

Gospel Connection

A story from CBS New (January 2020):

Sackets Harbor is a small-town of 1400 residents near Lake Ontario in New York State's north country. Like many small towns, its fire department and ambulance service are staffed by volunteers. But since COVID-19 hit, older and experienced EMS volunteers either couldn't - or wouldn't - do the job anymore. In the wake of staff shortages and increasing costs, many small towns across the country are straining to maintain their emergency services.

Until recently, the ambulance service for Sackets Harbor was being maintained by three veteran EMTs — all in their early 20s — and the demands of the job were taken their toll. That's when a group of high school students stepped up. Wanting to help, they learned that in New York State, one could become an EMT at 17 and ride along and assist at 16. So, they took the required training, got their licenses, and jump-started the town's emergency services.

The five teenagers are sacrificing much of their free time — and innocence. When the young EMTs went on their first calls, they realized the level of responsibility they had taken on. One novice EMT's first call was a suicide; another was a cardiac arrest. "We went from not even having our licenses to saving people's lives," one of the teen EMTs says. It "woke us up" to the responsibility that we had taken on — but got them hooked on helping people.

On the first day of school this fall, they responded to two ambulance calls and a fire, getting home at 5:30 a.m. School started at 7:30.

One of the 17-year-olds applied to join after she and both her parents came down with COVID in March 2020. The experience fired the interest she already had in health care.

The Sackets Harbor EMS averages a call a day for every type of emergency, from accidents to coronaries. Thanks to their dedication and training, many serious situations do not become tragedies.

The teenagers take their work — every minute of it unpaid — very seriously. But they know that without their service, their community would lose the ambulance. "Because we have a really small community," one member of the EMS team explains, "most of the time going to a call, there's a good chance you're gonna know who you're going to."

Gospel Reflection

These extraordinary teenagers in Sackets Harbor have taken on the work of "transfiguration." They've found within themselves the compassion of God and the maturity of faith to step up and take on their community's emergency services. In the event we have come to call Jesus' "transfiguration," Peter, James and John actually realize the divinity — the very life and love of God — that exists within the person of Jesus.


A similar spark of divinity exists within each one of us, as well: God is present within us, animating us to do wonderful, holy things; guiding our steps as we try to walk justly and humbly in the ways of God; enlightening our vision with wisdom and selflessness to "transfigure" despair into hope, sadness into joy, anguish into healing, estrangement into community. May today's Gospel and the commitment of the Sackets Harbor EMS team inspire us to look within our own hearts and souls to discover the light of God's love and let that light shine forth in our own works of charity and mercy.

We started to feel economic sanctions, lots of people are losing jobs because they worked for Europe and US, prices started to grow very fast, banks don't sell dollars and euro. Many people started to go out of our territory, but nobody wants now to take Belarusians to work in EU countries, because our nation is discriminated. Lots of people were protesting against war but were put in prison. We have nowhere to go, so we will be staying in Belarus and hope that war won't start here as well. We still have to go to work, but we are very worried for the lives and future of our children. Thank you for your support because we really need it!

The Seven Last Words of Jesus given during the Lent Season By Deacon Dennis

These statements are now commonly refered to "The Seven Last Words" This Lenten season let us prepare our hearts by reflecting upon the words Christ spoken over 2,000 years ago.

SECOND LAST WORD OF CHRIST

"Amen I say to thee, this day thou shalt be with me in paradise." (Luke 23: 43)

Christ says these words to a man who is being crucified next to him. Just like the first word, His second is that of forgiveness. God generously opens the door to heaven for those who will to repent of their sins. The sinner recognized Christ for who he was. The mercy of God is always ready to reach out to and save a soul, even at the last minute.

It is also Lent and as we honor the Sacred Heart, let us also accompany Jesus on His last journey, as He makes His way to His crucifixion. The Stations of the Cross is one of the traditional ways we can pray and remember Christ's suffering during Lent. Judging:

Essays will be judged on a 100-point scoring system:

- 70 points: Content How clearly is the theme presented?
- 20 points: Style Does the essay show creativity, imagination and development of the topic in a compelling style?
- 10 points: Grammar How well is the essay written with respect to sentence structure, paragraph construction and spelling?

Theme:

- Introduction: Background Information (Characteristics, Attributes, or Qualities), High School, Family, Personal Influences, Achievements, Clubs, Sports, Religion, along with Recognition or Awards
- Plans and Goals: Academic Plans, Course of Study, Short and Long Term Goals, Civic Duty, Spirituality, and Self Expectations
- Current Events and Social Issues: Describe a Current Event or Social Issue that has your Attention or Gives you Cause for Concern and Provide a View-Point or Problem-Solving Ideas to Resolve or Mitigate
- Action(s) or Involvement: Describe or Discuss the Challenges of Living a Spiritual Life in a Secular World
- Spirituality: Experiences and Impacts on your Life in the areas of Prayer, Holy Trinity, Sacraments, Spiritual Works of Mercy, and Corporal Works of Mercy
- 6. Conclusion: How will this Scholarship assist you in meeting your Goals?

Parish Registration

Question:

Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

Answer:

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.




SAINT OF THE WEEK

Whether you know him as the man who brought Christianity to Ireland or simply as a reason you eat corned beef and cabbage in March, St. Patrick (415 – 493) is a well-known saint around the world.

St. Patrick was born in Britain of a Romanized family. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders from the villa of his father, a deacon and local official, and brought into slavery in Ireland. He spent six long years there as a herdsman, during which he turned to his faith for strength. He later escaped back to Britain on a ship, where he was eventually reunited with his family.

His years of captivity changed him and brought out a zeal for God and a yearning to spread the message of Jesus Christ. Despite the constant danger of martyrdom, he continued to travel throughout Ireland where he baptized and confirmed in the name of Christ.


