

Mallia's Moments

A Gospel reflection from Father Joe and an update on upcoming events happening around the parish

“A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon beneath her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars.” (Rev. 12:1)

This is the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Upon her death, Mary was taken up to heaven before her body was able to decay, so that we would know that we, like Mary, would share in the total victory won by Jesus when he rose from the dead and ascended into heaven. In the Church we often speak about it as, where the head has gone (Jesus) the body will follow (the community of believers).

These days, fewer people have a devotion to Mary and maybe this is because we have gotten away from devotional public prayers all together, as well as the assault upon Catholics by others who challenge our traditional devotional practices, reducing them to vulgar humor and ridicule. But whatever the reason is, it has resulted in our deprivation of a powerful intercessor on behalf of ourselves, our families, our Church and our country. Simply put, we should be turning to Mary on a daily basis, especially through the praying of the rosary.

The misunderstanding is that some think we as Catholics believe Mary is divine, that is not true. She is not divine, she is not equal to God or to Jesus. Mary was a fully human person like you and me. The difference comes in, when we talk about Mary as having been immaculately conceived. In this Dogma of the Church, we profess our belief that God, who knows all things, chose to keep her free from original sin from the moment of her conception so that as the vessel that would bring forth the savior of the world, the spotless lamb, she too would be free from the stain of sin. Even in this though, we profess our belief that Mary was still in need of Jesus to redeem the world from the eternal effects of sin. Mary was not going to heaven, unless Jesus died, rose and ascended into heaven.

Mary is also revered by the Church throughout history because she was the first disciple, a faithful believer who responded “yes” to the most momentous question in the history of the world. She remained faithful to God in the joy of the nativity, in the difficulty of watching her son struggle to get his message to the world and in the pain of watching her son die while she stood at the foot of the cross.

From the earliest time of the Church’s history, there are writings which talk about the importance of Mary and her example of faithful discipleship. If you look at every celebration of Mary that we have as a Church, it is not so much about praising Mary, but rejoicing in God’s work in her life, rewards for her faithfulness and about her role in leading us to Christ. Take a look at the approved apparitions of Mary throughout the world and the message is almost always the same. It is not about her seeking attention or about pointing us to focus on her, but in fact it is about deepening our relationship to Christ, to turn away from sin, to pray for the world and to help us understand the importance of prayer as a key to our bringing about peace in the family and in the world.

Finally, after all, she is his mother and, as his mother, who could love him more? For Jesus through Mary is the simple statement which captures what we believe the relationship that we have with Mary to be all about. We are foolish, if we do not turn to Mary to join us in our prayers. We are shortsighted if we do not turn to Mary to help us in our desire to be good disciples of the Lord. We lack wisdom if we do not seek to imitate her humble way of faithfulness to God in every situation of our lives.

Mary having lived a life like our own is fully capable to relating to our situation. Praying and asking her to join in our prayers is to turn to our heavenly mother who loves us as much as Jesus does. Even the asking those who have died to join us in prayer is a testament to our belief in resurrection. If we did not believe in eternal life in heaven, why would we ask those who have died to join us in prayer?

So, it is not foolish to pray with Mary, it is brilliant in fact. Let those who do not believe linger in their doubts, but let us not forsake the great advocate that Jesus gave us from the cross. Behold, your mother, he said to John and to all of us. She is our heavenly mother, our advocate, our model of faithfulness and our help to guide us into a deeper and fuller relationship with Christ her son. Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee. Amen.


What is your vocation?

Young people are often asked, what do they want to "be" when they grow up. The real question that is being asked is, "what do you want to do for a profession". The idea of "being" what you "do" is a very sad commentary about our society. You should want to be a disciple of Christ no matter what you do as a profession. The work is always secondary to the person you are. No matter the job, you should want to be a person of integrity, honesty and faithfulness.

But in regards to what you do with your life, that is a vocation, a call placed in you by God. Vocations are not just about priesthood or religious life, it is about any path of life we are to take. So, I would encourage young people to pray about their vocation. Ask God what path you should take and do not simply look at what you would "like" to do or how much money a profession can make, ask God to lead you to the profession that will help you to be all that God calls you to be, a profession that gives you life and not simply helps you make a living.

Did you know?

- That if you are enrolling your child in a catholic school for elementary or high school, our parish is willing to help you pay the tuition. All you need to do is ask.
- That if you were married in the Catholic Church and are divorced, you can remarry in the Church if you receive an annulment. Did you know that there is no cost to an annulment? If you are in that position and have questions, we are ready to help you with the paperwork. All you need to do is ask.

Reflects



This week we will discuss a saint depicted in one of our stained-glass windows, who, unlike human saints who walked the earth, are unique creatures – angels to be exact. Saint Michael the Archangel isn't so much a "saint," but rather he is an angel, and the leader of all angels and of the army of God. This is what the title "Archangel" means, that he is above all the other angels in rank.

St. Michael has four main responsibilities or offices, as we know from scripture and Christian tradition. The first is to combat Satan. The second is to escort the faithful to heaven at their hour of death. The third is to be a champion of all Christians, and the Church itself. And the fourth is to call men and women from life on earth to their heavenly judgment.

Very little is known about St Michael other than what we hear from scriptures. He is referenced in the Old Testament and has been part of Christian teachings since the earliest times. In Catholic writings and traditions, he acts as the defender of the Church and chief opponent of Satan. In the Book of Daniel, St. Michael is mentioned twice. The first time as one who helped Daniel, and the second time he is mentioned with regard to the end times of the world when he will stand for the "children of thy people." His next mention comes in the Epistle of St. Jude, where St. Michael is said to guard the tombs of Moses and Eve, and has contended with Satan over the body of Moses. The final mention is in the Book of Revelation, where St. Michael and his angels, do battle with the dragon.

There are other scriptures where St. Michael is implied, but not mentioned by name, such as the angel "who defends the gate to Paradise," who "defends against Balaam," and "who routed the army of Sennacherib." Today, St. Michael is invoked for protection, especially from deadly enemies. He is also the patron of soldiers, police officers and doctors.

There is a prayer to St. Michael the Archangel that was brought into official use by Pope Leo XIII in 1886, and was recommended by Pope John Paul II in 1994. Let it be our prayer today and every day: "Saint Michael the archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly hosts, by the power of God, cast into Hell Satan, and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world, seeking the ruin of souls." Amen!

FUN FACTS!

The Assumption celebrated on August 15th refers to the Blessed Virgin Mary being assumed—body and soul—into heaven at the end of her earthly life. As evidenced by the writings of many early Church fathers, Christians have believed for more than a millennium that the Blessed Virgin was assumed into heaven. In 1950, Pope Pius XII issued *Munificentissimus Deus*, which officially defined the Dogma of the Assumption. This feast day is a Holy Day of Obligation.

Faith and Fun in the Family

Bless Your Child—A parent’s blessing is a powerful sign of God’s love. You can bless your child by placing your hand on their head and making the sign of the cross with your thumb on their forehead. Say to them, “God bless you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” Any other words that come to your heart can be added. You can bless your child anytime such as leaving for school, before their sports game, going to bed, etc.




MCREST 2021

Knights Corner




FUEL THE MISSION

Question:

What lessons should I learn from the Assumption of Mary?


Answer:

Growing in holiness is similar to training in a sport. We need someone to show us how we can live our faith well. Mary is a model of sanctity. She shows us how to be faithful to God's will, living each day with confidence in God's mercy and love. At the Nativity, in Jesus' public ministry, and at the Crucifixion, we see her steadfast trust. She allows the Lord to use her life to accomplish his plan for her and for all of us. In the Preface of the Mass for the Assumption of Mary, we pray: "For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church's coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people."

It is this image of holiness that we strive to imitate. In the office, at home, or in our community, we look for signs of God's grace that call us to an ever greater love of him and each other. A greater awareness of God is a sign of our conversion of heart that lives the lessons Mary teaches.


