



Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Reflections on Families of Parishes

Part 5: The Bad Habit of a Worldly Notion of the Church (UTG Reference)

Better to take refuge in the LORD than to put one's trust in mortals.

Better to take refuge in the LORD than to put one's trust in princes. Psalm 118:8-9

"Too often the Church is viewed, even by Catholics, as simply a human institution, and the Catholic faith as merely a lifestyle enhancer. In this outlook the Church's value is based primarily on its contributions to society, whether in education, health care, advocacy, or service to the poor. The priest is seen as a kind of ecclesiastical civil servant. When this outlook prevails the Church's mission can become captive to human plans, and the clarity of our witness to the Gospel is compromised. Cardinal John Henry Newman observed that perhaps one of the reasons Christ's disciples in a particular time and place seem to escape being persecuted is that they have conformed themselves to the thinking and behavior of their society.

They "have taken the world's pay, and must not grudge its yoke." What is lacking in such a worldly mindset is a humble recognition that the Church belongs to Christ as his body, his beloved bride. It is Christ who directs the mission and activity of the Church and who will bring her without fail to her final destiny. All of us, clergy and laity alike, are servants of the Lord who will one day render an account of our service to him." *Unleash the Gospel*

We priests, despite our great sacrifice, can succumb to the bad habit of a worldly notion of the Church. It may not be as obvious in us as it is in the laity, but we know it when we see it.

We can be tempted with the idea that because we offer the Mass and the Sacraments, because we are there with people in their most raw moments, that this somehow allows us to enjoy the trimmings and trappings of our ministry in a worldly way. We see it in some of our brothers who may be quite holy and sincere at the altar but who live lives unbecoming of a shepherd when the vestments come off, drawn into the temptations of money, power, and prestige, as if they were the king rather than the servant.


We must always remember that the life we have to which we have been called is about laying prostrate before the Lord, as our ordination sought to instill in us, and not about sitting at the head of a banquet table. Our move to Families will challenge all of us to truly reflect upon what this means as we must surrender some of the worldly allurements of being the pastor and embrace the idea of being one of the pastors.

Reflection: John 1:9-13

The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came to be through him, but the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, but his own people did not accept him. But to those who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to those who believe in his name, who were born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God.

The Seven Last Words of Jesus Wednesday, March 31st at 6:30PM

The final words of a dying person are precious to those left behind. When time is short, one has a chance to speak only of the most important things—love, forgiveness, faith. The last words are often the summation of a life, cherished and pondered long after the loved one has died. The final testament of a human life can be known in these words. —Alice Camille

The "seven last words of Jesus" are not really seven words, but rather seven incredibly poignant phrases uttered by Jesus as he died on the cross. Why are they so important? These are the last words spoken by Jesus before he died.

These are His last words to his mother Mary, the apostle who stood at the foot of the cross and His last words to his Heavenly Father. His last words to the mob who captured him, beat him and nailed him to the cross. His last words to the onlookers who watched him died. They are the final utterances of a man who would be resurrected from the dead to be seated at the right hand of his Father.

Inspiration for the week

What an ironic twist of events! Jesus is hailed with palm branches as he comes down a street one minute and faces agonizing suffering and death on a cross the next. Does any of this make any sense? They shouted, "hosanna to our King," out of one side of their mouths and, "crucify him," out of the other. At first glance it seems like such hypocrisy. Yet, when we step back there may be more truth to the story than we care to admit. We struggle with Jesus. We hail him in our churches but struggle to figure out what to do with him on our streets. We are fine when we hear pious renderings of his messages and preaching but wince when it gets to the part about changing the way we conduct business and becoming more sensitive to the disadvantaged, poor and marginalized. We invoke God's name when we want victory and keep silence when it comes to global solidarity. We talk out of both sides of our mouths too, looking only to what works or suits us at the time and leaving the rest. There exists in each one of us a person who hails our King with hosannas and a person who is all too willing to choose Jesus over Barabbas for the cross. Something to think about this Holy Week!






Diagram - How to Make a Palm Cross
