



Sixth Sunday of Easter

"... the Father will give another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it sees nor knows him."

John 14: 23-29

Scripture Connection

In his Last Supper discourse, Jesus leaves his fledgling Church his gift of peace and the promise of the Spirit. Christ's gift of peace is not the absence of trouble and hostility ("as the world gives peace"); Christ's peace is the Scriptural concept of *shalom*, meaning the pursuit of everything which makes for the highest good. The peace of Christ finds its core in the Gospel principles of humble servanthood and holy justice.

The "Advocate" (or "Paraclete," as found in some translations of John's Gospel), who intercedes and intervenes on behalf of good, is the exact opposite of the "adversary," Satan. The Advocate/Paraclete is that presence of God within us that opens our hearts and minds to the promptings of God's Word as proclaimed by Jesus.

Scripture Reflection

The peace the Risen Jesus leaves us is not passive acquiescence or the absence of hostility and conflict; the peace of Jesus is a mindset: a constant seeking out of God's love, justice and mercy, an understanding of our "connectedness" to God and to one another as children of the same God.

In sacrament, in Scripture, in community, in our living of the Gospel in our everyday lives, the Risen Christ is in our midst. In even our smallest act of selfless kindness — prompted by the Paraclete instructing our open hearts and spirit — we reveal the presence of the Easter Christ in our little piece of the world.

In today's Gospel, Jesus promises that he and his Father will "make our dwelling" with us when we "keep [Jesus'] word" of love, forgiveness, reconciliation, and peace.

Whenever we act out of compassion, the Advocate is at work in our midst; whenever we put aside our own fears of inadequacy to reach out to someone in need, the Holy Spirit is moving among us. The Spirit, the Advocate, is present in our care often without our realizing it, enabling us to make the justice and mercy of the Gospel a reality in our own time and place.







St. Pio's Baby Closet

St. Hubert's St. Vincent de Paul Conference frequently partners with other churches in the area to provide assistance to our brothers and sisters in need. For a while now, we have been working with St. Pio's Church in Roseville to



assist our clients with baby supplies that we normally do not have in stock due to the infrequent requests. When a call from a client comes in requesting help with these items, one of the places we refer the client to is the BABY CLOSET. This year St. Hubert's parishioners donated one week of Lenten tithing to the BABY CLOSET to assist in the baby ministry. This donation is being used for diapers, wipes, and formula, which brings me to the reason for this article.

I am sure we have all heard about the formula shortage in the news, and when I spoke with the representative at the BABY CLOSET, she indicated that she has been going everywhere to try to find formula. It is VERY limited on the brand of formula and the number of containers that can be purchased at one time, and her stock was down to two containers. From what we are hearing in the news, this shortage may last another couple months.

If anyone has an interest in helping locate and/or purchase formula, we have heard that the generic brands are still acceptable. One example is the Kroger brand, as seen in this photo. Meijer and Walmart also have generic brands that are also acceptable. If you have any questions, please contact me at (586) 242-1497.

Over the next couple months, St. Hubert's Christian Service Commission will be collecting the following items for Ukraine. There will be a large box in the vestibule of Church for your donations, and these supplies will then be taken to the collection center at the St. Clair Shores Civic Center to be delivered to the Ukraine relief effort.

- Camouflage or camouflage-colored backpacks large to fill with medical supplies and MRE (Field Foods) Amazon has MRE your choice
- Stethoscopes
- Blood Pressure machines
- Surgical tape, gauze patches and rolls
- Tourniquets
- Pain relievers like Aleve, Advil, Ibuprofen and the like, large bottles
- Neosporin, antiseptic salve, surgical gloves men's and women's
- Hand Warmers
- MRE (FIELD FOOD, k-Rations) from Amazon
- Due to the volume of toiletries and feminine hygiene products donated, there is no current collection of these items at the Civic Center. We will only be collecting the above medical supplies.

Inspiration for the week

Everyone wants to experience peace. When we look to the world to provide this for us, we can easily get disappointed. We associate peace with an absence of war and conflict, good relationships between neighbors and coworkers, the achievement of success and even the absence of noise! While all of these are worthy endeavors, pursuing them exclusively as a path to experiencing peace sets us up for failure. When we look for peace outside of ourselves, it will never be found. True and lasting peace is something that comes from within and not something we can produce on our own or receive from others. Peace is discovered when we experience an inner wholeness and harmony. It is born of a sense of connectedness with a God who is larger and greater than ourselves, gifting us with His presence. It is the only the peace offered by the Risen Christ that can settle our hearts and calm our fears. Regardless of the degree of turmoil around us, this sense of completeness that Jesus gives anchors our boats and prevents us from sinking.

Spring is finally here, and the gardeners of the Charity Garden ministry are ready for another great growing season. Last year, we harvested about 4,900 pounds



of produce (almost 2 ½ tons!) that was distributed to 9 different pantries throughout Macomb County. We are grateful that God and our church family have given us the talents and resources to help feed so many in need.

We were happy to see so many of you stop by our table at the Ministry Fair in March. Twelve wonderful new volunteers were able to join us for our first working session on April 30th. We look forward to working with them this season, and with any other interested parishioners who weren't able to join us that day.

Our garden works in partnership with the Horticulture Program at the L'Anse Creuse Public Schools Pankow Center. As part of that partnership, this year we will be hosting a Farm Day on Wednesday, June 8th. Two elementary school classes will be coming to tour the Garden and learn about how food crops are grown.

If you would like to learn more about our garden, or just see what it takes to produce 2 tons of food, join us for a Garden Walk on July 10th (rain date: July 17th) from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Dear Men,

We are very much in a time of testing. There is a certain "sifting" going on (Luke 22:31). Gone are the days when one could be carried along by the currents of a Christian culture. Yet, these are glorious days to be alive. Days when we are being called to make a conscious effort to follow the Lord. These are days in which we must, in essence, be men. St. Pope John Paul II tells us that one only finds himself by giving himself. It is a man's calling to give himself, following the pattern of Jesus Christ, and by doing so to lead others to our Lord and Savior.

One group that I find particularly good for the life of Catholic men is The Knights of Columbus. Founded in 1882 by Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney, The Knights of Columbus provide Catholic men the opportunity to live their faith through charitable works, caring for their families and defending the Catholic faith.




