"You say so" was the answer you gave and the crowd rebelled at the news.


"Not guilty," said Pilate. "I release him." "No, crucify him" came their cry.



The Seven Last Words of Jesus given during the Lent Season By Deacon Dennis

Lent is a time when we prayerfully focus upon Christ's Passion and Death. Jesus spoke seven short expressions, after being nailed to the cross. These statements are now commonly refered to "The Seven Last Words" This Lenten season let us prepare our hearts by reflecting upon the words Christ spoken over 2,000 years ago.

THE SEVENTH LAST WORD OF CHRIST

"And Jesus crying with a loud voice, said: Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit. And saying this, he gave up the ghost." (Luke 23:46)

These are the very last words Jesus spoke on the Cross before His final breath. Jesus is willingly giving up His soul to His Father in Heaven. Jesus has been perfectly obedient to His father's will. It is here that the Lamb of God has been slain for our sins. By contemplating this, and all the last words of Jesus, we can better appreciate Christ's sacrifice on the cross. Meditate on Meditate on Our Lord's words and include it as part of your Lenten preparation, especially during Holy Week.

Praying the Seven Last Words" is a guided experience of prayer that is based on the seven last utterances of Jesus from the cross during his crucifixion and death. Let this evening be a time for private prayer and personal meditation.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION: YOU ARE GIFTED

We are used to hearing the term "gifted" applied to people of exceptional ability or talent. Yet each of us is gifted. Through God's grace, each of us has strengths, gifts, talents, and abilities without which the Body of Christ, the Church, is incomplete. This key dimension of stewardship—the use of our gifts in service to others—is the one many Catholics have the most trouble with. We can see ourselves, with prayer and sacrifice, giving more of our time and our treasure. But talent? That's for those other people, the "gifted" ones, we think.

The term "talent" for a gift with which we have been entrusted by God comes from Jesus' Parable of the Talents, where it originally meant a valuable coin. Like the stewards in the parable, entrusted with valuable commodities by our Master, will we hide them away in fear, or invest them for great return? Spend some time this week thinking about the gifts that you alone can share with our parish community and the wider world—and then make a plan to share them.

Pro-Life Update - Do Not Sign Petition

Pro-abortion activists are actively collecting signatures for an abortion amendment to our state constitution. If the ACLU, Planned Parenthood and Michigan Voices collect enough valid signatures, the "Reproductive Freedom For All" petition will be on this November's ballot. The proposal is made up of broad language and euphemisms that allow a right to unlimited abortions without restrictions for all 9 months. In other words, it will be legal for unborn babies to be killed up until birth for any reason.

This constitutional amendment is not about protecting existing rights, but about smuggling a radical proposal into the Michigan constitution that would repeal dozens of existing state laws that have protected women and children since 1846. Approval amendment in November of fundamentally change the relationships between parents and children, as well as, women and their doctors. Michigan Catholic Conference is part of a growing coalition who are opposing this deadly initiative. Archbishop Vigneron said, "To sign this petition would be to actively participate in the promotion of the great evil of abortion."




