MALLIA'S MOMENTS

This Monday, we will celebrate Labor Day. This annual celebration was created as a national holiday in 1894 when it was designated to be marked on the first Monday of September. Various places had celebrated a day to mark the efforts of the American worker at earlier points in history, but it took time to become a national movement and be declared by Congress to be worthy of a national holiday.

But did you know that the Catholic Church has had a long history in formulating a theological approach to the understanding of the dignity of work and the importance of worker safety, just wages, the right to form unions, the prohibition of child labor and so forth; issues which many people would not consciously attribute to the Catholic Church? It was Pope Leo XIII in 1891, during the Industrial Revolution, who gave world- wide prominence to these issues in a document called *Rerum Novarum*. This document is understood to be the foundational document to what we often refer to as Catholic Social Teaching.

Today unfortunately, we often associate the salary amount as reflective of the dignity of the person, but that is not true. Many people are paid a great amount of money these days, but does that really mean that what was done was of great value? It is politically expedient these days to point to the disparity in salaries between the workers and those who are CEO's of companies whose role is very complicated and whose work results in the ability of hundreds to thousands of workers being able to feed their families. The disparity can be justified based on responsibility and yet at the same time it can also be unjust if the disparity is the result of an abuse of power by some to the detriment of others. But notice how the amount of money that is earned by professional athletes, performers or social media influencers is never questioned. Why is that do you think?

A Gospel reflection from Father Joe and an update on upcoming events happening around the parish

The opportunity to earn a just wage for the work that we do is beneficial to the person and to society. The unbridled and unwarranted disparity in salaries contributes to social unrest by creating an artificial distinction between people. The value of the work is diminished and it creates the attitude that money in and of itself is the goal of work. Take for example how the pursuit of money alone devalues the importance of education. When going to school, students ask the question, "how is this going to help me get a job?". It may not help you get a job, but education of various things helps you in becoming a more informed person, except if the only value you have is money. Take note of how many people have made loads of money, then subsequently went bankrupt or were morally deprived people. Did money make them smart or even a good person? In that case what good is the money?

The pursuit of the "almighty dollar" blinds us from the search for the "Almighty" and even from the moral benefit of the whole of society. When money becomes the goal, I become numb to the affects my actions may have on others in the pursuit of money for myself. Do drug dealers consider the impact on the lives of their victims as they happily flash the results of their illegal activity? No, and worse, they seek to draw more people into the process with the allurements of money to the further devastation of other lives.

Part of our problem is the lack of basic economic knowledge. Most people have yet to grasp the concept that the more money that is earned by the worker results in the cost of the product rising at a higher rate. Take for example, in 1990 the minimum wage was \$3.80. The median home cost was \$79,100 and the cost of a four-year education at a public university was \$5, 243. Between 2010-2019, the minimum wage was \$7.25. The median home cost \$179,900 and that college education was \$17,722. To put it in another light, that median home in 1990 costs nearly as much as a median home in 2019 when you figure in the cost of inflation. No progress! Even though the amount of median income went up, the purchasing power of the money declined or remained flat.

That is why equating value of person to the amount of money is a regressive idea. Dignity of person comes inherently from the reality that we are made in the image and likeness of God. Our work is to be seen as a value in that it provides us with a means to sustain life, but it should never be the measure of our lives. We work to feed ourselves and our families, to provide them a proper quality of life and to be able to enjoy the wonder of our lives. If work takes away from any of that, it ceases to add to the dignity of the person, no matter how much the person earns. Further, work should add to the betterment of society, giving each person a proper path to sustainability. This does not mean that every job should be paid the same amount, but it does mean that there is a moral component to compensation for the work that is done.

As we celebrate Labor Day, we should reflect on the dignity of every worker. I would also encourage you to read the documents issued by our popes over the years. Besides Rerum Novarum, there is Quadregesimo Anno in 1931 by Pope Pius XI, Guadium et Spes, 1965 Vatican II, Labor Exercens in 1981 by Pope St. John Paul II and Caritas in Veritate by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009. Parish Revival Weekend



The last of the saints depicted in our stained-glass windows died at the tender age of 17, just a short time after entering the Jesuit order. Today's saint is St. Stanislaus Kostka.

Born at the castle of Rostkovo in Poland on October 28, 1550, the son of a senator, Stanislaus was educated first by a private tutor and then, with his older brother Paul, at the Jesuit college in Vienna. His piety irritated his brother, who bullied and beat him. Stanislaus warned him, "This will end in my running away and not coming back. Then you will have to explain to our father and mother." The family tutor who accompanied them did not help matters, and the Lutheran household in which they lodged, would not permit the Blessed Sacrament to be brought to him when he was ill. Stanislaus remembered having read that those who invoked Saint Barbara never died without the Sacraments, and he prayed that she would help him in his danger. It is believed that St. Barbara, accompanied by two angels, entered his room with the Blessed Sacrament and he was healed.

Upon his recovery, Stanislaus decided to become a Jesuit, but the Austrian provincial would not receive him because of previous disturbances from "outraged fathers." So Stanislaus set out on a 500-mile walk to Rome to put his case before the Jesuit General. He first went to Dillingen where he met the provincial for Germany, St. Peter Canisius, with whom he stayed for a month. Canisius employed him in a boarding school and tested Stanislaus by assigning him menial tasks. He then encouraged him to continue his journey to Rome where, some days after his arrival in October 1567, the Jesuit General Francis Borgia admitted him to the novitiate on his seventeenth birthday. Stanislaus never completed his training and, nine short months into his novitiate, he again became very sick. Early in the morning on the Feast of the Assumption, August 15, 1568, he told a priest that he saw the Virgin Mary surrounded by many angels. Shortly afterward, he died.

His brother Paul was sent by his father to demand that his son return home. However, by the time he arrived in Rome, he was overwhelmed by the stories of Stanislaus' sanctity and never pursued him to return. Years later Paul became a Jesuit himself and, when he was 60 years old in 1605, he attended his younger brother's beatification ceremony. Stanislaus was canonized in 1726, and is regarded as the patron saint of novices, those suffering with broken bones, eye troubles, and fevers. His feast day is November 13th. St. Stanislaus of Kostka, pray for us!

P.S. On September 9th, we will celebrate the feast of St. Kieran after whom our parish was named. Remember to pray to him in thanksgiving!

Notable Knight George "The Babe" Herman Ruth Jr. He grew up in Baltimore, had a difficult life with a mother in poor health and a father who had little time for him. As a very young boy Ruth spent most of his time in the streets. By the time he was just 7 years old, his behavioral problems landed him in St. Mary's Industrial Reform School for Boy's, run by the Xaverian Brother's where he stayed for the next 12 years. As an adult, Ruth was quite aware of how difficult life was for children growing up without their families. He was also aware of the impact a mentor could have on a child. For him, that mentor was St. Mary's disciplinarian Brother Matthias, who became a father figure and kept him out of trouble while instructing him in both sports and religion.

"The Babe" had a genuine love for children. Never forgetting his own troubled youth, he always made it a point to visit orphans and children who were sick or disadvantaged while traveling with the New York Yankees. Wherever the team went, he would stop at local hospitals and even reform schools to meet with the kids. At the end of his career, he established the Babe Ruth Foundation for destitute children.




CSA 2021 FUEL THE MISSION
