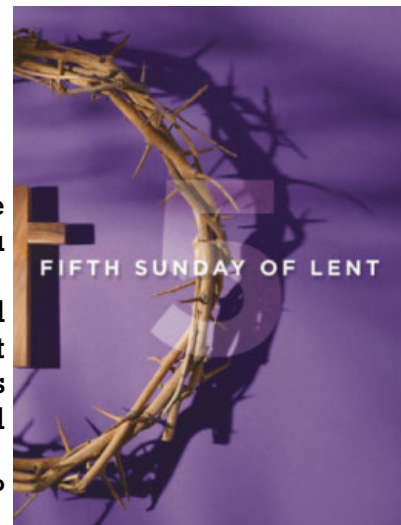

Fifth Sunday of Lent

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION: SPENDING TIME

Stewardship of time is one of the three interlinked dimensions of our call to stewardship. Just as with our financial resources, we talk about spending time, saving time, and wasting time. But how well do we steward our time, or use it in a way that reflects our gratitude to God for every hour of every day? According to the latest government survey, the average American spends about 5 hours of "spare" time each day in these activities:

- 2.8 hours watching TV
 - 38 minutes socializing and communicating
 - 20 minutes reading
 - 20 minutes using the computer for fun
 - 17 minutes participating in sports, exercise, active recreation
 - 16 minutes relaxing and thinking
 - 20 minutes on "other activities"

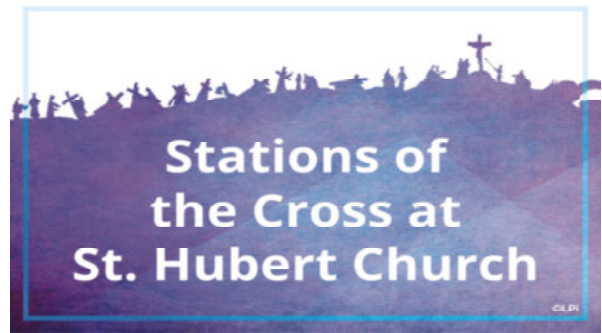

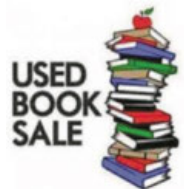

**The Seven Last Words of Jesus
given during the Lent Season
By Deacon Dennis**

Lent is a time when we prayerfully focus upon Christ’s Passion and Death. Jesus spoke seven short expressions, after being nailed to the cross. These statements are now commonly referred to “The Seven Last Words” This Lenten season let us prepare our hearts by reflecting upon the words Christ spoken over 2,000 years ago.

THE FIFTH LAST WORD OF CHRIST

“Afterwards, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the scripture might be fulfilled, said: I thirst.” (John 19:28).

Earlier in the Gospel, a drink of wine and myrrh was prepared for Jesus. It was customary in those days to give an anesthetic drink for those about to be crucified. To appease the soldiers Jesus took a sip, but not enough to deaden the pain. In this passage He prompted the guards for his final drink, this one consisting of vinegar and water.

Among His seven last words, this is the only verbal expression of his physical suffering, even though he was scourged, crowned with thorns, walked the Way of the Cross, and was nailed to the Cross. However, Jesus’ thirst on the cross was more than a physical thirst; it was a thirst for souls for whom love compelled him to redeem.

THE SIXTH LAST WORD OF CHRIST

“Jesus therefore, when he had taken the vinegar, said: It is consummated.” (John 19:30)

Amazingly, Jesus is still conscious after hours of being on the cross. This expression, “It is finished”, did not simply mean that death was upon him, but rather that He fulfilled his mission, and, because he was God, willingly laid down his own life. His preaching, miracles, and finally His earthly suffering would soon be over. His ministry and resulting death would pay the debt of sin for all humanity.

It is also Lent and as we honor the Sacred Heart, let us also accompany Jesus on His last journey, as He makes His way to His crucifixion. The Stations of the Cross is one of the traditional ways we can pray and remember Christ’s suffering during Lent. We encourage you to make the Stations of the Cross as often as possible during this Lenten season. St. Hubert’s will offer *Stations of the Cross* every Wednesday during Lent at 7:00 P.M.

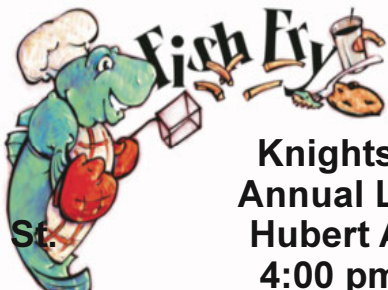

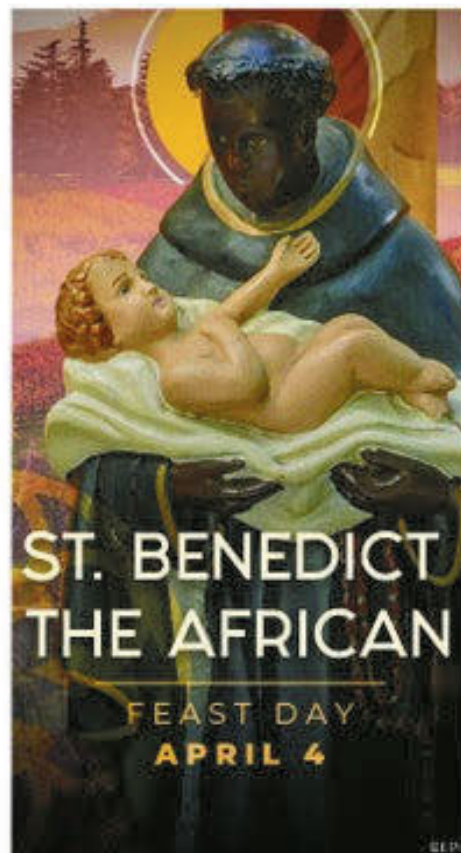

LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Mercy makes us attentive to the voice of truth. We do not know what ever happened to the woman caught in adultery, after her encounter with Jesus. It is hoped that she found what she needed to feel true sorrow. What we do know is that through his gentle and wise persuasiveness, Jesus puts the Pharisees in their place and opens the door to grace for this child of God. Being exploited and used to test and discredit Jesus, she who is publicly known to be a sinner is now the victim. Jesus never tolerates people being used and immediately rushes to her defense. As the author of mercy, Jesus became her advocate and opened the door for her to God's love. Jesus also stands between us and the harsh, judgmental, and often hurtful stance of our world. He invites us to grace, to leave the sin that binds us, and for which we are often criticized, and pursue a life of virtue and freedom.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Benedict the African (1524-1589), was born in San Fratello, Sicily to Cristoforo and Diana Manasseri, Africans who had been taken as slaves. Some accounts claim that because of his parents' loyal service that Benedict was given his freedom at birth, other sources say that his freedom was granted when he turned 18. At 21 Benedict joined a society of hermits living under the rule of St. Francis of Assisi. Eventually he succeeded his friend, Jerome Lanze, as their leader. When the Pope disbanded the independent hermit society, Benedict joined the Order of Friars Minor and he was sent to Palermo, to the Franciscan Friary of St. Mary of Jesus. There Benedict worked in the kitchens and despite being illiterate and a lay brother (not a priest), he also served as Master of Novices, and as Guardian of the Community. St. Benedict was known throughout his life as a brilliant cook under whose hands food seemed to multiply miraculously, a healer, and a spiritual leader with profound understanding. He is recognized as the patron saint of African Americans.
