First Sunday of Lent


Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days to be tempted by the devil.

Luke 4: 1-13

Scripture Connection

The Gospel for this First Sunday of Lent is Luke's account of Jesus' desert experience. The desert here is more accurately understood as a wilderness: A dangerous, uncharted place, inhabited by wild beasts and bandits, and (many believed) haunted by demons.

Jesus' wilderness "retreat" is a time for discerning and understanding his mission as the Messiah. These forty days are marked by intense prayer and fasting – not out of a sense of penance but to focus totally on God and the Father's will for him. The three temptations all confront Jesus with very human choices:



- "command this stone to become bread": Will Jesus use his power for his own gratification and acclaim or to accomplish the will of God?
- · "All this will be yours, if you worship me": Will Jesus compromise the values of God to accommodate the values of the world?
- · "throw yourself down from here": Will Jesus pray that God will do Jesus' will rather than Jesus seeking God's will? Will Jesus seek to make God into Jesus' image or seek to become what God calls him to be?

Jesus' encounter with the devil depicts the struggle he experienced during this lonely and difficult time to come to terms with the life that lay before him. Jesus then follows the Holy Spirit obediently on to Galilee to begin his teaching ministry.

Scripture Reflection

The same Holy Spirit that led Jesus into the desert leads us into this 40-day "wilderness experience" of Lent, to ask ourselves the same kind of questions, to begin to understand who we are and who we are becoming, to discern what God calls us to be as we journey to the dwelling place of God.

As Jesus was "tempted," so, too, are we confronted with the many different choices and goals life presents us.

This First Sunday of Lent calls us into the desert of our hearts, those unknown "wildernesses" and terrifying places we struggle through as a result of circumstances beyond our control or because of our own mistakes and sins – but it is in those deserts and wildernesses where we find the courage and vision to move on.

The Seven Last Words of Jesus given during the Lent Season By Deacon Dennis


Lent is a time when we prayerfully focus upon Christ's Passion and Death. Jesus spoke seven short expressions, after being nailed to the cross. These statements are now commonly refered to "The Seven Last Words" This Lenten season let us prepare our hearts by reflecting upon the words Christ spoken over 2,000 years ago.

According to Pope Francis: "To many, the Passion of Jesus Christ is a lesson in history where we sympathize with Christ for the sufferings he went through before he died. We find it hard to believe how the people can be so cruel as to inflict the most severe form of pain on a man who we know was innocent. For Christians the Passion should be more than a lesson in history. It should become a lesson in life, teaching us how to stand up for truth and justice."

FIRST OF THE LAST WORDS OF CHRIST

"Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." (Luke 23: 34)

The first words that Jesus spoke after being nailed to the cross were ones of forgiveness. The timing of this suggests that Jesus was referring to those enemies — the soldiers, those who mocked, scourged, tortured, and nailed him to the cross. Even though his enemies did not recognize Him as the Messiah, Christ displays his limitless compassion.



MCWARM OF ST. MARGARET OF SCOTLAND

McWarm of St. Margaret of Scotland Church, located in their gym at 13 Mile and Harper in St. Clair Shores, is available three days a week from November to the end of March. Doors open at 7:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m., and provides a warm shelter for the homeless and those in need. McWARM provides a place to come in out of the cold, offering breakfast, bag lunch, hot showers, change of clothing, and laundry facilities. St. Margaret of Scotland has dedicated its many human and physical resources to people who are homeless, hungry, or in need ... through their McWarm program

ST. PIO CHURCH - BABY CLOSET

St Pio's Baby Closet is located within their parish building in Roseville, providing baby supplies to the less fortunate parents in Macomb County with diapers, formula, baby clothing, etc. Community donations are used to purchase much-needed items. The Baby Closet is available by appointment and items are limited according to availability.

MCREST

The Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter Team (MCREST) shelters men, women, children and families for up to 90 days in Macomb County. MCREST has weathered the COVID-19 emergency, moving from a rotating church shelter model to a hotel model. They have also taken on guests from the Macomb County Warming Center which closed due to COVID-19. The tithings we receive this year will be used to provide meals and services at their new facility in Mt. Clemens, which is scheduled to open by Summer of 2022 and to their guests from the Warming Center.. MCREST assures not only safe shelter, meals and friendship but many other services that help transition families and individuals back into the community.

CARMELITE SISTERS OF ST. JOSEPH, EL SALVADOR

The Carmelite Sisters of St. Joseph are based in Harrison Township, and their evangelization ministry to the parishioners in St. Francis-St. Maximilian Township in Ray Township, brings the diversity and inclusion of the Hispanic and American church cultures together for God's greater glory.

ST. CHRISTINE'S SOUP KITCHEN

St. Christine' Soup Kitchen, located on Fenkell in Detroit, continues to serve, support, and feed those most in need. Their soup kitchen, as many organizations in the tri-county area, have gone through two years of turmoil and upheaval. Their Soup Kitchen has become strictly carryout, and they have also changed their food pantry to 'client choice, where people can pick up what they need. Because their activities have been greatly curtailed, all support you can provide would be greatly appreciated.

GIANNA HOUSE

Gianna House occupies the former convent of St. Veronica Church in Eastpointe, Michigan. It accommodates up to six pregnant teen residents, 13-17 years of age and their infants. Gianna House also serves as a pregnancy center for all pregnant woman, providing them with an alternative to abortion, to increase the number of full term healthy babies and to decrease the high infant mortality rate. Our aim is to change the lives of these adolescents and women who have chosen LIFE for their babies. We can do this through compassionate nursing, counseling referral services, and modeling spiritual care. We offer a nurturing, positive and highly therapeutic environment that transform lives.

At the heart of Gianna House programs is the belief that by helping a young parent we are helping their child and enabling a young family to live a positive, healthy, successful life. Through support and education we provide we can achieve our goal of changing the future two lives at a time.





LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Human beings did not come to believe in God just because of someone's private testimony about him. Rather, belief in God became real when human beings understood that all of human history is being guided and lead, kept and sustained by a God who is incredibly in love with all that he has made. It is this realization that leads us to thanksgiving and gratitude for the one who gives us "this land flowing with milk and honey." It also leads us to adoration and worship as we continue to see the creative power of God's presence in all of the events of our lives. The Church stands as a living witness to all of these things and calls us this Lent to reflect and remember. There is a great temptation for human beings to leave the truth of who they are, where they came from and who created them. Falling into this temptation we cease giving thanks to and worshipping our Creator as we pursue our own self-sufficiency, power, and prestige. While having more may seem better, the only thing we really need more of is love. This fortifies us and keeps us from falling.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Catherine of Bologna (September 8, 1413 – March 9, 1463) came from an upper-class family in Ferrara, a city in Italy, and received an education at the court, where she learned reading, writing, singing and drawing. But despite her advantages, her heart yearned for God.

She joined a group of religious women in Ferrara at the age of 18. Four years later, that same group joined the Poor Clares, an order founded by St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi. In 1456, she and 15 other sisters were sent to establish a Poor Clare monastery in Florence.

As abbess, St. Catherine of Bologna worked to establish the new community and maintain a semblance of peace throughout. She was a model of piety and reported experiencing miracles and several visions of Christ, and the Virgin Mary.

In 1463, St. Catherine of Bologna became seriously ill, and she passed away. She was buried without a coffin and her body was exhumed 18 days later because of many cures attributed to her at her graveside and the sweet scent coming from her grave. Her body was discovered incorrupt (meaning it was not decaying) and remains so today.




