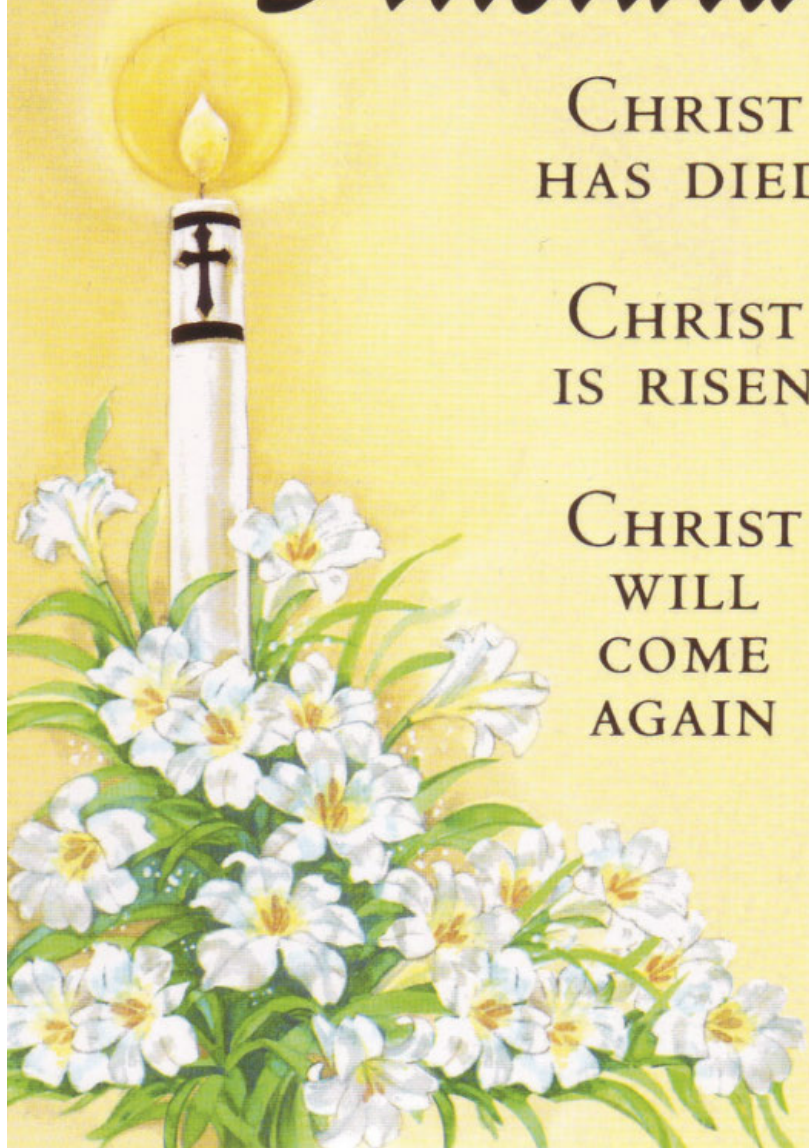

Well, we are repairing the drainage pipe (it may already be completed by the printing of this bulletin) on the west side of the church that cause the great flooding, which we affectionately named, "Lake William Russell" because it was right where he parked that flooded so badly. When we equally sacrifice, not equally give, we can achieve and accomplish great things for our parish family.

A Special Resurrection Message: A New Day Dawns

New life is always something of a mystery. Take a look into the face of a newborn, and you hardly have words to express what you see. A life so delicate, unspoiled, full of possibility and grace: what worlds are contained in every new child! New life is a promise, a sign of hope, and certainly a reason to rejoice and be grateful. The whole world seems born again in the event of a new life.

This may sound like the windup for a Christmas article. But consider: Incarnation is the inauguration of the mystery that finds its perfect conclusion at Easter. Once again, we celebrate the arrival of new life, boundless hope, endless possibility into our old and weary history. We inhabit a universe in which routine often seems to trump novelty. Tired old thinking and behaving wears grooves into the tracks of culture. Each generation inherits the mistakes of the last one and can seem destined to repeat them rather than learn from them. So, this is how the present is mired in the past: There will be poor always. Power and ambition will always seek control of the humble and lowly. Every generation will have its wars. Prejudice will continue to spawn fear and violence. The innocence we long for seems gone for good.

But today we celebrate new life! The empty tomb creates a vast space for hope, because it is the ultimate novelty within history: Death, at last, is overcome. The grave no longer is our final destination. We can dare to think differently now, to liberate ourselves from the ruts of the past. Nothing is fixed, now. Nothing is inevitable. The empty tomb declares to the world that death is no longer, eternal life is our future.

What does this mean for all of us? That nothing that seems lost really is. Not original innocence, not freedom to turn our lives around and make better choices. The apparently doomed can yet be saved. The lost cause, isn't. So, keep on praying for the addict and the atheist. Pray for the spouse who doesn't come to church. Pray for world leaders who ignore the common good in favor of personal ambition. Pray for the church, that she might continue to seek the light that shines in the darkness of our times.

And do more than pray. Act for what is true, good, and beautiful. Speak out against unkindness and hatred in whatever form it takes: Whether a pretense at mean-spirited humor or a rule that denigrates people. Hope and work for a tomorrow that's different from today. Believe that our children will inherit a culture and society more spiritually rooted in Christ than ours—and work to make it happen. Because of the Resurrection of our Lord, a new day has dawned.

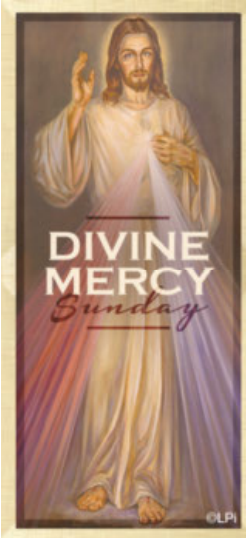

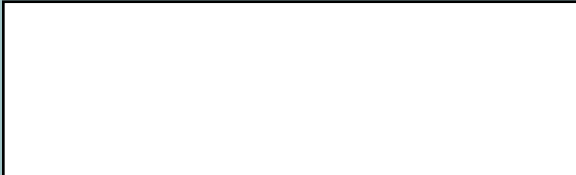
