

## Feast of Mary, Mother of God Saturday 01 January 2022

[Not a Holy Day of Obligation] When eight days were completed for his circumcision, he was named Jesus . . . Luke 2: 16-21

#### Gospel Connection

In the Roman church, on Saturday, January1, 2022, we celebrate a solemnity that is the oldest feast of Mary in the Church, honoring her by her first and primary title, "Mother of God."

Jesus is given the name <u>Yeshua</u> – "The Lord saves." The rite of circumcision unites Mary's child with the chosen people and makes him an heir to the promises God made to Abraham – promises to be fulfilled in the Child himself.

### Gospel Reflection

Today we honor Mary under her most ancient title, Theotokos, Bearer of God: In

accepting her role as mother of the Messiah, she becomes the first disciple of her Son, the first to embrace his Gospel of hope, compassion and reconciliation.

As Mary, the young unmarried pregnant girl, believes and trusts in the incredible thing that she is to be a part of, even the most ordinary of us can believe in our parts in the drama, too.

The God who makes all things new in Christ enables us to make this truly a new year for each one of us – a time for renewal and re-creation in the love of God, a time for making this year a year of peace in our lives and homes, a time for making this new year truly a "year of our Lord."

## Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord Sunday 02 January 2022

Magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." Matthew 2: 1-12

## Gospel Connection

The story of the astrologers and the star of Bethlehem is unique to Matthew's Gospel. Note that Matthew does not call them "kings" or does he give their names or reports where they came from – in fact, Matthew never even specifies the number of magi (because three gifts are presented to the Child, it has been a tradition since the fifth century to picture "three wise men"). In stripping away the romantic layers that have been added to the story, Matthew's point can be better appreciated.

A great many First Testament ideas and images are presented in this story. The star, for example, is reminiscent of Balaam's prophecy that "a star shall advance from Jacob" (Numbers 24: 17). Many of the details in Matthew's story about the child Jesus parallel the story of the child Moses and the Exodus.

Matthew's story also provides a preview of what is to come. First, the reactions of the various parties to the birth of Jesus parallel the effects Jesus' teaching will have on those who hear it. Herod reacts with anger and hostility to the Jesus of the poor who comes to overturn the powerful and rich. The chief priests and scribes greet the news with haughty indifference toward the Jesus who comes to give new life and meaning to the rituals and laws of the scribes. But the magi – non-believers in the eyes of Israel – possess the humility and the openness of mind and heart essential to faith that leads them to seek and welcome the Jesus who will institute the Second Covenant between God and the New Israel.

- Secondly, the gifts of the astrologers indicate the principal dimensions of Jesus' mission:
  - **gold** is a gift fitting for a king, a ruler, one with power and authority;
  - **frankincense** is a gift fitting for a priest, one who offers sacrifice (frankincense was an aromatic perfume sprinkled on the animals sacrificed in the Temple);
  - **myrrh** is a fitting "gift" for someone who is to die (myrrh was used in ancient times for embalming the bodies of the dead before burial).

Epiphany calls is to a new vision of the world that sees beyond the walls and borders we have created and to walk by the light which has dawned for all of humankind, a light by which we are able to recognize all men and women as our brothers and sisters under the loving providence of God, the Father of all.

The magi's following of the star is a journey of faith, a constant search for meaning, for purpose, for the things of God that each one of us experiences in the course of our own lives.

What we read and watch and listen to in search of wealth, fame and power are the "stars" we follow. The journey of the magi in Matthew's Gospel puts our own "stargazing" in perspective, calling us to fix our search on the "star" of God's justice, peace and compassion.



#### MCREST UPDATE

We have received word from the MCREST office that the new MCREST facility in Mt. Clemens for Women and Children WILL NOT be opening in January; therefore, we will revert to Plan B... providing housing, meals, and supplies to the women and children in the motel from January 9-15, 2022.

The biggest change, and an additional expense, will be providing for the cost of the motel rooms for the week which, for January of 2021, was \$6,100, along with supplies for carryout meals (which we had initially not needed.) If you have not had the opportunity to sign up for any supply item and would like to contribute to this week, we are always accepting monetary donations which will be used to offset the cost of the rooms at the motel.

This change means that the volunteers needed for this week will be grocery shoppers (on an asneeded-basis) and drivers to take the meals to the MCREST office daily. 


#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."


The Five First Saturdays

The Five First Saturdays devotion is one of the principal points of the Fatima message. It centers on the urgent need for mankind to offer reparation and expiate for the many injuries that the Immaculate Heart of Mary suffers from the hands of both impious and indifferent men.

On the first Saturday during five consecutive months, the devotion consists of:

- 1. Going to Confession,
- 2. Receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion,
- 3. Saying five decades of the rosary,
- 4. Meditating for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the rosary.

All this offered in reparation for the sins of blasphemy and ingratitude committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
