Jesus is offering the crowds words of encouragement. What at first might seem small and insignificant will, under God's power, become "the largest of plants."

**Reflection for Parents**  
In the parables, or simple stories that Jesus told, he used everyday objects such as salt, light, coins, yeast, and even a father and his sons to teach moral lessons. Jesus wanted people to relate to the stories he told, and to understand his teachings about the ways in which children of God are called to live. Children of all ages love to hear good stories, especially those they can relate to because the situations, settings, characters, or objects are familiar to them

**Bringing the Good News Into Your Family**  
Place a small, empty bowl and a container of various kinds of seeds on your family prayer table or kitchen table. Remind your family that every person can plant seeds of goodness, kindness, thoughtfulness, generosity, thankfulness, and love in the lives of family members, friends, and those in need in the world today. Share ideas about ways to do this. Invite family members to put one seed in the glass bowl for every seed of God's love they plant in the coming week. At the end of the week, reread the parable of the Mustard Seed and—if possible—plant your seeds and be surprised by what grows!

### JUNE 2021 PERSONAL UPDATE REVIEW SUGGESTIONS




### CSA 2021~ FUEL THE MISSION

CSA 2021 Target \$185,712




