# FROM THE DESK OF FR. HENRY

#### The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

Today's Gospel tells us about the wise men from the East who went to worship the Lord who was born as man. Tradition holds that they were three pagan kings called Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar. The Lord who was born for all peoples gave them an audience. Today we celebrate the memory of that event, the manifestation of God in Jesus to the Gentiles. The Gentiles enter into the life of Jesus right from the beginning. The Scribes have the Scriptures; they know, but do not seek, and so do not find the Messiah. The magi do not have the Scriptures, but they go, search, ask, and find. They represent those who walk in faith and desire the vision of God. Learned people say that these three visitors must have been Babylonian or Persian priests. They were proficient in astrology and knew that the appearance of a new, bright star marked the birth of a great person. Having heard about the prophesies concerning the Messiah, they were waiting for a Savior and the golden age he would usher in. And so, when they saw a special star, they set out in search of the new-born king. On their way they were led by the star; led by light. They came, they saw, they worshipped, they changed their way. As at that time, so even today, in various ways and forms, the good Lord shows his signs to the people of the present age. Wise people recognize these signs and look for the Lord. When we set out in search of our savior, the light of his grace shows us the way. Every human being has the duty to search for God, and in this all-important quest, the divine light of Christ the Lord will illumine our path.

#### ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON JANUARY 4

Mother Seton is one of the keystones of the American Catholic Church. She founded the first American religious community for women, the Sisters of Charity. She opened the first American parish school and established the first American Catholic orphanage.

Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seton is a true daughter of the American Revolution. By birth and marriage, she was linked to the first families of New York and enjoyed the fruits of high society. Reared a staunch Episcopalian, she learned the value of prayer, Scripture, and a nightly examination of conscience. Her father did not have much use for churches but was a great humanitarian, teaching his daughter to love and serve others.

The early deaths of her mother in 1777 and her baby sister in 1778 gave Elizabeth a feel for eternity and the temporariness of the pilgrim life on earth.

At 19, Elizabeth was the belle of New York and married a handsome, wealthy businessman, William Magee Seton. They had five children before his business failed and he died of tuberculosis. At 30, Elizabeth was widowed and penniless, with five small children to support.

While in Italy with her dying husband, Elizabeth witnessed Catholicity in action through family friends. Three basic points led her to become a Catholic: belief in the Real Presence, devotion to the Blessed Mother and conviction that the Catholic Church led back to the apostles and to Christ. Many of her family and friends rejected her when she became a Catholic in March 1805.

The thousand or more letters of Mother Seton reveal the development of her spiritual life from ordinary goodness to heroic sanctity. She suffered great trials of sickness, misunderstanding, the death of loved ones, and the heartache of a wayward son. She died on January 4, 1821, and became the first American-born citizen to be beatified and then canonized.

#### REFLECTION

Elizabeth Ann Seton had no extraordinary gifts. She was not a mystic or stigmatic. She did not prophesy or speak in tongues. She had two great devotions: abandonment to the will of God and an ardent love for the Blessed Sacrament. She wrote to a friend, Julia Scott, that she would prefer to exchange the world for a "cave or a desert." "But God has given me a great deal to do, and I have always and hope always to prefer his will to every wish of my own." Her brand of sanctity is open to everyone if we love God and do his will.


